It seems that the first question to you would be: are you content with that decrease in the numbers? Do you have any plans or strategies to try to respond to that decline, ensuring that pupils' Welsh is of a high enough standard for them to continue their education through the medium of Welsh?

In fact, the decrease between the numbers assessed in Welsh in year 6 and year 9 has become less in recent years and is now the lowest since 2002, which is the earliest year for which we have data. Therefore, we are seeing things moving in the right direction. As the Member will be aware, local authorities will have to draw up their Welsh in education strategic plans on a statutory basis in future, which will enable the Welsh Government to challenge those plans if we think that they are deficient.

Minister, I am sure that you are aware that I have been contacted by a number of constituents who are concerned about the lack of secondary Welsh-medium education in the Gwent area. Currently, Ysgol Gyfun Gwynllyw is the only secondary school in that area offering Welsh-medium secondary education and parents are often frustrated that, if their children study Welsh locally at a primary level, there is either not a place or they have a place but it involves a lot of travelling for them outside their area. I appreciate that this is a difficult problem to get around, but what advice and guidance can you give local authorities to provide that secondary Welsh-medium education where, as Alun Ffred Jones has said, it is wanted?

I have visited Ysgol Gyfun Gwynllyw on a number of occasions, and I am well aware of the increasing demand that there seems to be in Gwent for secondary provision through the medium of Welsh. As I said in response to the Member for Arfon, local authorities, in their Welsh in education strategic plans, will have to declare what they are planning to do in terms of provision. As a result of the Act that we passed earlier this year, local authorities will also have to assess effectively parental demand for Welsh-medium education, which will enable us to assess whether they are taking a proper look at that demand and will enable us to challenge them on the plans that they are putting forward.

Rwyf wedi ymweld ag Ysgol Gyfun Gwynllyw ar sawl achlysur, ac rwy'n ymwybodol iawn o'r galw cynyddol yng Ngwent am ddarpariaeth uwchradd drwy gyfrwng y Gymraeg. Fel y dywedais mewn ymateb i'r Aelod dros Arfon, bydd yn rhaid i awdurdodau lleol, fel rhan o'u cynlluniau strategol Cymraeg mewn addysg, ddatgan beth maent yn bwriadu ei wneud o ran darpariaeth. We have funded the consortia to develop school improvement services on a regional basis. As part of their core responsibility, they should be undertaking this work. The Member will be aware of the pupil deprivation grant, which is also supporting a series of initiatives in respect of literacy and numeracy, as is the school effectiveness grant. Therefore, the funding is in place. The national support programme is additional support that is targeted particularly at the literacy and numeracy framework. That will also provide focused support for those schools that need it. However, this is not a question for only those authorities in the south-east that are in special measures; this is also a question for the whole of Wales, and I think that the support is in place for the consortia.

Thank you, Minister, and I agree with much of that. Professor David Reynolds said in the same conference last week that resources were not the main problem here, but increasing the level of professionalism of the workforce. In that context, as only 4% of teachers in the area in question who attended the conference on raising standards in literacy and numeracy, that is, the framework conference in Chepstow, who said that teachers understood the new numeracy and literacy framework, what assurances can you give, Minister, that the latest framework will not fail like the previous one?

The previous skills framework was not set out on a statutory basis, unlike the literacy and numeracy framework that we have published over the last 12 months and consulted upon widely. Significant materials and resources are available on the Learning Wales website that can be adapted for use in schools, and I know that teachers are looking at those.

As my colleague will be aware, under equality legislation, individuals do not have to disclose personal details about their background unless they wish to do so, making it difficult to determine how representative the current teaching workforce is either on entry to initial teacher training, or through the General Teaching Council for Wales register. However, higher education courses of initial teacher training require training teachers to demonstrate and evidence that they understand the diverse learning and emotional needs of learners, and endeavour to provide the best possible education for them to maximise their potential, whatever their individual aspirations. We could probably do more ourselves through the way in which we advertise teaching as a career, and try to demonstrate, through role models within the profession already, the diversity of the workforce. That may be something that we should do more of.

I move the motion.

The purpose of our debate today is not just to have a discussion here at the National Assembly but to trigger a national debate on the behaviour of patients in the Welsh NHS, and the need to take action to discourage irresponsible patient behaviour and promote greater responsibility among those who use our national health service. We will be accepting and supporting amendment 1, which has been tabled in the name of Aled Roberts.

Just to set out the context, there is a huge problem in Wales and in other parts of the United Kingdom in terms of patients treating the NHS disrespectfully. As many as one in 10 hospital appointments are missed. In 2011-12, in the Betsi Cadwaladr University Local Health Board area alone, people did not turn up to almost 60,000 hospital appointments, costing that particular health board over £7.5 million per year. In fact, Betsi Cadwaladr University Local Health Board has estimated that between 2007 and 2012, some £38.6 million was spent on missed hospital appointments in its area alone—up to £150 per individual appointment missed.

A freedom of information request that we tabled to all health boards in Wales received responses from four boards, with sufficient detail to demonstrate that in 2011-12, at least £14 million was wasted because of missed appointments at our hospitals. The total between 2007 and 2013—this is just from four health boards—was at least £68 million. On average, around 350,000 appointments are missed in our hospitals each year. Cwm Taf Local Health Board has indicated that it has seen a 144% increase in its missed appointments between 2008-09 and 2011-12. When we have one in eight of the population of Wales on a hospital waiting list, and when you consider that those people are denied access to the appointments that they need because somebody has booked an appointment and does not turn up, you realise that we need to deal with this issue.

Yn dilyn cais rhyddid gwybodaeth a gyflwynwyd gennym i bob bwrdd iechyd yng Nghymru, cafwyd ymateb gan bedwar bwrdd, gyda digon o fanylion i ddangos, yn 2011-12, bod o leiaf £14 miliwn wedi cael ei wastraffu o ganlyniad i apwyntiadau a fethwyd yn ein hysbytai. Roedd y cyfanswm rhwng 2007 a 2013—a hynny dim ond ar gyfer pedwar bwrdd iechyd—yn £68 miliwn o leiaf. Ar gyfartaledd, caiff tua 350,000 o apwyntiadau eu methu yn ein hysbytai bob blwyddyn. Nododd Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Cwm Taf gynnydd o 144% yn yr apwyntiadau a fethwyd yn ei ardal rhwng 2008-09 a 2011-12. O ystyried bod un o bob wyth o boblogaeth Cymru ar restr aros ar gyfer ysbty, ac o ystyried nad yw'r bobl hynny yn cael yr apwyntiadau sydd eu hangen arnynt am fod rhywun wedi trefnu apwyntiad ac yn methu'r apwyntiad hwnnw, mae'n amlwg bod angen inni ymdrin â'r mater hwn.

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General practitioners are also suffering from missed appointments. Some work that was undertaken by an independent charity called the Developing Patient Partnership suggests that in excess of half a million GP appointments are missed in Wales every single year. At a cost of £32 per appointment, which is the estimated cost put forward by the King's Fund, this equates to a cost of £16 million per year.

These missed appointments are not, unfortunately, being monitored by the Welsh Government. The 'did not attend' figures in hospitals are monitored, but GP appointments are not. It is clear to me that we need to take much more concerted action to address this problem. There is some good practice out there. Up in north Wales, Betsi Cadwaladr University Local Health Board has introduced a text messaging reminder system for those people who give the board their mobile telephone number. In parts of England, you can now undertake your consultations by Skype to make them more convenient.

However, by far the biggest deterrent, it seems, for patients missing appointments is charges for missed appointments. We all probably know somebody who has had to pay a small charge, if not us ourselves, because of failure to turn up to a dentist appointment. It is time for us in the Chamber today to consider whether the introduction of charges for missed appointments in our NHS might help to address some of these problems.

Many people will have seen posters on the walls of their GP surgeries identifying the number of appointments that have been missed that day or month. Those, as well as charging, can have an impact on reducing missed appointments—by up to 31% according to studies undertaken in Bedfordshire. Simple measures, such as requiring a patient to write down the details of their appointment when it is given, reduce missed appointments by 18%. Indeed, just asking a patient to repeat the details of their appointment can reduce non-attendance by 3.5%. These are remarkable figures.

However, it is not only missed hospital appointments that we need to address. There is also the issue of inappropriate attendances at accident and emergency departments. In 2011-12, there were almost 1 million attendances at A&E departments across Wales. It is estimated that around 40% of these—almost 400,000—did not require the services of an accident and emergency department. According to the King's Fund, the cost of somebody attending an A&E department is around £111. If you add that up, that is £43 million a year that is potentially being lost as a result of inappropriate attendances at A&E departments. All of this puts pressure on those departments. Only a few weeks ago, the College of Emergency Medicine in Wales said that our emergency departments were at the point of meltdown, partly as a result of a lack of beds and partly as a result of staff, but if four in 10 people are turning up inappropriately, no doubt it is also due to this difficulty.

Mae'n amlwg i mi fod angen inni weithredu mewn ffordd lawer mwy pendant i ymdrin â'r broblem hon. Mae arfer da allan yn y maes. Yn y gogledd, mae Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Prifysgol Betsi Cadwaladr wedi cyflwyno system atgoffa gan ddefnyddio negeseuon testun i'r bobl hynny sy'n rhoi rhif eu ffôn symudol i'r bwrdd. Mewn rhannau o Loegr, gallwch bellach gael ymgynghoriad gan ddefnyddio Skype i'w gwneud yn fwy cyfleus.

Fodd bynnag, y ffordd orau o bell ffordd, yn ôl pob tebyg, i atal cleifion rhag methu apwyntiadau yw codi tâl am apwyntiadau a gaiff eu methu. Mae'n siŵr bod pob un ohonom yn ymwybodol o rywun, os nad ni ein hunain, sydd wedi gorfod talu tâl bach am fethu apwyntiad deintydd. Mae'n bryd inni heddiw yn y Siambr ystyried p'un a allai cyflwyno taliadau am apwyntiadau a gaiff eu methu yn ein GIG helpu i ymdrin â rhai o'r problemau hyn.

Bydd llawer o bobl wedi gweld posteri ar waliau eu meddygfeydd yn nodi nifer yr apwyntiadau a fethwyd y diwrnod hwnnw neu'r mis hwnnw. Gall y rheini, yn ogystal â chodi tâl, helpu i leihau nifer yr apwyntiadau a gaiff eu methu—hyd at 31% yn ôl astudiaethau a gynhaliwyd yn Swydd Bedford. Mae camau syml, fel ei gwneud yn ofynnol i glaf nodi manylion ei apwyntiad adeg trefnu'r apwyntiad hwnnw, yn lleihau nifer yr apwyntiadau a gaiff eu methu 18%. Yn wir, gall gofyn yn syml i glaf ailadrodd manylion ei apwyntiad leihau achosion o fethu apwyntiadau 3.5%. Mae'r ffigurau hyn yn rhyfeddol.

Amcangyfrifir nad oedd angen gwasanaethau adran damweiniau ac achosion brys ar tua 40% ohonynt—bron i 400,000. Yn ôl Cronfa King's, pan fydd unigolyn yn mynd i adran damweiniau ac achosion brys, mae'n costio tua £111. Mae hynny'n golygu o bosibl bod cyfanswm o £43 miliwn y flwyddyn yn cael ei golli o ganlyniad i bobl yn mynd i adrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys yn ddiangen. Mae hyn oll yn rhoi pwysau ar yr adrannau hynny. I thank Darren Millar for giving way. Does he put in that category the number of people who attend A&E with alcohol-related conditions, and does he agree with the view of the Deputy Prime Minister, who is in Government with the party that he supports, that such people should be fined for attending A&E?

Diolch i Darren Millar am ildio. A yw'n cynnwys nifer y bobl sy'n mynd i adrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys â chyflyrau sy'n gysylltiedig ag alcohol yn y categori hwnnw, ac a yw'n cytuno â barn y Dirprwy Brif Weinidog, sy'n aelod o'r Llywodraeth y mae ei blaid yn ei chefnogi, y dylid codi dirwy ar bobl o'r fath am fynd i adrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys?

It is important that people who have alcohol-related problems have access to appropriate treatment services. If there are people who behave irresponsibly, who have been drinking and turn up inappropriately at an A&E department, we need to have a debate about how we tackle that. Fundamentally, we do not have the alcohol rehabilitation services or the other substance misuse rehabilitation services that we need in Wales, and we must address that problem urgently.

Mae'n bwysig y gall pobl â phroblemau sy'n gysylltiedig ag alcohol gael gafael ar wasanaethau trin priodol. Os oes pobl sy'n ymddwyn yn anghyfrifol, sydd wedi bod yn yfed ac yn mynd yn amhriodol i adran damweiniau ac achosion brys, mae angen inni drafod sut i fynd i'r afael â hynny. Yn y bôn, nid yw'r gwasanaethau adsefydlu alcohol na'r gwasanaethau adsefydlu eraill ar gyfer camddefnyddio sylweddau sydd eu hangen arnom yng Nghymru ar gael, a rhaid inni ymdrin â'r broblem honno ar fyrder.

It has also been suggested by some ambulance services that as many as nine out of 10 calls to the 999 service for an ambulance are inappropriate and do not need an emergency response for a life-threatening condition. To be fair to the Welsh Government, it is trying to take some action to address this problem through its Choose Well campaign. It has not been a great success thus far, because we are still seeing increasing numbers at our A&E departments. More worryingly is that people's choices are being restricted in Wales at the moment: there has been a move to close many minor injuries units; we know that it is difficult for people to get access to a GP at times; and we know that out-of-hours services are sometimes not delivering the quality of service that one would hope for and that, in turn, causes people to turn up at A&E departments.

Awgrymwyd hefyd gan rai gwasanaethau ambiwlans fod cynifer â naw allan o bob 10 o alwadau am ambiwlans i'r gwasanaeth 999 yn amhriodol ac nad oes angen ymateb brys arnynt ar gyfer cyflwr sy'n bygwth bywyd. I fod yn deg i Lywodraeth Cymru, mae'n ceisio cymryd camau i ymdrin â'r broblem hon drwy ei ymgyrch Dewis Doeth. Ni fu'n llwyddiant mawr hyd yn hyn, gan ein bod yn dal i weld cynnydd yn nifer y bobl sy'n mynd i'n hadrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys. Yn waeth na hynny, mae dewisiadau pobl yn cael eu cyfyngu yng Nghymru ar hyn o bryd: aed ati i gau llawer o unedau mân anafiadau; gwyddom ei bod yn anodd i bobl gael gafael ar feddyg teulu ar adegau; a gwyddom weithiau nad yw gwasanaethau y tu allan i oriau yn darparu'r ansawdd gwasanaeth dymunol a bod hynny, yn ei dro, yn golygu bod pobl yn mynd i adrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys.

Another area where patients need to behave more responsibly—a small minority of patients, but they have a significant impact, nevertheless—is in the area of medicines. I am pleased that the Liberal Democrats tabled their amendment today, because there is no doubt in my mind that there is a lot of money to be saved here. Community Pharmacy Wales has estimated that the savings could be as much as £50 million per annum, and not the £21.6 million that is in the Liberal Democrats' amendment. We have to ask ourselves whether the universal free-prescriptions policy might be helping to contribute to irresponsible behaviour when it comes to medication. Some people turn up simply to get a subscription for paracetamol, cough syrup, Bonjela or athlete's foot powder—all of which are prescribed on the Welsh NHS—which they could get over the counter relatively inexpensively. When you consider that millionaires in Wales get free prescriptions while access to some modern medicines is being denied to some patients, we have to recognise that there is a danger that that might be fuelling the problem and we need to tease out whether it actually is.

Maes arall lle mae angen i gleifion ymddwyn yn fwy cyfrifol—lleiafrif bach o gleifion, ond sy'n cael effaith sylweddol, serch hynny—yw ym maes meddyginiaethau. Rwy'n falch bod y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol wedi cyflwyno eu gwelliant heddiw, oherwydd nid oes unrhyw amheuaeth gennyf y gellir gwneud arbedion sylweddol yn y maes. Mae Fferylliaeth Gymunedol Cymru wedi amcangyfrif y gallai'r arbedion fod cymaint â £50 miliwn y flwyddyn, yn hytrach na'r £21.6 miliwn a nodir yng ngwelliant y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol. Rhaid inni ofyn i'n hunain a yw'r polisi o bresgripsiynau am ddim i bawb o bosibl yn helpu i gyfrannu at ymddygiad anghyfrifol mewn perthynas â meddyginiaeth. Daw rhai unigolion dim ond i gael presgripsiwn am baracetamol, surop peswch, Bonjela neu bowdr troed athletwr—y mae pob un ohonynt ar gael ar bresgripsiwn ar y GIG yng Nghymru—y gallent eu cael yn gymharol rhad dros y cownter. O ystyried bod miliwnwyr yng Nghymru yn cael presgripsiynau am ddim ond bod rhai meddyginiaethau modern yn cael eu gwadu i rai cleifion, rhaid inni gydnabod bod perygl y gallai hynny fod yn gwaethygu'r broblem ac mae angen inni ganfod p'un a yw'n gwneud hynny ai peidio.



We need more effective prescribing, better management of repeat prescriptions in particular and we need to ensure that people are safely discarding those medicines they are not using.

I will bring my remarks to a close by saying that this is about opening a national debate, and not just in this Chamber. We know that missed appointments are a very real and costly problem for the Welsh NHS. We know that when people do not turn up for their appointments, that causes delays for other patients. We know that people who ask the NHS to buy medicines for them, when they do not really need them, cost the NHS many millions of pounds a year, and every single penny that is wasted in those areas means that it is money that cannot be spent on improving patient care elsewhere. Therefore, we need to ensure that there is a package of measures, and that is why we have brought this debate forward today. I hope that the Minister will accept this offer: we are prepared to work with you, Minister, to come up with some solutions to these problems. We recognise that some efforts have been made already, but there is much more work to be done, and we give a commitment to work with you and the other parties to address this in the future.

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I move amendment 1 in the name of Aled Roberts.

Cynigiau welliant 1 yn enw Aled Roberts.

We believe that this is one area where we can make a difference. Non-usage of medicines and stockpiling it in cupboards is a waste of precious NHS resource. It also causes problems for patients if they are non-compliant with the medication that has been prescribed to them by the doctor. Also, it presents environmental issues, as one has to consider how you can safely dispose of these medicines. We take this opportunity to welcome the new local health board focus on this. I hope that the Minister will be able to outline schemes that could be developed in association with community pharmacy, as pharmacists in our communities have a big role to play in ensuring that people use only the prescriptions that are absolutely necessary for them, that people know how to take their medicines correctly and why it is important to take those medicines, and in reassuring them that if they do not need all of the items on the prescription in a particular month, it does not mean that they will never get them again.

Turning to the contribution that Darren has just made in the debate today, nobody in their right mind would condone irresponsible use of the NHS and its resources. However, the fact that some people do—and I accept that they do—is not, perhaps, as simple as Darren has made out here this afternoon. Perhaps the reasons for their attendance at an A&E department, or their non-attendance at a medical appointment, are complex and not straightforward and are not the actions of a malicious person who has nothing better to do with their time. Hospital appointments and do-not-attend rates at GP surgeries and in our district general hospitals are problematic and need to be addressed. Darren is well versed in how many appointments are missed, but less well versed, it seems to me from what he said, about why those appointments are missed. We have to understand why they are missed if we are to come up with a reasonable response to them. Darren says that the most effective way of tackling this is to charge people, but he did not go on in his speech to outline any evidence that suggests that it is the most effective way to deal with the issue.

Credwn fod hwn yn un maes lle y gallwn wneud gwahaniaeth. Mae meddyginiaethau na chânt eu defnyddio ac a gaiff eu pentyrru mewn cypyrddau yn wastraff o adnoddau gwerthfawr y GIG. Achubwn ar y cyfle hwn i groesawu'r ffocws newydd ar fyrddau iechyd lleol yn hyn o beth. Gobeithio y bydd y Gweinidog yn gallu amlinellu cynlluniau y gellid eu datblygu mewn cydweithrediad â fferylliaeth gymunedol, gan fod gan fferyllwyr yn ein cymunedau ran bwysig i'w chwarae wrth sicrhau mai dim ond y presgripsiynau sy'n gwbl angenrheidiol iddynt y bydd pobl yn eu defnyddio, bod pobl yn gwybod sut i gymryd eu meddyginiaethau yn gywir a pham ei bod yn bwysig cymryd y meddyginiaethau hynny, ac wrth roi sicrwydd iddynt os na fydd angen yr holl eitemau ar y presgripsiwn mewn rhyw fis penodol, nad yw hynny'n golygu na fyddant yn eu cael byth eto.

## **Darren Millar** [Bywgraffiad](#) [Biography](#)

Research by the King's Fund and the British Dental Association showed clearly that the introduction of charges for missed appointments had a dramatic impact on the ability of people to turn up. While I accept the point that you make about the need to understand that sometimes don-not-attend rates are quite high for all sorts of different reasons, will you accept that when someone does not have a reasonable excuse for not attending an appointment, there ought to be some way to penalise them?

Dangosodd gwaith ymchwil gan Gronfa King's a Chymdeithas Ddeintyddol Prydain yn glir fod cyflwyno taliadau am gollu apwyntiadau wedi cael effaith ddramatig ar allu pobl i fynychu. Er fy mod yn derbyn eich pwynt am yr angen i ddeall weithiau bod cyfraddau dim mynychu yn gymharol uchel am bob math o wahanol resymau, a dderbyniwch pan nad oes gan rywun esgus rhesymol dros beidio â dod i apwyntiad, y dylid bod rhyw ffordd o'i gosbi?

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I looked carefully at the King's Fund research, and it goes on to say that the most effective way of taking down DNA rates is to have better communication with patients. That is the finding of that research; it is not fining people. Who is to decide whether somebody has a legitimate excuse? Is Darren Millar going to decide whether somebody's excuse is legitimate or not? I recently met a patient who missed his hospital appointment because the Welsh ambulance service did not send the ambulance in time to take him to his appointment. Is that legitimate? Who is going to find out whether the excuse is legitimate? Who is going to decide whether the excuse is legitimate? How much is that going to cost in additional NHS bureaucracy to achieve that?

I will move on to discuss attendance at accident and emergency departments. Darren was right to talk about changes to our system, which I think will make it more difficult for people to avoid going to accident and emergency departments. I am not about to lecture any mother who is worried about the health of her child and cannot get an appointment with an out-of-hours doctor. I would not criticise her for turning up at an A&E department. Many people know it is the only sure-fire way to be seen by a medical professional when they are worried about themselves and their families. Instead of charging people for turning up inappropriately, perhaps we could have better triaging services at our A&E departments, have GPs in those departments to triage appropriately, and have better and more accessible out-of-hours services.

We discovered—but this was not mentioned by Darren in his speech this afternoon—that the Tory plans go a lot further than this. I listened with great interest as I drove down this morning, Darren, to your performance on Radio Wales. Let us be clear what the Tories are proposing here: they are proposing that people pay for NHS services if they engage in risky behaviour. Once again, who decides what constitutes risky behaviour? My daughter is about to go on a school education course that involves pony trekking, mountaineering and fell walking; if she falls over, will we be charged for taking her to an A&E department? This is the thin end of the wedge and breaks the principle about it being free at the point of delivery. However, I note that Darren is not suggesting that we charge people for eating too many pies or drinking too much alcohol and the way in which that can impact upon people's behaviour. Therefore, you can eat as much as you want to and smoke as much as you want to and you will not be charged for it, but, for goodness' sake, do not trip when you are out jogging or hurt yourself when you are out doing some kind of activity to try to keep fit, because they will charge you. It is quite clear what the Tories' intention is here.

Edrychais yn ofalus ar waith ymchwil Cronfa King's, ac mae'n mynd ymlaen i ddweud mai'r ffordd fwyaf effeithiol o leihau cyfraddau dim mynychu yw cyfathrebu'n well â chleifion. Dyna ganfyddiad y gwaith ymchwil hwnnw; nid codi dirwy ar bobl. Pwy fydd yn penderfynu a oes gan rywun esgus dilys? A yw Darren Millar yn mynd i benderfynu a yw esgus rhywun yn ddilys ai peidio? Yn ddiweddar, cyfarfûm â chlaf a fethodd ei apwyntiad ysbyty am nad anfonodd gwasanaeth ambiwlans Cymru ambiwlans mewn pryd i'w gludo i'w apwyntiad. A yw hynny'n ddilys? Pwy fydd yn canfod a yw'r esgus yn ddilys? Pwy fydd yn penderfynu p'un a yw'r esgus yn ddilys? Faint y bydd hynny'n ei gostio o ran biwrocratiaeth ychwanegol i'r GIG er mwyn cyflawni hynny?

Symudaf ymlaen i drafod ymweliadau ag adrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys. Roedd Darren yn llygad ei le wrth sôn am newidiadau i'n system, a fydd, yn fy marn i, yn ei gwneud hi'n anos i bobl osgoi mynd i adrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys. Nid wyf yn bwriadu ceryddu unrhyw fam sy'n poeni am iechyd ei phlentyn ac yn methu â chael apwyntiad gyda meddyg y tu allan i oriau. Ni fyddwn yn ei beirniadu am fynd i adran damweiniau ac achosion brys. Mae llawer o bobl yn gwybod mai dyna'r unig ffordd bendant o gael gweld gweithiwr meddygol proffesiynol pan fyddant yn poeni amdanynt hwy eu hunain a'u teuluoedd. Yn lle codi tâl ar bobl sy'n dod yn ddiangen, efallai y gallem ddarparu gwasanaethau brysbennu gwell yn ein hadrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys, rhoi meddygon teulu yn yr adrannau hynny i frysennu'n briodol, a darparu gwasanaethau y tu allan i oriau gwell sy'n fwy hygyrch.

Gwnaethom ddarganfod—ond ni soniodd Darren am hyn yn ei araith y prynhawn yma—bod cynlluniau'r Torïaid yn mynd yn llawer pellach na hyn. Gwrandawais yn astud wrth imi yrru i lawr y bore yma, Darren, ar eich perfformiad ar Radio Wales. Gadewch inni fod yn glir o ran yr hyn y mae'r Torïaid yn ei gynnig: maent yn cynnig bod pobl yn talu am wasanaethau'r GIG os ydynt yn ymddwyn mewn ffordd beryglus. Unwaith eto, pwy fydd yn penderfynu beth sy'n cyfateb i ymddygiad peryglus? Mae fy merch ar fin mynd ar gwrs addysg gyda'r ysgol sy'n cynnwys merlota, mynydda a cherdded dros y bryniau; os bydd yn syrthio, a godir tâl arnom am fynd â hi i adran damweiniau ac achosion brys? Blaen y gyllell yw hyn ac mae'n mynd yn groes i'r egwyddor o fod am ddim adeg darparu. Fodd bynnag, nodaf nad yw Darren yn awgrymu y dylem godi tâl ar bobl am fwyta gormod o basteiod neu yfed gormod o alcohol a'r ffordd y gall hynny effeithio ar ymddygiad pobl. Felly, gallwch fwyta cymaint ag yr hoffwch a smygu cymaint ag yr hoffwch ac ni chodir tâl arnoch, ond, er mwyn popeth, peidiwch â baglu pan fyddwch allan yn loncian na brifo eich hun pan fyddwch wrthi'n gwneud rhyw fath o ymarfer corff er mwyn ceisio cadw'n heini, oherwydd codir tâl arnoch. Mae bwriad y Torïaid yn gwbl amlwg.

That was one of the most bizarre speeches I have heard in this institution. It really was bizarre, and I am sure that I will sit in a health question and answer sessions with the leader of the Liberal Democrats and she will decry people not turning up for appointments, she will decry waste in the health service and will say that we need to do something about it, but will offer nothing in return but tea and biscuits.

One of the key things to remember is the sentence in the constitution of the NHS that states that the NHS should make the most effective, fair and sustainable use of its finite resources. That sentence is to be found at the beginning of the constitution. It is a fact that the NHS that we have today can do so much more than the NHS that was devised in the 1940s, yet much of that which technology and science has delivered for mankind is not available on our NHS because we cannot afford it. Many Members in the Chamber will have spoken to many patients with Parkinson's, for example, and will be aware that deep-brain stimulation is not regularly available in Wales. Many patients come to us as Assembly Members because they are denied access to certain medication. An event was held here yesterday by the MS Society, at which the leader of the Liberal Democrats decried the fact that certain drugs are not available because the resources are not there. Is it not incumbent upon politicians, but particularly the Executive—that is, the Government—to make sure that the resources that go into our national health service are used in an appropriate manner and meet the needs that we have in the twenty-first century?

This debate asks the Assembly to focus on that need and that requirement. We have a new Minister in place, and I hope that he will take the opportunity today, in responding to the debate, to outline his priorities. Many of us have attended community pharmacy events where the sheer waste within the prescriptions budget has been graphically outlined to us. I well remember the model that was set up in the third Assembly on the steps of the Senedd by Community Pharmacy Wales in response to the £50 million per year that it, not political groups or political researchers, identified as being wasted within the system. In a Welsh context, £50 million is a serious sum of money. Are we really going to turn our heads away from trying to find the solutions and alerting patients and clinicians to the obligations that we all have to our national health service? While it is critical that the health service remains free at the point of delivery, it is vital to address the waste that seeps out of any big organisation, keeping it to a bare minimum. As my colleague Darren Millar touched upon, every £1 wasted in the system denies a patient the ability to benefit from cutting-edge technology that could cure that individual or give them and their family a far greater life expectancy in their closing years.

Un o'r pethau allweddol i'w gofio yw'r frawddeg yng nghyfansoddiad y GIG sy'n datgan y dylai'r GIG newid y defnydd mwyaf effeithiol, teg a chynaliadwy o'i adnoddau cyfyngedig. Mae'r frawddeg honno ar ddechrau'r cyfansoddiad. Mae'n wir y gall y GIG sydd ohoni heddiw wneud cymaint yn fwy na'r GIG a sefydlwyd yn y 1940au, ond nid yw'r rhan fwyaf o'r buddiannau y mae technoleg a gwyddoniaeth wedi'u cynnig i ddynol ryw ar gael ar ein GIG oherwydd na allwn ei fforddio. Bydd sawl Aelod yn y Siambr wedi siarad â llawer o gleifion â chlefyd Parkinson, er enghraifft, a byddant yn ymwybodol nad yw triniaeth ysgogi yn nwfyn yr ymennydd ar gael fel mater o drefn yng Nghymru. Daw llawer o gleifion atom fel Aelodau'r Cynulliad am fod meddyginiaeth benodol wedi'i gwrthod iddynt. Cynhaliwyd digwyddiad yma ddoe gan y Gymdeithas MS, lle y gresynodd arweinydd y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol at y ffaith nad yw rhai cyffuriau ar gael oherwydd nad yw'r adnoddau ar gael. Onid yw'n ddyletswydd ar wleidyddion, ond yn enwedig y Weithrediaeth—hynny yw, y Llywodraeth—i wneud yn siŵr y caiff yr adnoddau a fuddsoddir yn ein gwasanaeth iechyd gwladol eu defnyddio mewn modd priodol a'u bod yn diwallu anghenion yr unfed ganrif ar hugain?

Mae'r ddadl hon yn gofyn i'r Cynulliad ganolbwyntio ar yr angen hwnnw a'r gofyniad hwnnw. Mae Gweinidog newydd yn y swydd, a gobeithio y gwnaiff achub ar y cyfle heddiw, wrth ymateb i'r ddadl, i amlinellu ei flaenoriaethau. Mae sawl un ohonom wedi mynd i ddigwyddiadau fferylliaeth gymunedol lle yr amlinellwyd y gwastraff llwyr o fewn y gyllideb presgripsiynau inni yn amlwg. Rwy'n cofio'n glir y model a sefydlwyd yn y trydydd Cynulliad ar risiau'r Senedd gan Fferylliaeth Gymunedol Cymru mewn ymateb i'r £50 miliwn y flwyddyn y nodwyd ganddi, nid gan grwpiau gwleidyddol nac ymchwilwyr gwleidyddol, fel y swm a oedd yn cael ei wastraffu yn y system. Yng nghydestun Cymru, mae £50 miliwn yn swm difrifol o arian. A ydym o ddifrif yn mynd i osgoi ceisio dod o hyd i'r atebion a hysbysu cleifion a chlinigwyr am y rhwymedigaethau sydd gan bob un ohonom i'n gwasanaeth iechyd gwladol? Er ei bod yn hollbwysig bod y gwasanaeth iechyd yn parhau am ddim i'w ddefnyddio, mae'n hanfodol ymdrin â'r gwastraff sy'n dod o unrhyw sefydliad mawr, gan sicrhau ei fod cyn lleied â phosibl. Fel y soniodd fy nghyd-Aelod Darren Millar, mae pob £1 a gaiff ei gwastraffu yn y system yn atal claf rhag gallu manteisio ar dechnoleg arloesol a allai wella'r unigolyn hwnnw neu roi disgwyliad oes llawer hirach iddo a'i deulu yn ystod ei flynyddoedd olaf.

It is also vital that we adapt to new medicines and procedures, such as the use of telemedicine—a vital tool to address the non-attendance of patients at many district general hospitals and, dare I say it, many surgeries. Not everyone has access to reliable transport, for example, or can get to a hospital at a given time. There are natural obstacles, which we must accept. However, if we have identified the problem, we must try to find a solution to it, rather than just say, 'No, the status quo must remain—isn't this terrible; we can't look at it because our beloved NHS is on the same model as the one used when it was formed in the 1940s'. We will be robbing the NHS of a future unless we tackle this problem.

In the last couple of weeks, I have travelled around Wales and spoken to many people in the health service. From Ysbyty Glan Clwyd to the Royal Glamorgan Hospital today, I have spoken to clinicians across Wales who have identified the need for politicians to face up to the challenge and to offer them the tools to address the 'blatant abuse'—those are their words—that they see going on every day in surgeries and drop-in centres, which so troubles them.

We can get emotive about this and do nothing, or we can face up to the challenge. By starting this debate today, the Welsh Conservatives have shown again that we are ahead of the curve. I look forward to hearing what the Minister has to say— [Interruption.] The opposition benches can decry it and choose to keep the status quo, but your rhetoric over the last couple of years has led only to decline. Face up to it: we have to change. That is why I call for support for the motion this afternoon.

Byddwn yn gwadu dyfodol i'r GIG onid ymdriniwn â'r broblem hon.

Yn yr ychydig wythnosau diwethaf, teithiais ledled Cymru a siaradais â llawer o bobl yn y gwasanaeth iechyd. O Ysbyty Glan Clwyd i Ysbyty Brenhinol Morgannwg heddiw, siaradais â chlinigwyr ledled Cymru sydd wedi nodi'r angen i wleidyddion wynebu'r her a chynnig yr adnoddau iddynt ymdrin â'r achosion o 'gamddefnydd amlwg'—dyna eu geiriau hwy—y maent yn eu gweld bob dydd mewn meddygfeydd a chanolfannau galw heibio, sy'n peri gofid mawr iddynt.

Gallwn fynd yn emosynol am hyn a gwneud dim, neu gallwn wynebu'r her. Drwy gychwyn y ddadl hon heddiw, mae Ceidwadwyr Cymru wedi dangos unwaith eto ein bod ar flaen y gad. Nid yn aml mae cymaint o drafodaeth ar goridor Plaid Cymru wrth ystyried cynnig gan y Torïaid a'r hyn a welwyd pan gyflwynwyd y cynnig hwn yr wythnos diwethaf. Nid oeddem yn gallu cytuno ar y coridor beth yn union roedd yn ei feddwl. Roedd rhai ohonom—fi, er enghraifft—yn ei ddarlenn fel bod 'ymddygiad anghyfrifol' gan gleifion yn golygu ymddygiad bygythiol ac ymosodol tuag at staff yr NHS. Roedd eraill ohonom yn credu bod 'ymddygiad anghyfrifol' yn golygu'r penderfyniad gan rai i beidio troi lan ar gyfer apwyntiadau. Mae'n debyg, yn ôl y cyflwyniad gan Darren Millar heddiw, mai dyna oedd ganddo mewn golwg wrth ddrafftio'r cynnig. Fodd bynnag, gofynnaf am ychydig mwy o eglurder yn y drafftio y tro nesaf, gan y byddai hynny wedi bod o help i ni ar goridor Plaid Cymru wrth benderfynu a oeddem yn bwriadu cynnig gwelliannau. Penderfynwyd peidio â chynnig gwelliannau gan nad oeddem yn deall beth oedd y cynnig yn ei feddwl. Ni fyddwn yn cefnogi'r cynnig gan ei fod mor benagored, ac oherwydd na wnaeth y cyflwyniad heddiw gan Darren Millar fy argyhoeddi bod y cynnig yn haeddu cefnogaeth.

It is not often that we have as much discussion on the Plaid Cymru corridor when considering a Tory motion as we had last week when this motion was tabled. We could not agree on the corridor what exactly it meant. Some of us—me, for example—read it as meaning that 'irresponsible patient behaviour' was threatening and hostile behaviour towards NHS staff. Others read it as meaning that 'irresponsible patient behaviour' was the decision taken by some not to turn up for NHS appointments. It seems, from Darren Millar's introduction today, that that is what he had in mind in drafting the motion. However, I ask for a little bit more clarity in the drafting next time, as that would have helped us on the Plaid Cymru corridor to decide whether or not we would table amendments. We decided not to table amendments because we did not understand what the motion meant. We will not be supporting the motion, because it is so open-ended, and Darren Millar's introduction today has not persuaded me that the motion deserves support.

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Beth yw'r 'ymddygiad anghyfrifol' sy'n cael ei ddisgrifio yn y cynnig, a phwy sy'n penderfynu beth sy'n ymddygiad anghyfrifol? Ar ei fwyaf syml, mae'n golygu unigolyn nad yw'n troi lan am apwyntiad NHS. Byddem yn fodlon derbyn bod hynny yn anghyfrifol. Fodd bynnag, i gyffesu o flaen y genedl, collais apwyntiad clinig NHS y llynedd o ganlyniad i gamgymeriad o ran nodi'r wythnos anghywir. Teimlais yn euog tu hwnt, ac rwy'n derbyn bod fy ymddygiad yn anghyfrifol, ond ni fyddai cosb ariannol wedi datrys hynny. Yr hyn a fyddai wedi helpu yn yr achos hwnnw fyddai cyfathrebu gwell gan yr NHS drwy ei system apwyntiadau gyda fi, fel claf. Os wyf yn gwneud apwyntiad gyda'r deintydd, rwy'n cael neges destun ac e-bost ganddo wythnos ymlaen llaw a 24 awr ymlaen llaw i'm hatgoffa. Rwy'n cael neges debyg hefyd oddi wrth y lle torri gwallt. Ar adegau, mae'n rhaid dweud bod systemau'r NHS yn perthyn yn fwy i'r ganrif ddiwethaf na'r ganrif hon. Rwy'n cytuno bod angen cyfathrebu gwell a systemau gwell er mwyn cryfhau faint o wybodaeth sydd ar gael i gleifion ac i atgoffa cleifion o'r angen i droi lan ar gyfer apwyntiadau. Llynedd, byddai hynny wedi f'atgoffa i droi lan i'm hapwyntiad. Rwy'n dal i deimlo'n euog, wrth gyffesu fy mai o'ch blaen chi'r prynhawn yma.

What is the 'irresponsible patient behaviour' described in the motion, and who decides what constitutes irresponsible behaviour? At its simplest, it is an individual who does not turn up for an NHS appointment. We would be willing to accept that that is irresponsible. However, I will confess before the nation that, last year, I missed an NHS clinic appointment as a result of an error—I noted it down for the wrong week. I felt extremely guilty, and I accept that my behaviour was irresponsible, but a financial penalty would not have resolved that. What would have helped in that case was better communication between the NHS appointments system and me, as the patient. If I make a dental appointment, I receive reminder texts and e-mails from the dentist a week beforehand and 24 hours beforehand. I receive similar messages from the hairdressers as well. At times, it must be said that NHS systems belong more to the last century than to this century, and I believe that we need better systems and better communication in order to strengthen the amount of information available to patients to remind them to turn up for appointments. Last year, that would have reminded me to turn up for my appointment. I still feel guilty in confessing that to you this afternoon.

Beth arall mae'r Toriaid yn ei ystyried yn anghyfrifol? Nid yr unigolyn sydd yn gyfrifol am benderfynu hynny yn y pen draw. Y doctoriaid a ddylai fod yn penderfynu hynny. Mae'n gwbl aneglur beth mae'r Toriaid yn ei olygu heddiw ynglŷn â phwy sy'n camdefnyddio'r NHS a phwy sy'n ei ddefnyddio yn anghyfrifol. Beth am y bobl sy'n gwneud gormod o chwaraeon ac sy'n gorfod cael pengliniau newydd, neu'r bobl sy'n yfed, bwyta neu ysmegu gormod? A yw'r rheini yn anghyfrifol?

What else do the Tories consider to be irresponsible? They consider individuals who turn up at A&E or who call an ambulance when they are not suffering from a life-threatening condition to be irresponsible. Who can carry out a perfect self-diagnosis? If you have chest pains, is it indigestion or is it a heart attack? It is, ultimately, not the individual's place to decide that. It is the doctors who should decide. It is completely unclear what the Tories mean today with regard to who is abusing the NHS or who is being irresponsible in using the NHS. What about the people who do too much sport and need new knees, or those who drink, eat or smoke too much? Are they irresponsible?

It is not the role of the state or politicians to decide who is behaving too irresponsibly to be treated by the NHS. Let the doctors decide who should be treated and, on this point, let the politicians be quiet.

I know that it is a pretty broad motion and many statistics have been brought forward, but I was not expecting hamsters to be thrown in at that point. Many speakers have already mentioned the gamut of statistics that relate to this motion, which are really concerning, but you only have to be out there, visiting an A&E department anywhere in Wales, to see that they are, by and large, either completely at capacity, near capacity or, in most cases, over capacity. To be fair to the Welsh Government, it is on the right track in terms of the principle of trying to get the focus away from hospitals and saying that people should be using hospitals—I do not like to use this phrase—as a last resort, but you know what I am saying. If we can get more people, first, to realise that they do not need to attend hospital, but beyond that, to attend local walk-in centres, that would go some way to mitigate the strains on the NHS.

Gwn ei fod yn gynig eithaf eang a bod llawer o ystadegau wedi'u cyflwyno, ond nid oeddwn yn disgwyl i fochdewion fod yn rhan o'r drafodaeth. Mae sawl siaradwr eisoes wedi sôn am yr amrywiaeth o ystadegau sy'n ymwneud â'r cynnig hwn, sy'n peri pryder gwirioneddol, ond drwy ymweld ag adran damweiniau ac achosion brys unrhyw le yng Nghymru, fe welch eu bod, i raddau helaeth, naill ai'n gweithredu hyd eithaf eu capasiti, yn agos at eu capasiti, neu, yn y rhan fwyaf o achosion, yn gweithredu dros eu capasiti. I fod yn deg i Lywodraeth Cymru, mae ar y trywydd iawn o ran yr egwyddor o geisio symud y ffocws oddi ar ysbytai a dweud y dylai pobl fod yn defnyddio ysbytai—nid wyf yn hoffi defnyddio'r ymadrodd hwn—fel y dewis olaf, ond rydych yn deall yr hyn rwy'n ei ddweud. Os gallwn gael mwy o bobl, yn gyntaf, i sylweddoli nad oes angen iddynt fynd i'r ysbyty, ond y tu hwnt i hynny, i fynd i ganolfannau cerdded-i-mewn lleol, byddai hynny o fudd mawr wrth liniaru'r pwysau ar y GIG.

It is of concern, however, that we know that half the A&E consultants in Wales have signed a joint letter to the Minister for health warning about meltdown. What a strong term 'meltdown' is; that demonstrates how bad things have got, or at least how bad they perceive that things have got. The alarm bells should be ringing loud and clear in the Minister's offices on the fifth floor. The College of Emergency Medicine has spoken of the problems with the ambulance service, and we all know about them and ambulance response times in different parts of Wales, but too often those response times are being caused because ambulances are crippled. They are gridlocked outside emergency departments because there is another problem further down the line inside those hospitals, with appropriate places not being found for patients. Therefore, a lot of this goes back to capacity in those emergency departments.

Fodd bynnag, mae'n bryder ein bod yn gwybod bod hanner y meddygon ymgynghorol damweiniau ac achosion brys yng Nghymru wedi llofnodi llythyr ar y cyd at y Gweinidog Iechyd yn ei rybuddio am drychineb. Mae'r term 'trychineb' yn un cryf iawn ac yn dangos difrifoldeb y sefyllfa, neu o leiaf y difrifoldeb yn eu barn hwy. Dylai'r clychau larwm fod i'w clywed yn amlwg yn swyddfeydd y Gweinidog ar y pumed llawr. Mae'r Coleg Meddygaeth Frys wedi sôn am y problemau gyda'r gwasanaeth ambiwlans, ac mae pob un ohonom yn ymwybodol ohonynt ac amseroedd ymateb ambiwlansys mewn gwahanol rannu o Gymru, ond yn rhy aml, caiff yr amseroedd ymateb hynny eu hachosi gan y ffaith bod ambiwlansys yn sefyll yn eu hunfan. Maent mewn tagfa y tu allan i adrannau achosion brys am fod problem arall rywle y tu mewn i'r ysbytai hynny, lle nad oes lleoedd priodol ar gael i gleifion. Felly, mae a wnelo llawer o'r broblem â chapasiti yn yr adrannau achosion brys hynny.

Professor Ceri Phillips, a Swansea University health economist, has spoken about the knock-on effect of patients occupying hospital beds who—simply put—should not be there. We have already heard about the Welsh Government's Choose Well campaign, and I think that Darren Millar paid some tribute to the idea of having that type of campaign, which aims to help people to decide whether they need medical attention. Of course, that is a difficult balancing act. You do not want people rushing to hospitals and rushing for treatment if they do not need it, but they need to know that the health service is there to support them if they really do need it.

Mae'r Athro Ceri Phillips, economegydd iechyd o Brifysgol Abertawe, wedi sôn am sgil-ffaith cleifion mewn gwelyau ysbytai na ddylent—yn syml—fod yno. Clywsom eisoes am ymgyrch Dewis Doeth Llywodraeth Cymru, a chredaf fod Darren Millar wedi talu teyrnged i'r syniad o roi'r math hwnnw o ymgyrch ar waith, sy'n anelu at helpu pobl i benderfynu pa un a oes angen sylw meddygol arnynt. Wrth gwrs, mae hynny'n benderfyniad anodd. Nid ydym am i bobl ruthro i'r ysbyty a ruthro i gael triniaeth os nad oes ei hangen arnynt, ond mae angen iddynt wybod bod y gwasanaeth iechyd yno i'w helpu os bydd wir angen help arnynt.

So, the Choose Well campaign is a good idea, in principle, but like so many things that the Welsh Government is doing in this area, it is good in principle but, in some ways, the jury is still out on whether it is actually working.

Felly, mae'r ymgyrch Dewis Doeth yn syniad da, mewn egwyddor, ond fel cymaint o bethau y mae Llywodraeth Cymru yn ei wneud yn y maes hwn, mae'n dda mewn egwyddor, ond, i raddau, nid oes tystiolaeth o ran p'un a yw'n gweithio mewn gwirionedd.

It is like asking, 'When did you stop beating your wife?', is it not? We have not put forward those proposals, Kirsty. You are one of the best debaters in this Chamber, and you always make really interesting and valid points, but in this debate, you seem to be going completely off on one. You are certainly not responding to the motion that we put forward. Older people do not need to be worried, and you do not need to be worried about our proposals either.

Onid yw fel gofyn 'Pryd y gwnaethoch roi'r gorau i guro eich gwraig?' Nid ydym wedi cyflwyno'r cynigion hynny, Kirsty. Rydych yn un o'r dadleuwyr gorau yn y Siambr hon, ac rydych bob amser yn gwneud pwyntiau dilys a diddorol iawn, ond yn y ddadl hon, ymddengys eich bod wedi'i cholli hi'n llwyr. Yn sicr, nid ydych yn ymateb i'r cynnig a gyflwynwyd gennym. Nid oes angen i bobl hŷn bryderu, ac nid oes angen i chi bryderu am ein cynigion ychwaith.

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There are innovative proposals, such as the idea of the app, which I think was launched in mid 2012. Unfortunately, by the end of 2012, there had only been up to 2,000 downloads of that app. Again, it was a good idea in principle, but it will not work if people do not know that it is there and are not using it.

Unwaith eto, roedd yn syniad da mewn egwyddor, ond ni fydd yn llwyddo oni fydd pobl yn gywbod ei fod ar gael ac yn ei ddefnyddio.

As the Welsh Government is probably fed up of hearing, we are concerned about the real term cuts to the health budget in Wales. However, we accept that you can put all of the money that you want into the NHS, but unless there is a behaviour change and recognition that the NHS cannot do everything, we will not solve this problem.

Reorganisation is part of the answer. Unfortunately, the Welsh Government does not have the best record of reorganising the health service or getting its message across, if it thinks that it is doing what is right, to people out there. In south-east Wales, it has worked to a better extent. Gwent Clinical Futures, which I, Lynne Neagle, William Graham and Mohammad Asghar often talk about, has been widely accepted. It involves separating intensive care and critical care from other aspects of hospital service. That is being developed. It has not been so successful in other parts of Wales, so I think that the Minister for health needs to look at where good practice is working and really try to roll it out a bit better than has happened in the past.

Fel y mae Llywodraeth Cymru fwy na thebyg wedi cael llond bol o glywed, rydym yn pryderu am y toriadau termau real i'r gyllideb iechyd yng Nghymru. Fodd bynnag, derbyniwn y gallwch fuddsoddi cymaint o arian ag y dymunwch yn y GIG, ond oni cheir newid mewn ymddygiad a chydabyddiaeth na all y GIG wneud popeth, ni chaiff y broblem hon ei datrys. Mae ad-drefnu yn rhan o'r ateb. Yn anffodus, nid oes gan Lywodraeth Cymru hanes da iawn o ad-drefnu'r gwasanaeth iechyd na chyfleu ei neges, os cred ei bod yn gwneud y peth cywir, i bobl ar lawr gwlad. Yn y de-ddwyrain, mae wedi gweithio'n well. Derbyniwyd Dyfodol Clinigol Gwent, yr wyf i, Lynne Neagle, William Graham a Mohammad Asghar yn aml yn sôn amdano, yn gyffredinol. Mae'n golygu gwahanu gofal dwys a gofal critigol o'r agweddau eraill ar wasanaethau ysbytai. Mae'r broses wrthi'n cael ei datblygu. Ni fu mor llwyddiannus mewn rhannau eraill o Gymru, felly credaf fod angen i'r Gweinidog iechyd ystyried ble mae arfer da yn gweithio a mynd ati o ddifrif i'w gyflwyno'n well nag a wnaed yn y gorffennol.



It has been an interesting debate so far but, of course, we have only spoken about one type of irresponsible patient behaviour. For me, there is actually a far more important aspect of irresponsible patient behaviour that we have been dealing with but of which we still need to be aware: the way in which a certain minority of patients treat the staff within our NHS. I would like to see some more focus in this debate. Rather than look at internment camps for old ladies and children who miss an appointment or whatever, I would like to look at how we protect the staff who work within the health service. It has been a growing area, and I think that we should pay some more attention to it.

In 2010-11, within Wales there were 7,689 assaults on NHS staff. In 2011-12, there were 8,434 assaults on NHS staff. Of all violent assaults, around 8% occur in accident and emergency departments—some of the departments under the greatest pressure. Although some of the statistics indicate that the situation is getting worse, we have a situation where, in past years, there was very little reporting of assaults on staff. There was not the confidence that anything would happen if reports were made, so there was massive under-reporting. Action is now being taken to deal with some of these incidents, but there is far greater reporting by staff because there is this belief that some action is being taken. In the 30 months to December 2012, when the Welsh Government launched its Christmas no tolerance campaign, there were 387 successful prosecutions, some of which resulted in custodial sentences, and 564 anti-social behaviour orders were issued. In 2010-11, there were 126 successful prosecutions and 143 other penalties imposed in the form of ASBOs on patients and visitors to hospitals. There were fixed penalties in 2011-12 and 179 successful prosecutions, with 139 internal sanctions, such as patient undertakings and patient exclusions—a penalty that is being increasingly used effectively within our hospitals. How bad was the situation in the past? The figures for 2008 showed that there were eight successful prosecutions. So, in an environment where there are probably well over 10,000 violent incidents, there were only eight prosecutions. The situation has begun to massively turn around, but there are still major issues.

My own local health board of Cwm Taf has been particularly active and successful in pursuing a zero tolerance campaign against anti-social behaviour and violent assaults within hospitals. As part of the implementation of a zero tolerance policy this year, posters have been placed prominently in accident and emergency departments and minor injury units in all hospitals in Merthyr and Rhondda Cynon Taf. As an example, some of the incidents of violence resulting in successful prosecution include a patient sentenced to 32 weeks of imprisonment for assault, criminal damage and racially aggravated behaviour for shouting vile, racist abuse at an accident and emergency consultant. Another sprayed deodorant into the face of a healthcare assistant and another kicked and punched an accident and emergency nurse in a viscous assault. Often, but not always, the attacks are linked with alcohol abuse.

Bu'n broblem gynyddol, a chredaf y dylem roi mwy o sylw iddi.

Yn 2010-11, yng Nghymru cafwyd 7,689 o ymosodiadau ar staff y GIG. Yn 2011-12, cafwyd 8,434 o ymosodiadau ar staff y GIG. O blith yr holl ymosodiadau treisgar, mae tua 8% yn digwydd mewn adrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys—rhai o'r adrannau sy'n wynebu'r pwysau mwyaf. Er bod rhai o'r ystadegau yn dangos bod y sefyllfa'n gwaethygu, y gwir amdani yw, yn y gorffennol, na chofnodwyd llawer o ymosodiadau ar staff. Nid oedd hyder y byddai unrhyw beth yn digwydd pe rhoddwyd gwybod, felly roedd y ffigurau a gofnodwyd yn llawer is. Bellach mae camau ar waith i ymdrin â rhai o'r digwyddiadau hyn, ond mae llawer mwy o staff yn rhoi gwybod am ddigwyddiadau o'r fath gan eu bod yn credu y caiff camau eu cymryd. Yn ystod y 30 mis hyd at fis Rhagfyr 2012, pan lansiodd Llywodraeth Cymru ei hymgyrch dim goddefgarwch adeg y Nadolig, erlynwyd 387 o achosion yn llwyddiannus, gyda rhai ohonynt yn arwain at ddedfryd o garchar, a chyhoeddwyd 564 o orchmynion ymddygiad gwrthgymdeithasol. Yn 2010-11, erlynwyd 126 o achosion yn llwyddiannus a rhoddwyd 143 o gosbau eraill ar ffurf gorchmynion ymddygiad gwrthgymdeithasol ac gleifion ac ymwelwyr ag ysbytai. Cyflwynwyd cosbau penodedig yn 2011-12 ac erlynwyd 179 o achosion yn llwyddiannus, gyda 139 o sancsiynau mewnol, fel ymgymeriadau cleifion a gwaharddiadau cleifion—cosb sy'n cael ei defnyddio'n gynyddol effeithiol o fewn ein hysbytai. Pa mor ddifrifol oedd y sefyllfa yn y gorffennol? Dangosodd ffigurau 2008 yr erlynwyd wyth o achosion yn llwyddiannus. Felly, mewn amgylchedd lle ceir fwy na thebyg ymhell dros 10,000 o ddigwyddiadau treisgar, dim ond wyth o achosion a erlynwyd. Mae'r sefyllfa wedi dechrau newid yn sylweddol, ond mae problemau difrifol o hyd.

Bu fy mwrdd iechyd lleol i, sef Cwm Taf, yn arbennig o weithgar a llwyddiannus wrth roi ymgyrch dim goddefgarwch ar waith yn erbyn ymddygiad gwrthgymdeithasol ac ymosodiadau treisgar mewn ysbytai. Fel rhan o'r broses o roi polisi dim goddefgarwch ar waith eleni, gosodwyd poster mewn lleoedd amlwg mewn adrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys ac unedau mân anafiadau ymhob ysbyty ym Merthyr a Rhondda Cynon Taf, ac erlynwyd rhai o'r digwyddiadau treisgar yn llwyddiannus gan gynnwys claf a gafodd ddedfryd o 32 wythnos o garchar am ymosodiad, difrod troseddol ac ymddygiad hiliol am weiddi sylwadau sarhaus hiliol, ffaidd at feddyg brys ymgynghorol. Chwistrelodd claf arall ddiaroglydd yn wyneb cynorthwydd gofal iechyd a gwnaeth claf arall gicio a dyrnu nyrs damweiniau ac achosion brys mewn ymosodiad milain. Yn aml, ond dim bob amser, mae'r ymosodiadau yn gysylltiedig â chamdefnyddio alcohol.

Between April 2012 and March 2013, Cwm Taf Local Health Board made 79 referrals to community safety partnerships; 102 markers had been placed on patient records to warn staff of potential abuse or violence; 28 code of conduct letters were sent to patients or visitors who had behaved unacceptably towards staff; 18 patients or visitors were prosecuted in court for violent behaviour resulting in prison sentences, fines, community sentences or ASBOs; and nine people were cautioned or issued with a penalty notice for inappropriate behaviour.

Deputy Presiding Officer, on this particular day, May Day International Workers' Day, we should perhaps be focusing a little more on the people who dedicate so much of their lives to working within the NHS. Nobody should ever have to go into work with the fear or risk that they will be assaulted, violently attacked, racially abused or potentially injured. If there is any lesson for us to learn from this debate, it is one of respect for working people, respect for our public services and what those public sector workers do, and to condemn and prosecute those who undermine these principles.

## **Mohammad Asghar** [Bywgraffiad Biography](#)

The national health service provides a comprehensive range of health services, the majority of which are free at the point of use for United Kingdom residents. These services are provided as a right, but as with all rights, they come with responsibilities. This debate today highlights the need for patients using NHS services to act responsibly. This is important at any time, but in these times of spending cuts in Wales and pressure on budgets, it is vital.

I will confine my remarks this afternoon to two aspects of waste in the NHS—prescriptions and unused medicine. Since the Welsh Government introduced its policy of free prescriptions, the number of prescription items dispensed in the community has increased. Last year, this amounted to nearly 75 million items at a cost of nearly £560 million. Many of these items are simply wasted. That is £0.5 billion, Deputy Presiding Officer.

Dr Graham Shortland is a medical director for Cardiff and the Vale University Local Health Board and he estimates that of more than 9 million items dispensed by his health board last year, the total wasted amounted to nearly £3 million. Welsh Government policy means that those who can afford to make a small contribution to their treatment benefit from free prescriptions, while cancer patients are denied life-extending drugs in Wales. The introduction of a £5 prescription charge for the better off would tackle the problem. It would provide much-needed funds for the NHS, and, at the same time, it would encourage individuals to purchase cheaper items from their local pharmacy or supermarket.

Ddirprwy Lywydd, ar y diwrnod arbennig hwn, Diwrnod Gweithwyr Rhyngwladol Calan Mai, efallai y dylem fod yn canolbwyntio ychydig mwy ar y bobl sy'n ymroi cyrnaint o'u bywydau i weithio yn y GIG. Ni ddylai neb byth orfod mynd i'r gwaith gyda'r ofn neu'r risg y bydd rhywun yn ymosod arnynt, yn ymddwyn yn dreisgar tuag atynt, yn eu cam-drin yn hiliol neu y cânt eu hanafu. Os oes unrhyw wers inni ei dysgu o'r ddadl hon, yna parch tuag at bobl sy'n gweithio, parch tuag at ein gwasanaethau cyhoeddus a'r hyn y mae'r gweithwyr sector cyhoeddus hynny yn ei wneud yw'r wers honno, a dylid condemnio ac erlyn y rheini sy'n tansellio'r egwyddorion hyn.

Mae'r gwasanaeth iechyd gwladol yn darparu amrywiaeth gynhwysfawr o wasanaethau iechyd, y mae'r rhan fwyaf ohonynt am ddim i breswylwyr y Deyrnas Unedig eu defnyddio. Darperir y gwasanaethau hyn fel hawl, ond fel gyda phob hawl, mae cyfrifoldebau ynghlwm. Mae'r ddadl hon heddiw yn tynnu sylw at yr angen i gleifion sy'n defnyddio gwasanaethau'r GIG ymddwyn yn gyfrifol. Mae hyn yn bwysig ar unrhyw adeg, ond yn y cyfnod hwn o doriadau gwariant yng Nghymru a phwysau ar gyllidebau, mae'n hanfodol.

Cyfyngaf fy sylwadau y prynhawn yma i ddwy agwedd ar wastraff yn y GIG—presgripsiynau a meddyginiaethau nas defnyddir. Ers i Lywodraeth Cymru gyflwyno ei pholisi presgripsiynau am ddim, mae nifer yr eitemau a roddir ar bresgripsiwn yn y gymuned wedi cynyddu. Y llynedd, daeth i gyfanswm o bron i 75 miliwn o eitemau ar gost o bron i £560 miliwn. Caiff llawer o'r eitemau hyn eu gwastraffu. Mae hynny'n £0.5 biliwn, Ddirprwy Lywydd.

Mae Dr Graham Shortland yn gyfarwyddwr meddygol i Fwrdd Iechyd Lleol Prifysgol Caerdydd a'r Fro ac mae'n amcangyfrif o blith mwy na 9 miliwn o eitemau a baratowyd gan ei fwrdd iechyd y llynedd, fod cyfanswm gwastraff o bron i £3 miliwn. Mae polisi Llywodraeth Cymru yn golygu bod presgripsiynau am ddim yn cael eu rhoi i'r rheini a all fforddio gwneud cyfraniad bach tuag at eu triniaeth, ond bod cyffuriau i ymestyn bywyd yn cael eu gwadu i gleifion â chanser yng Nghymru. Byddai cyflwyno tâl o £5 am bresgripsiynau i'r rhai gwell eu byd yn mynd i'r afael â'r broblem. Byddai'n darparu arian y mae ei angen yn ddirfawr ar y GIG, ac, ar yr un pryd, byddai'n annog unigolion i brynu eitemau rhatach o'u fferyllfa neu eu harchfarchnad leol.

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A while ago, I was contacted by a constituent whose wife had been ill, and had been prescribed tablets for her conditions. She made a full recovery, and my constituent was left with a considerable supply of unused tablets. He tried to return them, but was told that he could not do so, and they were thrown in the bin by the chemist in front of that person. What a shame, and what a waste.

Unused medicine is costing the NHS in Wales millions of pounds. In my own area, wasted medicine costs Aneurin Bevan Local Health Board £4 million a year. In January, Aneurin Bevan health board joined with three other health boards to launch a major medicine waste campaign. This campaign encourages patients to only order what they need. I very much welcome this initiative. However, we need the Welsh Government to adopt a consistent and uniform approach to wasted medicine, one that applies to the whole of Wales. We need a scheme that allows patients to return unused and unwanted medicines to wherever they were issued—

I call on the Minister for Health and Social Services, Mark Drakeford, to reply to the debate.

Diolch, Ddirprwy Lywydd. I thank the proposers for bringing forward this debate. I do not agree with everything that they have said, but the discussion is one that is worth having.

At its root, the NHS is founded on a great moral bargain. We pool our resources on the basis of our ability to contribute, and we share them out on the basis of need. However, as in any bargain, it relies on those who are party to it abiding by its rules. Where the NHS is concerned, that bargain is one that has huge commitment from the vast majority of people in Wales. Indeed, I do not recognise the picture of blatant abuse that some Members have tried to portray. Today's debate is focused on the small number of people who do not respect that bargain.

Darren Millar began by focusing on people who fail to keep appointments. There is no doubt that missed appointments are a matter of real concern in hard-pressed services, and there are effective, practical ways that he and Elin Jones identified to bear down on them. Is fining people one of them? That option is superficially attractive to some, but it quickly comes apart as a practical proposition. I will not go through the arguments that Kirsty Williams effectively put against that idea.

However, I will mention this one argument. Fining is not a matter that simply has an effect on the individual who is on the receiving end of it. Imagine for a moment a person who is highly infectious from a serious disease, and whose health difficulties pose a problem to others. If they decide to avoid seeking treatment because they have an outstanding fine to pay, the danger is not simply to themselves, but to everyone else as well.

The objections to fining are not simply practical. Would they work? That great public philosopher, Michael Sandel, addressed the issue in his recent Reith lectures. He used the example of a nursery in Israel, where workers who were fed up with parents who failed to pick up their children on time at the end of the day, initiated a fining system to crack down on the problem. What was the result? Rather than fewer children being picked up late, more and more were in that position. A free service had become a fee service. Parents who had previously done everything that they could to arrive on time now preferred to arrive late and pay the fine. The moral persuasion that had previously shaped their behaviour had been replaced by a commercial transaction. The nursery went back to its former system.

Before discussing some further ideas raised by the movers of the motion, could I quickly address the points raised in the amendment from the Liberal Democrats? Pharmacy waste is an important matter. I am grateful for the recognition that the Member provides to actions already in hand to address this, particularly those with community pharmacy. The Government will support the amendment.

Diolch, Ddirprwy Lywydd. Diolch i'r cynigywyr am gyflwyno'r ddadl hon. Ni chytunaf â phopeth y maent wedi'i ddweud, ond mae'r drafodaeth yn un sy'n werth ei chael.

Dechreuodd Darren Millar drwy ganolbwyntio ar bobl sy'n methu â chadw apwyntiadau. Nid oes unrhyw amheuaeth bod apwyntiadau a gaiff eu methu yn peri pryder gwirioneddol o fewn gwasanaethau sydd o dan bwysau, ac mae ffyrdd effeithiol ac ymarferol a nodwyd ganddo a chan Elin Jones o fynd i'r afael â hynny. A yw codi dirwy ar bobl yn un ohonynt? Mae'r opsiwn hwnnw yn ddeniadol ar yr wyneb i rai, ond nid yw'n ymarferol bosibl. Nid ailadroddaf y dadleuon a gyflwynwyd yn effeithiol gan Kirsty Williams yn erbyn y syniad hwnnw.

Fodd bynnag, soniaf am yr un ddadl hon. Nid dim ond yr unigolyn y codir y ddirwy arno y mae'r broses o godi dirwy yn effeithio arno. Dychmygwch am eiliad berson sy'n heintus iawn o ganlyniad i afiechyd difrifol, ac y mae ei anawsterau iechyd yn peri problem i eraill. Os bydd yn penderfynu osgoi mynd am driniaeth am fod dirwy yn ddyledus ganddo, yn ogystal â'r perygl iddo'i hun, mae perygl i bawb arall hefyd.

Nid dim ond gwrthwynebiadau ymarferol sydd i godi dirwyon. A fyddent yn gweithio? Ymdriniodd yr athronydd cyhoeddus clodwiw, Michael Sandel, â'r mater yn ei ddarlithoedd Reith diweddar. Defnyddiodd yr enghraifft o feithrinfa yn Israel, lle rhoddodd gweithwyr a oedd wedi cael llond bol ar rieni yn methu â chasglu eu plant ar amser ar ddiwedd y dydd system codi dirwy ar waith er mwyn mynd i'r afael â'r broblem. Beth oedd y canlyniad? Yn hytrach na llai o blant yn cael eu casglu'n hwyr, roedd mwy a mwy yn gwneud hynny. Daeth gwasanaeth am ddim yn wasanaeth talu ffioedd. Roedd bellach yn well gan rieni a arferai wneud popeth o fewn eu gallu i gyrraedd yn brydlon gyrraedd yn hwyr a thalu'r ddirwy. Disodlwyd y darbwylliad moesol a lywiodd eu hymddygiad cyn hynny gan drafodyn masnachol. Dychwelodd y feithrinfa at yr hen system.

Cyn trafod rhai syniadau pellach a godwyd gan y rhai a gyflwynodd y cynnig, a gaf yn gyflym ymdrin â'r pwyntiau a godwyd yng ngwelliant y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol? Mae gwastraff fferyllol yn fater pwysig. Rwy'n ddiolchgar bod yr Aelod yn cydnabod y camau gweithredu sydd eisoes yn mynd rhagddynt i ymdrin â hyn, yn arbennig y rheini ar y cyd â fferylliaeth gymunedol. Bydd y Llywodraeth yn cefnogi'r gwelliant.

Let me turn to a different set of issues that have emerged in the debate. There is no doubt that the health service continues to pick up the consequences of problems that are, in some cases and to some extent, self-inflicted. The cost of excess alcohol to the NHS in Wales amounts to more than £70 million annually. A very large percentage of people who attend A&E departments—up to 40% in some studies—are there because of an alcohol-related injury or accident. Yet, if the A&E staff fail to treat any one of those people within the four-hour limit, it is the NHS that ends up in the dock, not the person themselves. My view of this is clear enough: the Government has a responsibility to create the conditions in which individuals are able to take good care of their own health, be that as a result of alcohol problems, drug problems, obesity or any of the other shaping factors that we know are there. However, when individuals fail to take actions that are available to them, then today's debate at least asks whether the NHS can be expected, simply and unquestioningly, to ride to the rescue on those people's own terms. At its worst, when this involves violence against staff, as Mick Antoniw set out, let me be clear that we will act to protect those whose own safety is being put at risk. In 2008-09, there were only eight prosecutions in the whole of that year. As Mick has said, in the last 12 months, there have been more than 100 successful prosecutions, including custodial sentences as well as a range of other sanctions.

In a very different part of the spectrum, Cardiff and the Vale LHB considered a paper recently that discussed the treatment to be offered to people with obesity. The key argument of that paper was a clinical one. The Cardiff and Vale scheme was not about punishing people who smoke or who are overweight; it was about making sure that elective treatments are carried out when a patient is able to benefit from them. We know that smokers recover less well from surgical wounds; we know that obesity brings real issues in relation to, for example, anaesthesia; and joint procedures are less effective where weight is a problem. The Cardiff scheme offers patients a free and effective way to put themselves in a position where treatment can succeed. I think that there is a case for being clearer, in the spirit of today's motion, that when someone fails to take advantage of the help on hand, they cannot expect that treatment will simply go ahead regardless. That does not mean, of course, that the NHS will turn its back on someone—only that the bargain to which I referred at the outset will have to be recast.

Mae achosion sy'n gysylltiedig ag yfed gormod o alcohol yn costio mwy na £70 miliwn i'r GIG yng Nghymru bob blwyddyn. Mae canran uchel iawn o'r bobl a ddaw i adrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys—hyd at 40% mewn rhai astudiaethau—yno oherwydd anaf neu ddamwain sy'n gysylltiedig ag alcohol. Eto i gyd, os bydd staff yr adran yn methu â thrin unrhyw un o'r bobl hynny o fewn y terfyn o bedair awr, nhw a gaiff eu barnu, nid y person ei hun. Mae fy marn ar hyn yn ddigon clir: mae cyfrifoldeb ar y Llywodraeth i greu'r amodau lle y gall unigolion ofalu am eu hiechyd eu hunain, boed hynny o ganlyniad i broblemau alcohol, problemau cyffuriau, gordewdra neu unrhyw rai o'r ffactorau llywio eraill y gwyddom amdanynt. Fodd bynnag, pan fydd unigolion yn methu â chymryd camau sydd ar gael iddynt, yna mae dadl heddiw o leiaf yn gofyn pa un a ellir disgwyl i'r GIG, yn syml ac yn ddi-gwestiwn, ddod i'r adwy ar delerau'r bobl hynny. Ar ei waethaf, pan fo hyn yn cynnwys trais yn erbyn staff, fel y nododd Mick Antoniw, gadewch imi fod yn glir y byddwn yn gweithredu i ddiogelu'r rheini y mae risg i'w diogelwch. Yn 2008-09, dim ond wyth achos a erlynwyd yn ystod y flwyddyn gyfan honno. Fel y dywedodd Mick, yn ystod y 12 mis diwethaf, erlynwyd dros 100 o achosion yn llwyddiannus, gan gynnwys dedfrydau o garchar yn ogystal ag amrywiaeth o gosbau eraill.

Mewn rhan wahanol iawn o'r sbectrwm, ystyriodd BILl Caerdydd a'r Fro bapur yn ddiweddar a oedd yn trafod y driniaeth i'w chynnig i bobl â gordewdra. Dadl glinigol oedd dadl allweddol y papur hwnnw. Nid cosbi pobl sy'n smygu neu sydd dros eu pwysau oedd nod cynllun Caerdydd a'r Fro; ei nod oedd sicrhau y caiff triniaethau dewisol eu cynnal pan fydd claf yn gallu cael budd ohonynt. Gwyddom nad yw smygwyr yn gwella cystal o glwyfau llawfeddygol; gwyddom fod problemau go iawn yn gysylltiedig â gordewdra, er enghraifft, o ran anaesthesia; ac mae triniaethau ar y cyd yn llai effeithiol pan fo pwysau yn broblem. Mae cynllun Caerdydd yn cynnig ffordd effeithiol ac am ddim i gleifion sicrhau eu bod mewn sefyllfa lle y gall triniaeth lwyddo. Credaf fod achos dros fod yn gliriach, yn ysbryd cynnig heddiw, pan fydd rhywun yn methu â manteisio ar y cymorth a gynigir iddynt, na allant ddisgwyl cael y driniaeth honno beth bynnag. Wrth gwrs, nid yw hynny'n golygu y bydd y GIG yn troi ei gefn ar rywun—dim ond y bydd yn rhaid ail-lunio'r fargen y cyfeiriais ati ar y dechrau.

For those of us on this side of the Chamber, these arguments are important because of where we start from as far as the health service is concerned. Here is the NHS, for all its imperfections, today as it ever has been, the last resort of the welfare state: when the housing office is closed, when the DWP has reduced or removed your benefits, when your social services department has retreated behind a telephone helpline, it is the NHS that is still open 24 hours every day. It is the one place left where you can be sure that someone will at least hear your story, and do what they can to bind up your wounds, be they physical or emotional. So, when the Government says that we will support today's motion—and we will—we will do so not only with a set of practical question marks that we will need to attach to working out how a new paradigm of rights and responsibilities would be applied in the NHS, but with a set of ethical parameters, too.

Felly, pan fydd y Llywodraeth yn datgan y byddwn yn cefnogi cynnig heddiw—ac fe wnawn hynny—gwnawn hynny nid yn unig gyda chyfres o farciau cwestiwn ymarferol y bydd angen inni eu hystyried wrth weithio allan sut y câi cynllun newydd o hawliau a chyfrifoldebau ei gymhwyso yn y GIG, ond gyda chyfres o baramedrau moesegol hefyd.

On 2 January 1998, Miguel Valdez, a private security guard at the Florida bank, shot a customer for double parking in the bank's car park. One of the other curious parts of this debate was Elin's contribution. I think that we could perhaps consider providing an explanatory memorandum to this, if she finds the simple words of this motion hard to understand. Clearly, we are upset that you forgot your amendment, but that is not really a matter for us.

When she was the Minister for health, she did particularly good work in reminding the police to take action in exactly those situations that you mentioned. Time and again, the Royal Gwent in Newport sees drunken people who, having been refused a taxi, think, 'Where are we going to go for a warm on a cold evening? We'll go to the Royal Gwent Hospital' and then are outraged when they are thrown out. That is the sort of thing that we think is wholly irresponsible, and is an absolute travesty of trying to use the national health service. Free at the point of delivery it may be, but not for people of that kind.

Gwnaeth Mick Antoniw bwynt eithriadol o bwysig, ac rydym yn ei werthfawrogi'n fawr. Hoffwn dalu teyrnged arbennig i Jane Hutt, os caf. We accept—[Interruption.] No, Kirsty. Do not tell me that you are trying to defend threatening and abusive behaviour against national health staff. That is remarkable, even from you. [Assembly Members: 'Oh.'] However, we accept your very interesting and reasonable proposals in your amendment on medicines, which, as the Minister has clearly outlined, and my colleague Mohammad Asghar has outlined, is a major source of unnecessary expenditure. It was interesting to hear the Minister refer to this as a bargain. Clearly, it is, and it requires responsible behaviour from those who use the national health service. It is, as the Minister rightly pointed out, and as we have said in our remarks this afternoon, a small number who have a disproportionate effect on the service that we all hope to enjoy and very much think is one of the great things of British life.

A man called 999 for an ambulance saying he had a toothache. Ambulance control received a 999 call from an individual who had bitten a plastic bag and was concerned he had bits of plastic in his teeth.'

Ar ôl cael ei drin mewn adran damweiniau ac achosion brys, penderfynodd dyn ffonio 999 a threfnu ambiwlans brys fel gwasanaeth taci adref. Deialodd unigolyn 999 am fod ganddo ewin troed heintus. Ffoniodd dyn 999 am ambiwlans gan ddweud fod ganddo'r ddannodd. Cafodd ystafell reoli ambiwlans alwad 999 gan unigolyn a oedd wedi cnoi bag plastig ac a oedd yn poeni fod darnau o blastig yn ei ddannedd.

Small wonder, therefore, that there are so many calls to the ambulance service that are, frankly, unnecessary. A woman demanded to be taken to hospital after she was scratched by a cat. Well, there might be something in that, but we all know that these sorts of calls are unnecessary: 450,000 people leave accident and emergency without being admitted to hospital, after having been treated well in the triage system.

This debate today was to try to focus on those people who, frankly, need a great deal of education. I would include in that, sadly, those general practitioners who oversubscribe time and again, and whose unfortunate contract—in my opinion, at least—does not allow them to treat just those people who were identified today, particularly young mothers who want reassurance about their children. Instead, those mothers have to go to accident and emergency and queue for four hours, when it could probably be dealt with in the surgery in a matter of minutes.

I ask for your support for our motion today.

Motion NDM5224 Jocelyn Davies

To propose that the National Assembly for Wales:

Calls on the Welsh government to remit the Commission on Public Service Governance to address the current lack of democratic accountability within the NHS by considering:

- a) direct elections to Local Health Boards;
- b) democratic oversight of joint working and pooled budget arrangements between Health Boards and local authorities;
- c) the election of service users to Community Health Councils; and
- d) the financial accountability of Local Health Boards directly to the National Assembly's Finance Committee.

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I move the motion.

Cynigiau y cynnig.

I hope that Members here will consider that it is timely to bring forward this particular motion on the democratisation of the NHS given two particular Welsh Government initiatives that provide the vehicle for this issue to be meaningfully debated. I want this opportunity for strengthening democratic accountability and improving the integration of services to be embraced by the Welsh Government. I hope therefore that this motion can provide the impetus for these issues to be taken forward in two ways.

Gobeithiaf y bydd Aelodau yma yn ystyried ei bod yn amserol i ddwyn ymlaen y cynnig arbennig hwn ar ddemocrateiddio'r GIG o gofio dwy fenter benodol gan Lywodraeth Cymru sy'n rhoi cyfle inni drafod y mater hwn yn ystyrlon. Rwyf am i'r cyfle hwn i gryfhau atebolrwydd democrataidd ac integreiddio gwasanaethau yn well gael ei groesawu gan Lywodraeth Cymru. Rwy'n gobeithio, felly, y bydd y cynnig hwn yn rhoi hwb i gamau i symud y materion hyn ymlaen mewn dwy ffordd.

First, there is the First Minister's commission on public service governance. In my opinion, it is essential that one of the largest public service sectors is not excluded from that discussion. It is also useful that Paul Williams, as the ex-chief executive of the NHS, is the commission's chair. Secondly, the passage of the Social Services and Well-being (Wales) Bill also enables a debate on the future structure and joint working of NHS and social service departments. The Bill as drafted provides powers for Welsh Ministers to make regulations to require the integration of services and budgets between more than one social service department or between a local authority and a local health board. However, this is an example of powers without policy, in my view. The powers currently in the Bill could enable ad hoc joint working in some areas or between some partners—a patchy approach, which characterises too much of Welsh public service. What the Bill should do is reflect in legislation a clear policy direction on the future structures of service delivery in health and social care, and ensure effective integration of services in every part of Wales.

Yn gyntaf, mae comisiwn y Prif Weinidog ar lywodraethu gwasanaethau cyhoeddus. Yn fy marn i, mae'n hanfodol nad yw un o'r sectorau gwasanaeth cyhoeddus mwyaf yn cael ei eithrio o'r drafodaeth honno. Mae hefyd yn ddefnyddiol mai Paul Williams, fel cyn brif weithredwr y GIG, yw cadeirydd y comisiwn. Yn ail, mae hynt Bil Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol a Lles (Cymru) hefyd yn galluogi trafodaeth ar strwythur y GIG ac adrannau gwasanaethau cymdeithasol yn y dyfodol a threfniadau gweithio ar y cyd. Mae'r Bil fel y'i drafftwyd yn rhoi pwerau i Weinidogion Cymru wneud rheoliadau i'w gwneud yn ofynnol i integreiddio gwasanaethau a chyllidebau rhwng mwy nag un adran gwasanaethau cymdeithasol neu rhwng awdurdod lleol a bwrdd iechyd lleol. Fodd bynnag, mae hon yn enghraifft o bwerau heb bolisi, yn fy marn i. Gallai'r pwerau ar hyn o bryd yn y Bil alluogi cydweithio ad hoc mewn rhai ardaloedd neu rhwng rhai partneriaid—dull anghyson o weithredu, sy'n nodweddiadol o ormod o wasanaeth cyhoeddus Cymru. Yr hyn y dylai'r Bil ei wneud yw adlewyrchu mewn deddfwriaeth gyfeiriad polisi clir ar y strwythurau darparu gwasanaethau ym maes iechyd a gofal cymdeithasol yn y dyfodol, a sicrhau y caiff gwasanaethau eu hintegreiddio'n effeithiol ym mhob rhan o Gymru.

Why is there a need for joint working and pooling of budgets between local health boards and social service departments? You only have to look back at the Minister's statement on unscheduled care last week. In that statement, the Minister clearly outlined the problems caused by the lack of integration and of pooled budgets between the NHS and social services, and the impact on patients stuck in hospital beds while the two organisations discuss where to place them, and who should fund their post-hospital care. All of us, as Assembly Members, will know of countless cases where there are lengthy discussions between local health boards and local authorities on who is responsible for an individual's care. The individual and his or her family are often left in the middle of what can at times feel like inter-organisational turf war. Whether a person needs homecare, residential care, or NHS nursing care should be a matter that is decided on the basis of an assessment of the individual's need, not on the basis of organisational convenience. The traditional boundaries between NHS care and social care need to be swept away. They are no longer relevant to the kind of fluid, integrated care needed by our increasingly elderly population.

Pam mae angen i fyrddau iechyd lleol ac adrannau gwasanaethau cymdeithasol gydweithio a chyfuno cyllidebau? Does ond rhaid ichi edrych yn ôl ar ddatganiad y Gweinidog ar ofal heb ei drefnu yr wythnos diwethaf. Yn y datganiad hwnnw, amlinellodd y Gweinidog yn glir y problemau a achosir gan y diffyg integreiddio a chyllidebau ar y cyd rhwng y GIG a gwasanaethau cymdeithasol, a'r effaith ar gleifion sy'n gaeth i welyau ysbty tra bod y ddau sefydliad yn trafod ble i'w gosod, a phwy ddylai ariannu eu gofal ôl-ysbty. Mae pob un ohonom, fel Aelodau Cynulliad, yn gwybod am achosion di-ri lle mae trafodaethau hir rhwng byrddau iechyd lleol ac awdurdodau lleol ar bwy sy'n gyfrifol am ofal unigolyn. Mae'r unigolyn a'i deulu yn aml yn cael eu dal yng nghanol yr hyn sy'n gallu, ar adegau, deimlo fel rhyfel cartref rhyng-sefydliadol. Dylai'r penderfyniad ynghylch p'un a oes angen gofal cartref, gofal preswyl, neu ofal nyrsio'r GIG ar unigolyn gael ei wneud ar sail asesiad o angen yr unigolyn, nid ar sail hwylustod sefydliadol. Mae angen ysgubo ymaith y ffiniau traddodiadol rhwng gofal y GIG a gofal cymdeithasol. Nid ydynt yn berthnasol mwyach i'r math o ofal di-dor, integredig sydd ei angen ar ein poblogaeth sy'n fwyfwy oedrannus.

There are impressive results from cutting out this organisational turf war by merging health and social care budgets. We hear over and over in health debates of the Torbay experience. It is often quoted in Wales, but has yet to be properly replicated here. After 10 years of integration and pooling of budgets in Torbay, there have been dramatically positive outcomes. The King's Fund analysis reported that the daily average number of occupied hospital beds fell from 750 in 1998 to 502 in 2009. Emergency bed day use for people aged 75 and over fell by 24% between 2003 and 2008. All of this happened with a reported saving of £250,000 in the first year of operation.

The Social Services and Well-being (Wales) Bill provides powers for Ministers to pool budgets, but it is my view that the Welsh Government could be braver and use this legislation to finally fully integrate health and social services in Wales. In our recent health committee scrutiny on this legislation, local government was asking for clearer direction from the Welsh Government on integration, but the Welsh Government, to date, is sitting on the fence, wanting the powers but without a clear policy intention.

It is timely, therefore, in my opinion, to ask the commission on public service governance to consider this issue. I was pleased yesterday that the First Minister confirmed a willingness to do so. Scotland is looking at a stand-alone piece of legislation to integrate health and social care. The Welsh Government could also consider revisiting the current social services Bill and removing the ad hoc regulation-making powers to introduce stand-alone legislation to fully integrate these two services in a coherent and considered way.

Of course, in considering the integration of the NHS and adult social care, the commission will instantly face the question of the democratic oversight of any newly formed joint arrangement. If, for example, adult social care responsibilities were transferred to local health boards, where would the democratic overview of the new arrangements be?

Currently, local health boards have one councillor per board, appointed by the Welsh Minister, alongside all the other board appointees. We should consider strengthening the democratic legitimacy of health boards, especially if they become local health and social boards. We could consider direct elections at the same time as local government elections or a model more akin to a fire authority or a national park authority, where already elected councillors are elected by their councils onto the board.

Mae rhoi'r gorau i'r rhyfel cartref sefydliadol hwn drwy gyfuno cyllidebau iechyd a gofal cymdeithasol yn arwain at ganlyniadau trawiadol. Rydym yn clywed drosodd a throsodd mewn dadleuon iechyd am brofiad Torbay. Cyfeirir ato yn aml yng Nghymru, ond nid yw wedi ei ailadrodd yn iawn yma eto. Ar ôl 10 mlynedd o integreiddio a chyfuno cyllidebau yn Torbay, cafwyd canlyniadau hynod o bositif. Nododd dadansoddiad Cronfa'r Brenin fod y nifer gyfartalog ddyddiol o welyau ysbty llawn wedi gostwng o 750 yn 1998 i 502 yn 2009. Bu gostyngiad o 24% yn y defnydd o welyau argyfwng yn ystod y dydd ar gyfer pobl 75 oed a throsodd rhwng 2003 a 2008. Nodwyd bod hyn i gyd wedi digwydd gan arbed £250,000 yn y flwyddyn gyntaf o weithredu.

Mae Bil Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol a Lles (Cymru) yn rhoi pwerau i Weinidogion gyfuno cyllidebau, ond credaf y gallai Llywodraeth Cymru fod yn fwy dewr a defnyddio'r ddeddfwriaeth hon i integreiddio iechyd a gwasanaethau cymdeithasol yn llawn yng Nghymru o'r diwedd. Yn ein gwaith craffu diweddar ar y ddeddfwriaeth hon ar gyfer y pwyllgor iechyd, roedd llywodraeth leol yn gofyn am gyfarwyddyd cliriach gan Lywodraeth Cymru ar integreiddio, ond mae Llywodraeth Cymru, hyd yn hyn, yn eistedd ar y ffens, gan ddymuno cael y pwerau ond heb fwriad polisi clir.

Mae'n amserol, felly, yn fy marn i, i ofyn i'r comisiwn ar lywodraethu gwasanaethau cyhoeddus ystyried y mater hwn. Rwy'n falch i'r Prif Weinidog gadarnhau parodrwydd i wneud hynny ddoe. Mae'r Alban yn edrych ar ddarn annibynnol o ddeddfwriaeth i integreiddio iechyd a gofal cymdeithasol. Gallai Llywodraeth Cymru hefyd ystyried edrych eto ar y Bil gwasanaethau cymdeithasol presennol a chael gwared ar y pwerau ad hoc i wneud rheoliadau i gyflwyno deddfwriaeth annibynnol i integreiddio'r ddau wasanaeth hyn yn llawn mewn modd cydlynol a gofalus.

Wrth gwrs, wrth ystyried integreiddio'r GIG a gofal cymdeithasol i oedolion, bydd rhaid i'r comisiwn ddelio'n syth â'r cwestiwn o oruchwyliaeth ddemocrataidd unrhyw drefniant ar y cyd newydd. Er enghraifft, pe byddai cyfrifoldebau gofal cymdeithasol i oedolion yn cael eu trosglwyddo i fyrddau iechyd lleol, pwy fyddai'n gyfrifol am ddarparu trosolwg democratig o'r trefniadau newydd?

Ar hyn o bryd, mae gan fyrddau iechyd lleol un cynghorydd i bob bwrdd, a benodwyd gan y Gweinidog, ochr yn ochr â phawb arall a benodir i'r byrddau hynny. Dylem ystyried cryfhau cyfreithlondeb democrataidd y byrddau iechyd, yn enwedig os byddant yn dod yn fyrddau iechyd a chymdeithasol lleol. Gallem ystyried cynnal etholiadau uniongyrchol ar yr un pryd ag etholiadau llywodraeth leol neu fodel tebycach i awdurdod tân neu awdurdod parc cenedlaethol, lle mae cynghorwyr sydd eisoes wedi'u hethol yn cael eu hethol gan eu cynghorau i ymuno â'r bwrdd.

In Scotland, direct elections have already been set up in two pilot areas. There were direct elections to NHS Dumfries and Galloway and NHS Fife health boards in June 2010. The Health Boards (Membership and Elections) (Scotland) Act 2009, which set up those pilot areas, also set out on a statutory basis that there must be at least one councillor member per local authority on each health board and that elected members would form the majority of board members. That contrasts starkly with the Welsh situation currently, where there is only one councillor member on a health board.

Yn ogystal â democratiddio'r byrddau iechyd, mae cwestiwn hefyd yn codi am atebolrwydd democrataidd y cyngorau iechyd cymuned. Mae aelodau cyngorau iechyd hefyd yn cael eu hapwyntio gan Lywodraeth Cymru. Mae gwendidau'r gyfundrefn hon wedi cael eu hamlygu yn y gorllewin yn ddiweddar, yn fy marn i. Mae'r cyngor iechyd a'r bwrdd iechyd, y ddau wedi'u hapwyntio gan y Gweinidog, yn anghytuno ar gynlluniau Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Hywel Dda, gyda hyd yn oed bygythiadau o gamau cyfreithiol yn erbyn aelodau o'r cyngor iechyd gan un o gontractwyr y bwrdd iechyd, sef Opinion Research Services.

Mae angen annibyniaeth barn ar y cyngorau iechyd a'r hawl i gael barn wahanol i'r bwrdd iechyd. Byddai mandad democrataidd etholiadol yn fodd i sicrhau hynny. Gellir edrych ar ethol aelodau o'r cyngor iechyd drwy fodel gwahanol—model o etholiadau o ddefnyddwyr y gwasanaeth iechyd yn lleol. Efallai y gallai'r etholiadau lleol hyd yn oed ddigwydd mewn meddygyfeydd dros gyfnod o amser, ar fodel tebyg i etholiadau i gwmnïau cydweithredol neu gymdeithasau adeiladu.

Gorffennaf drwy gyfeirio at atebolrwydd ariannol y byrddau iechyd. Mae dros £5 biliwn o gyllideb y Llywodraeth yn mynd i'r byrddau iechyd mewn un 'budget line' blyneddol ac mae eu hanallu fel byrddau iechyd i gadw o fewn eu cyllideb yn hysbys i ni gyd erbyn hyn. Barn Plaid Cymru yw bod eisiau cryfhau ac agor i fyny'r sgrwtini ariannol o'r byrddau iechyd. Mae Pwyllgor Cyllid y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol yn gyfrwng i wneud hynny ac mae hynny'n gynnwysedig yn ein cynnig y prynhawn yma.

Mae gan Lywodraeth Cymru, felly, y cyfle yn awr i integreiddio gwasanaethau gofal ac iechyd i greu gwasanaeth sy'n rhoi blaenoriaeth i ofnion y claf ac nid gofynion y gwahanol sefydliadau. Hefyd, mae ganddi'r cyfle i gyflwyno atebolrwydd democrataidd uniongyrchol i'r gwasanaethau iechyd a chymdeithasol. Gobeithio y bydd Llywodraeth Cymru yn cymryd y cyfleoedd hyn heddiw.

Yn yr Alban, mae etholiadau uniongyrchol eisoes wedi eu rhoi ar waith mewn dwy ardal beilot. Cynhaliwyd etholiadau uniongyrchol ar gyfer byrddau iechyd y GIG Dumfries a Galloway a Fife ym mis Mehefin 2010. Roedd Deddf Byrddau Iechyd (Aelodaeth ac Etholiadau) (Yr Alban) 2009, a sefydlodd yr ardaloedd peilot hyn, hefyd wedi nodi, ar sail statudol, bod yn rhaid cael o leiaf un cynghorydd o bob awdurdod lleol ar bob bwrdd iechyd ac y byddai'r rhan fwyaf o aelodau'r byrddau yn aelodau etholedig. Mae hynny'n gwbl groes i'r sefyllfa yng Nghymru ar hyn o bryd, lle mai dim ond un o aelodau byrddau iechyd sy'n gynghorydd.

In addition to the democratisation of the health boards, a question also arises in relation to the democratic accountability of community health councils. Members of the health councils are also appointed by the Welsh Government. The weaknesses of this system have been highlighted in west Wales recently, in my opinion. The health council and the health board, both appointed by the Minister, disagree on Hywel Dda Local Health Board's proposals, with threats of legal action, even, against members of the health council by one of the health board contractors, namely Opinion Research Services.

We need independence of opinion on the health councils and the right to have a different opinion to the health board. A democratic, electoral mandate would be a means of ensuring that. We could look at electing members of the health council via a different model—a model of elections of users of the health service locally. Perhaps the local elections could even be held in GP surgeries over a period of time, in a model similar to elections to co-operative companies or building societies.

I will conclude by referring to the financial accountability of health boards. Over £5 billion of the Government's budget goes to the health boards in one annual budget line and their inability to keep within their budget is well known to us all by now. Plaid Cymru's view is that we need to strengthen and open up financial scrutiny of the health boards. The Finance Committee of the National Assembly is a means to do that and that is included in our motion this afternoon.

The Welsh Government, therefore, has an opportunity to integrate care and health services to create a service that prioritises the needs of the patient, not the needs of the various organisations. Also, it has an opportunity to introduce direct democratic accountability into health and social services. I hope that the Welsh Government will take these opportunities today.

I move amendments 1, 2, 5 and 6 in the name of William Graham.

I am very grateful to Plaid Cymru for bringing this debate forward today. There was some complaint about our drafting in the previous debate, and we had some concerns about Plaid Cymru's drafting in this debate, hence some of our amendments. That said, we are discussing an important issue, and we are very keen to see some of these ideas being developed further. With a commission on public service governance being established, we agree that there is an opportunity for that body to consider some of the issues that are being raised by Plaid Cymru.

However, we ought to say that, when it comes to issues such as NHS finance, it is not just the National Assembly that might have a role in the scrutiny of local health boards' financial arrangements, although there is a need for more clarity for Assembly Members to hold health boards to account. We ought, perhaps, to look at the scrutiny functions of local authorities as well, and whether they might be able to add some value, especially given their role in the provision of social services and the impact that the way that a health board spends its resources can have on social services departments; that is why we have tabled amendment 2.

Cynigiaf welliannau 1, 2, 5 a 6 yn enw William Graham.

Rwy'n ddiolchgar iawn i Blaid Cymru am gyflwyno'r ddatl hon heddiw. Roedd rhywfaint o gwyno am ein drafftio yn y ddatl flaenorol, ac roedd gennym rai pryderon am ddrafft Plaid Cymru yn y ddatl hon, sy'n egluro rhai o'n gwelliannau. Wedi dweud hynny, rydym yn trafod mater pwysig, ac rydym yn awyddus iawn i weld rhai o'r syniadau hyn yn cael eu datblygu ymhellach. Gyda chamau i sefydlu comisiwn ar lywodraethu gwasanaethau cyhoeddus, cytunwn fod cyfle i'r corff hwnnw ystyried rhai o'r materion sy'n cael eu codi gan Blaid Cymru.

Fodd bynnag, dylem ddweud, pan ddaw i faterion megis cyllid y GIG, nad dim ond y Cynulliad Cenedlaethol a allai chwarae rôl i graffu ar drefniadau ariannol byrddau iechyd lleol, er bod angen mwy o eglurder i Aelodau'r Cynulliad ddal byrddau iechyd i gyfrif. Dylem, efallai, edrych ar swyddogaethau craffu awdurdodau lleol hefyd, ac a allent ychwanegu rhywfaint o werth, yn enwedig o ystyried eu rôl o ran darparu gwasanaethau cymdeithasol a'r effaith y gall y ffordd y mae bwrdd iechyd yn gwario ei adnoddau ei chael ar adrannau gwasanaethau cymdeithasol; dyna pam yr ydym wedi cyflwyno gwelliant 2.

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Our amendment 5 is all about transparency. It is not just Assembly Members or councillors who ought to be able to access clear information on NHS spending; we think that members of the public and those who use the NHS ought to be able to see these data being very clearly displayed. There is no reason, in our minds, as to why the NHS should not be able to publish fully online details of all of its expenditure—as many local authorities do in England and, indeed, as Monmouthshire County Council is able to do in Wales—so that the whole army of armchair auditors that is out there and willing to trawl through this information can have a look at it to see where health boards might be able to save money and to put forward proposals to them to do precisely that.

We also think that there is a role, perhaps, for third sector organisations—those that work, very often, in partnership with the NHS in terms of service delivery—in the accountability arrangements of local health boards. That is the rationale behind our amendment 6, and I hope that people will support it.

The situation in north and west Wales has underscored the democratic deficit that exists in decision-making in the Welsh NHS. It is important that we get to grips with this issue and restore some public confidence in decision-making in our national health service. I have never known that confidence to be quite so low, frankly. The way in which consultations have been handled in north and west Wales, and the way that the outcomes of those consultations have been disregarded by decision-makers in local health boards, with no-one to whom to appeal about it—previous Ministers in this Assembly said that it was a matter for local health boards and not for them—has been very disappointing. We have to get on top of that somehow. I think that direct elections to health boards may give us a potential solution to that democratic deficit. We will, therefore, be supporting the thrust of the Plaid Cymru proposals today so that they are considered by the commission. I look forward to the other contributions to this debate.

I move amendment 4 in the name of Aled Roberts.

I welcome the opportunity to have this debate, which I think seeks to focus a part of the commission on public service governance's work on addressing democratic accountability within the NHS. That is viable and it certainly chimes with the point that I made to the First Minister when he made the statement on this yesterday. We support the substance of the motion. However, we hope that, in considering direct elections to health boards, the commission will also look at alternative models of local democratic accountability, including an enhanced role for local authorities. The crux of the commission's work is to look at public service delivery. Our largest public services are health and social care services, and the point has already been well made by both the previous speakers about the interaction between those and how we need better joint working between them. As well as looking at how the board that delivers this is elected, we need to consider the entire structure for governance. An enlarged local council having control over public health and primary and community healthcare, for example, could remove the artificial barrier between health and social care and enable more efficient delivery of those vital services, as well as introducing that element of accountability that is missing at the moment.

Our amendment seeks to address the recent experience with reconfiguration proposals, which has shown a real public disconnect over health board changes. Different community health councils have shown vastly different methods of consultation and different levels of success in engaging with the public. At the crux of this issue is training and leadership. We need to make sure that those engaged in the process have the training needed to fulfil what can often be a complex role. However, it is also about appointing those with the skillset required to lead an effective consultation process. The differing success of CHCs in consulting over reconfiguration proposals can be reflected in the differing approaches taken by those leading that process. The adoption of a standard specification of skills, experience and aptitude for CHC executive committee members would ensure that those members are well-equipped to navigate the raft of guidance that exists on effective engagement and consultation on changes to health services. It would ensure that executive committee members have the skills needed to be strong representatives on behalf of local committees and to make the difficult decisions that are often necessary in championing the voice of the community, and would, in turn, enhance the patients' voice and improve accountability and public confidence in decision-making.

Mae ein gwelliant yn ceisio mynd i'r afael â'r profiad diweddar gyda chynigion ad-drefnu, sydd wedi dangos datgysylltiad cyhoeddus gwirioneddol o ran newidiadau i fyrddau iechyd. Mae cynghorau iechyd cymuned gwahanol wedi dangos dulliau gwahanol iawn o ymgynghori a lefelau gwahanol o lwyddiant wrth ymgysylltu â'r cyhoedd. Wrth wraidd y mater hwn mae hyfforddiant ac arweinyddiaeth. Mae angen inni wneud yn siŵr bod y rhai sy'n cymryd rhan yn y broses yn cael yr hyfforddiant sydd ei angen arnynt i ymgymryd â'r rôl hon sy'n aml yn gallu bod yn gymhleth. Fodd bynnag, mae hefyd yn ymwneud â phenodi'r rhai sydd â'r set sgiliau sydd ei hangen i arwain proses ymgynghori effeithiol. Caiff llwyddiant amrywiol y cynghorau iechyd cymuned wrth ymgynghori ynghylch cynigion ad-drefnu ei adlewyrchu yn y dulliau gweithredu gwahanol a ddefnyddir gan y rhai sy'n arwain y broses honno. Byddai mabwysiadu manyleb safonol o sgiliau, profiad a dawn ar gyfer aelodau pwyllgorau gweithredol cynghorau iechyd cymuned yn sicrhau bod gan yr aelodau hynny yr adnoddau i ddelio â'r llu o ganllawiau sy'n bodoli ar ymgysylltu ac ymgynghori'n effeithiol ar newidiadau i wasanaethau iechyd. Byddai'n sicrhau bod gan aelodau pwyllgorau gweithredol y sgiliau sydd eu hangen i fod yn gynrychiolwyr cryf ar ran pwyllgorau lleol ac i wneud y penderfyniadau anodd sydd eu hangen yn aml i hyrwyddo llais y gymuned, a fyddai, yn ei dro, yn rhoi mwy o lais i gleifion ac yn gwella atebolrwydd a hyder y cyhoedd mewn prosesau gwneud penderfyniadau.

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We must also look at the process used for consulting on all public service reforms. This process is something that the commission could consider. Within health, for example, we have NHS guidance for engagement in consultation on changes to health services, as well as requirements within the National Health Service (Wales) Act 2006 and the Community Health Councils (Constitution, Membership and Procedures) (Wales) Regulations 2010. Despite this, patients still feel that they have not had their voice heard on NHS changes. The Welsh Government's own 2006 'Making the Connections' report states that putting citizens first and involving them in the design of public services is central to achieving radical change. Instead, we have seen a lack of trust between local people and health boards that will continue, without proper engagement and accountability.

We also repeat our call for the Welsh Government to look to Scotland, where national standards for community engagement were introduced in May 2005, together with a dedicated website to support its public sector organisations in developing, implementing and evaluating public engagement activity. The standards are measurable performance statements that can be used by everyone in community engagement to improve the quality and process of the engagement. They set out key principles, behaviours and practical measures that underpin effective engagement, and they can apply to both informal and formal community engagement. The standards were developed from the experience of communities and agencies with the extensive participation of over 500 community and agency representatives. They were endorsed by the Scottish Executive, the Convention of Scottish Local Authorities, Scottish Enterprise, Highlands and Islands Enterprise, NHS Health Scotland, the Association of Chief Police Officers in Scotland and many others. That is the model of leadership that we need in Wales to build back trust and create a better working relationship between citizens and the public sector, if we are to ensure that the views of the public are properly taken into account in the future decisions about our NHS.

Today's motion needs to be used as the basis for that sort of discussion. How can we democratise our local decision-making in the NHS and how can we improve consultation and engagement with the public on vital changes that need to be made? I hope that the Minister can take those on board.

Today's debate is about accountability in the NHS. It is about how we can make sure that those who make decisions that affect our health are held accountable for those choices.

Rhaid inni hefyd edrych ar y broses a ddefnyddir i ymgynghori ar yr holl ddiwygiadau i wasanaethau cyhoeddus. Mae'r broses hon yn rhywbeth y gallai'r comisiwn ei ystyried. O fewn iechyd, er enghraifft, mae gennym ganllawiau'r GIG ar gymryd rhan mewn ymgynghoriad ar newidiadau i wasanaethau iechyd, yn ogystal â gofynion Deddf Gwasanaeth Iechyd Gwladol (Cymru) 2006 a Rheoliadau Cyngorau Iechyd Cymuned (Cyfansoddiad, Aelodaeth a Gweithdrefnau) (Cymru) 2010. Er gwaethaf hyn, mae cleifion yn dal i deimlo nad yw eu llais wedi cael ei glywed ar newidiadau i'r GIG. Mae adroddiad Llywodraeth Cymru ei hun, sef 'Creu'r Cysylltiadau' 2006, yn nodi bod rhoi dinasyddion yn gyntaf a'u cynnwys yn y broses o gynllunio gwasanaethau cyhoeddus yn ganolog i gyflawni newid radical. Yn lle hynny, rydym wedi gweld diffyg ymddiriedaeth rhwng pobl leol a byrddau iechyd a fydd yn parhau, os na cheir ymgysylltu ac atebolrwydd priodol.

Ailadroddwn hefyd ein galwad i Lywodraeth Cymru edrych ar yr Alban, lle cafodd safonau cenedlaethol ar gyfer ymgysylltu â'r gymuned eu cyflwyno ym mis Mai 2005, ynghyd â gwefan bwrpasol i helpu ei sefydliadau sector cyhoeddus i ddatblygu, gweithredu a gwerthuso gweithgarwch ymgysylltu â'r cyhoedd. Mae'r safonau yn ddatganiadau perfformiad mesuradwy y gall pawb eu defnyddio wrth ymgysylltu â'r gymuned er mwyn gwella ansawdd a phroses y gwaith ymgysylltu hwnnw. Maent yn nodi egwyddorion allweddol, ymddygiadau a mesurau ymarferol sy'n sail i ymgysylltu effeithiol, a gellir eu cymhwyso i waith ymgysylltu anffurfiol a ffurfiol â'r gymuned. Cafodd y safonau eu datblygu o brofiad cymunedau ac asiantaethau gyda chyfraniad sylweddol dros 500 o gynrychiolwyr cymunedol ac asiantaethol. Cawsant eu cymeradwyo gan Weithrediaeth yr Alban, Confensiwn Awdurdodau Lleol yr Alban, Scottish Enterprise, Highlands and Islands Enterprise, NHS Health Scotland, Cymdeithas Prif Swyddogion yr Heddlu yn yr Alban a llawer o rai eraill. Dyna'r model o arweinyddiaeth sydd ei angen arnom yng Nghymru i adfer ymddiriedaeth a chreu gwell perthynas waith rhwng dinasyddion a'r sector cyhoeddus, er mwyn sicrhau bod barn y cyhoedd yn cael ei hystyried yn briodol yn y penderfyniadau a wneir am ein GIG yn y dyfodol.

Mae angen defnyddio cynnig heddiw fel sail i'r math hwnnw o drafodaeth. Sut y gallwn ddemocratiddio ein penderfyniadau lleol yn y GIG a sut y gallwn wella dulliau ymgynghori ac ymgysylltu â'r cyhoedd ynghylch newidiadau hollbwysig y mae angen eu gwneud? Gobeithiaf y gall y Gweinidog ystyried y rhain.

Mae dadl heddiw yn ymwneud ag atebolrwydd yn y GIG. Mae'n ymwneud â sut y gallwn wneud yn siŵr bod y rhai sy'n gwneud penderfyniadau sy'n effeithio ar ein hiechyd yn cael eu dwyn i gyfrif am y dewisiadau hynny.

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On many occasions, I have asked questions of the First Minister, and of various Ministers for health, about the services that are provided in their name. Often, the answer is that the decision is in the hands of the local health board and will be scrutinised by the community health council. However, the First Minister and the Minister for health cannot answer my questions because of the possibility that they may be required to make a judgment on that policy at a later date.

Try explaining all of that to your constituents. The situation comes across as Kafkaesque. The Government sets out a policy through guidelines. The Government appoints members of the local health boards. The health boards follow this policy through, while the Government claims that the health board is acting of its own free will. Often, then, the local Assembly Member or Member of Parliament of the same party as the Government pops up to oppose those changes, unless the decision is popular locally, when the Government and the said local politicians will then want to take the credit. None of this is easy to explain to people as democracy.

In a blog last month by the Bevan Foundation, the structure of local health boards was criticised and questions were asked. Are members more attached to the organisation than to their patients? Are the members free to properly scrutinise and challenge decisions? Is accountability driven by cash not care? Those are questions that must be addressed.

The current debate regarding the removal of accident and emergency services in my home valley of the Rhondda, the poor accessibility of GP services and the persistent failures of the ambulance service lay bare this lack of accountability. My home county of Rhondda Cynon Taf had the lowest figures in Wales, with just 42% of ambulances arriving within their target time. The figures were low across the Valleys, which is, of course, an area where the hospitals face the removal of accident and emergency services. Cwm Taf has the lowest percentage of GP practices that are open for core hours. The inspections of the two hospitals in Cwm Taf are among the worst in Wales when it comes to the quality of patient care. These are communities where chronic conditions and poverty is high, where car ownership is low and public transport is unreliable. Yet, health board bosses still think that it is acceptable to make proposals that will take services, such as A&E, further away from people's homes.

Who makes these decisions? Most people do not know, and I suspect that the Welsh Government likes it that way. Most people are confused. We need more people taking an interest in being engaged in local service provision, not fewer. As Plaid Cymru has said on many occasions, there must be a clear line of sight for accountability in the decision making process, and service users need to be able to have their say—on ambulances, services and staffing.

Ar sawl achlysur, rwyf wedi gofyn cwestiynau i'r Prif Weinidog, ac amryw o Weinidogion iechyd, am y gwasanaethau sy'n cael eu darparu yn eu henw. Yn aml, yr ateb yw bod y penderfyniad yn nwylo'r bwrdd iechyd lleol ac y bydd y cyngor iechyd cymuned yn craffu arno. Fodd bynnag, ni all y Prif Weinidog a'r Gweinidog iechyd ateb fy nghwestiynau oherwydd y posibilrwydd y gallai fod angen iddynt fynegi barn ar y polisi hwnnw yn nes ymlaen.

Ceisiwch egluro hynny i gyd i'ch etholwyr. Mae'r sefyllfa yn ymddangos fel un Kafkaesg. Mae'r Llywodraeth yn gosod polisi drwy ganllawiau. Mae'r Llywodraeth yn penodi aelodau o'r byrddau iechyd lleol. Mae'r byrddau iechyd yn rhoi'r polisi hwn ar waith, tra bod y Llywodraeth yn honni bod y bwrdd iechyd yn gweithredu o'i wirfodd. Yn aml, felly, bydd yr Aelod Cynulliad lleol neu Aelod Seneddol o'r un blaid â'r Llywodraeth yn ymddangos i wrthwynebu'r newidiadau hynny, oni bai bod y penderfyniad yn boblogaidd yn lleol, ac y bydd y Llywodraeth a'r gwleidyddion lleol dan sylw yn awyddus i gymryd y clod. Nid yw'n hawdd egluro i bobl mai democratiaeth yw hyn.

Mewn blog y mis diwethaf gan Sefydliad Bevan, beirniadwyd strwythur y byrddau iechyd lleol a gofynnwyd cwestiynau. A oes gan yr aelodau fwy o gysylltiad â'r sefydliad na'u haelodau? A yw'r aelodau'n rhydd i graffu ar benderfyniadau a'u herio'n briodol? A gaiff atebolrwydd ei ysgogi gan arian nid gofal? Dyna'r cwestiynau y mae'n rhaid eu hateb.

Mae'r ddadl bresennol ynghylch cael gwared ar wasanaethau damweiniau ac achosion brys yng nghwm Rhondda, lle rwy'n byw, gwasanaethau meddygon teulu sy'n anodd cael gafael arnynt a methiannau parhaus y gwasanaeth ambiwlans yn amlygu'r diffyg atebolrwydd hwn. Rhondda Cynon Taf, y sir lle rwy'n byw, oedd â'r ffigurau isaf yng Nghymru, gyda dim ond 42% o ambiwlansys yn cyrraedd o fewn eu hamser targed. Roedd y ffigurau yn isel ar draws y Cymoedd, sydd, wrth gwrs, yn ardal lle mae'r ysbytai yn wynebu colli eu gwasanaethau damweiniau ac achosion brys. Cwm Taf sydd â'r ganran isaf o bractisau meddygon teulu sydd ar agor yn ystod yr oriau craidd. Dengys arolygiadau o'r ddau ysbyty yng Nghwm Taf eu bod ymhlith y gwaethaf yng Nghymru o ran ansawdd y gofal i gleifion. Mae'r rhain yn gymunedau lle mae lefelau uchel o gyflyrau cronig a thlodi, lle mae lefelau perchenogaeth car yn isel a thrafnidiaeth gyhoeddus yn annibynadwy. Eto i gyd, mae penaethiaid y bwrdd iechyd yn dal i gredu ei bod yn dderbyniol gwneud cynigion a fydd yn mynd â gwasanaethau, megis adrannau damweiniau ac achosion brys, ymhellach i ffwrdd oddi wrth gartrefi pobl.

Pwy sy'n gwneud y penderfyniadau hyn? Nid yw'r rhan fwyaf o bobl yn gwybod, ac rwy'n amau bod Llywodraeth Cymru yn hoffi hynny. Mae'r rhan fwyaf o bobl yn teimlo dryswch. Mae arnom angen gweld mwy o bobl yn cymryd diddordeb yn y gwasanaethau lleol a ddarperir, nid llai. Fel mae Plaid Cymru wedi'i ddweud ar sawl achlysur, rhaid cael llwybr atebolrwydd dir yn y broses gwneud penderfyniadau, ac mae angen i ddefnyddwyr gwasanaethau allu dweud eu dweud—ar ambiwlansys, gwasanaethau a staffio.



Health boards spend more than £5 billion of public money. That is over a third of the Welsh budget. We must increase the democratisation of the Welsh NHS. We have heard a number of suggestions this afternoon from Elin Jones on direct elections for local health boards, learning from experience in Scotland so that health boards better reflect the communities they serve, and patient elections for community health councils. It is important that community health councils reflect local opinion and that LHBs are accountable to the wider public. Therefore, I hope that after today's debate, the Government will consider adopting these proposals and that it will agree to begin discussions with Elin Jones along these lines. Diolch yn fawr.

I am glad to have the opportunity to contribute to this debate this afternoon, following yesterday's statement by the First Minister on the commission.

I am pleased that the Welsh Government is taking a proactive stance in examining the accountability and performance of public services—not just one of them; we need to look at them all. As the First Minister said, this leads clearly on from our manifesto and Welsh Labour's programme for government. It directly reflects the importance that we in Welsh Labour place on high-quality, sustainable public services. We focus on protecting our most vulnerable and helping those most in need, which cannot be said for all parties. We all recognise—from the people on the streets of Llanelli to Members of the Assembly—that the current financial situation is difficult and that there are rising expectations of public services. The solution is not market led, hence the creation of an independent commission.

Turning to the debate today, I am glad that Plaid Cymru yesterday welcomed several aspects of the commission's focus and remit. As has been firmly established by now, reconfiguring the boundaries of local health boards will not be under consideration by the commission. It is vital to note, however, that it is only the structure of LHBs that are outside the commission's remit, because that current structure is fresh. The commission will have the remit to examine their governance, role and performance and to determine their relationship with other public services, particularly those run by local authorities, and particularly social services. I welcome that this is an independent commission, with membership from all parties, including Plaid Cymru. It is for the commission to consider all or any issues and NHS accountability within its remit. It has been set up to fulfil that role. I, for one, will await its findings with interest and, in the meantime, I do not wish to pre-empt its findings before it starts on its work.

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Rwy'n falch o gael y cyfle i gyfrannu at y ddadl hon y prynhawn yma, yn sgîl y datganiad ddoe gan y Prif Weinidog ar y comisiwn.

Rwy'n falch bod Llywodraeth Cymru yn cymryd safiad rhagweithiol wrth edrych ar atebolrwydd a pherfformiad gwasanaethau cyhoeddus—nid dim ond un ohonynt; mae angen inni edrych ar bob un ohonynt. Fel y dywedodd y Prif Weinidog, mae hyn yn arwain ymlaen yn glir o'n maniffesto a rhaglen lywodraethu Llafur Cymru. Mae'n adlewyrchu'n uniongyrchol y pwys yr ydym yn ei roi yn Llafur Cymru ar wasanaethau cyhoeddus cynaliadwy, o ansawdd uchel. Rydym yn canolbwyntio ar ddiogelu'r rhai sydd fwyaf agored i niwed a helpu'r rheini sydd fwyaf mewn angen, rhywbeth na ellir ei ddweud am bob parti. Rydym i gyd yn cydnabod—o bobl ar strydoedd Llanelli i Aelodau'r Cynulliad—bod y sefyllfa ariannol bresennol yn anodd a bod yr hyn a ddisgwylir gan wasanaethau cyhoeddus yn cynyddu. Ni chaiff yr ateb ei lywio gan y farchnad, a dyna pam y sefydlwyd comisiwn annibynnol.

Gan droi at y ddadl heddiw, rwy'n falch bod Plaid Cymru ddoe wedi croesawu sawl agwedd ar ffocws a chylch gwaith y comisiwn. Fel sydd wedi'i sefydlu'n gadarn erbyn hyn, ni fydd y comisiwn yn ystyried y mater o ad-drefnu ffiniau'r byrddau iechyd lleol. Mae'n hollbwysig nodi, fodd bynnag, mai dim ond strwythur y BILLau sydd y tu allan i gylch gwaith y comisiwn, oherwydd bod y strwythur presennol yn newydd. Bydd gan y comisiwn y pŵer i archwilio eu trefniadau llywodraethu, eu rôl a'u pherfformiad ac i benderfynu ar eu cydberthynas â gwasanaethau cyhoeddus eraill, yn enwedig y rhai a gaiff eu rhedeg gan awdurdodau lleol, ac yn enwedig y gwasanaethau cymdeithasol. Croesawaf y ffaith bod hwn yn gomisiwn annibynnol, gydag aelodau o bob plaid, gan gynnwys Plaid Cymru. Gall y comisiwn benderfynu ystyried pob un neu rai o'r materion ac atebolrwydd y GIG sy'n rhan o'i gylch gwaith. Cafodd ei sefydlu i gyflawni'r rôl honno. Arhosaf yn eiddgar am ei ganfyddiadau ac, yn y cyfamser, nid wyf yn dymuno achub y blaen ar ei ganfyddiadau cyn iddo ddechrau ar ei waith.

Rwyf am ganolbwyntio fy sylwadau i yn y ddaid hon y prynhawn yma ar gynllun peilot sydd wedi cael ei gynnal yn yr Alban sydd wedi edrych ar dreialu dulliau amgen i dderbyn aelodau i fyrddau iechyd yn y fan honno. Bwriad Senedd yr Alban wrth basio'r Ddeddf ynglŷn ag aelodaeth ac etholiadau byrddau iechyd yn 2009 oedd cynyddu atebolrwydd lleol ac i fynd i'r afael â'r canfyddiad o'r diffyg democrataidd yr ydym wedi clywed sôn amdano heddiw, o ran byrddau iechyd a oedd yn cynnwys aelodau a oedd wedi eu penodi i'r byrddau hynny.

Fel rhan o'r cynllun peilot, cynhaliodd dau fwrdd iechyd, sef Dumfries a Galloway, a Fife, etholiadau er mwyn ethol 10 a 12 o aelodau. Aeth dau fwrdd arall ati, sef Grampian a Lothian i archwilio ffyrdd newydd o recriwtio a dethol aelodau newydd a oedd yn cael eu penodi ar gyfer aelodaeth y byrddau hynny. Mae'r gwerthusiad o'r cynllun peilot yn dangos ei bod yn bosibl i gynnal etholiadau uniongyrchol yn llwyddiannus ar gyfer byrddau iechyd yn y gwasanaeth iechyd.

O'u profiad nhw, roedd aelodau o'r cyhoedd yn barod iawn i sefyll mewn niferoedd sylweddol. Yn gyffredinol, roedd y rhai oedd yn sefyll yn dangos nodweddion tebyg i'r rhai a benodwyd o dan y system bresennol. Hynny yw, yr oeddent yn ganol oed neu'n hŷn, yn ddynion yn bennaf, yn wyn ac yn broffesiynol. Fodd bynnag, ymhlith y rhai oedd yn cael eu hethol, cafwyd cydbwysedd cyffredinol rhwng y rhywiâu. Mae'n ymddangos hefyd, mewn rhai achosion, fod y rhesymau dros sefyll mewn etholiadau yn wahanol i'r rhai sy'n ysgogi pobl sy'n ceisio cael eu penodi i fwrdd. Yn benodol, roedd nifer o ymgeiswyr etholiadol, gan gynnwys rhai a oedd yn llwyddiannus, yn cael eu gyrru yn glir gan faterion lleol, dadleuol—er enghraifft, cynlluniau i gau ysbytai neu drosglwyddo gwasanaethau. Roedd hyn, yn ei dro, fel y gallwch ddychmygu, yn cael effaith ar y modd yr oedd busnes y bwrdd iechyd yn cael ei gynnal. Fodd bynnag, nid oedd gwaith y bwrdd yn cael ei lesteirio gan yr aelodau etholedig hyn, ac mae'r gwerthusiad a gyhoeddwyd llynedd yn dweud:

'There was a strong sense that the new members who were elected to the Board quickly developed a commitment to keep the Board operating effectively, even if they had not necessarily approved of all the Board's decisions in the past.'

Yn un o'r byrddau etholedig, roedd cynnal pleidleisiau ar faterion yn dod yn fwy cyffredin, ac roedd yr aelodau yn fwy tebygol o ofyn i'w cyfraniad nhw i drafodaethau a'u hanghytundeb mewn trafodaethau hefyd i gael ei nodi yn y cofnodion, a byddai eu barn nhw hefyd yn fwy tebygol nag o'r blaen o ganfod ei ffordd i mewn i'r wasg. Roedd hynny, yn ei dro, yn codi ymwybyddiaeth y cyhoedd o'r trafodaethau a oedd yn digwydd o fewn y byrddau iechyd hynny. Mewn cymhariaeth, roedd effaith y cynlluniau peilot eraill, sef y rhai oedd yn dal i benodi ond mewn dulliau amgen, dipyn yn fwy cynnil, o bosibl am fod y niferoedd a oedd yn cael eu penodi yn y dulliau hynny dipyn yn llai na'r rhai oedd yn cael eu hethol.

I would like to focus my comments in this debate this afternoon on a pilot scheme that has been conducted in Scotland, which has looked at trialling alternative ways of selecting members to health boards there. The intention of the Scottish Parliament in passing the Health Boards (Membership and Elections) (Scotland) Act 2009 was to increase local accountability and to get to grips with the perception of a lack of democracy, which we have heard so much about today, in relation to health boards whose members were appointed.

As part of the pilot scheme, two health boards, namely Dumfries and Galloway, and Fife, held elections in order to elect 10 and 12 members respectively. Two other health boards, namely Grampian and Lothian, looked at new ways of recruiting and selecting new members who were to be appointed as members of those boards. The evaluation of the pilot scheme demonstrates that it is possible to hold direct elections successfully for health boards in the health service.

From their experience, members of the public were more than happy to stand in significant numbers. In general, those who stood for election showed characteristics similar to those appointed under the present system. That is, they were middle-aged or older, predominantly male, white professionals. However, among those who were elected, there was a general balance between the genders. It also appears that, in certain cases, the reasons for standing for election differ from those that motivate people seeking to be appointed to a board. Specifically, many candidates in elections, including some who were successful, were clearly driven by local, contentious issues, such as plans to close hospitals or to transfer services. This, in turn, as you can imagine, had an impact on the way in which the health board's business was conducted. However, the work of the board was not hampered by these elected members, and the evaluation published last year states:

Roedd yna ymdeimlad cryf bod yr aelodau newydd a etholwyd i'r Bwrdd wedi datblygu'n gyflym ymrwymiad i sicrhau bod y Bwrdd yn parhau i weithredu'n effeithiol, hyd yn oed os nad oeddent o reidrwydd wedi cymeradwyo holl benderfyniadau'r Bwrdd yn y gorfennol.

In one of the elected boards, holding votes on issues became more common, and members were more likely to ask for their contributions to discussions and disagreement in discussions also to be recorded in the minutes, and their opinion was also more likely than was the case in the past to find its way into the press. That, in turn, raised public awareness of the discussions happening within the health boards. By comparison, the effect of the other pilot schemes, namely those where members were still appointed, but by alternative methods, was considerably more subtle, perhaps because the numbers being appointed using those methods were significantly lower than those who were elected.

Manteision y system bresennol yw bod pobl yn deall y system, mae'n gymharol rad ac mae'n caniatáu dewis unigolion yn seiliedig ar sgiliau penodol. Fodd bynnag, mae'n rhaid cydnabod ei bod yn cael ei hystyried yn ddifffygol o ran atebolrwydd lleol a'i bod yn gyfrifol am greu byrddau iechyd nad ydynt mewn gwirionedd yn gynrychioladol o ran demograffeg.

Mae'r cynlluniau peilot yn yr Alban wedi dangos ffyrdd amgen posibl i fynd i'r afael â nifer o wendidau yn y system bresennol. Yn benodol, mae hyn yn cynnwys mabwysiadu proses recriwtio ehangach sy'n ei gwneud yn glir fod croeso arbennig i ddiddordeb gan y rhai sy'n draddodiadol wedi eu tangynrychioli ar ffyrddau iechyd. Byddai hyn, yn sicr, yn rhywbeth i'w groesawu.

Mae gan etholiadau uniongyrchol fanteision ac anfanteision. Mae'r gost yn ystyriaeth bwysig, er bod ymchwil yn yr Alban yn dadlau bod y gost yn gymharol fach o'i chymharu â chyllideb y gwasanaeth iechyd yn ei chyfanrwydd. Fodd bynnag, mae etholiadau yn mynd i'r afael yn uniongyrchol â materion o ran democratiaeth ac atebolrwydd lleol, felly mae ganddynt y potensial i newid y ffordd y mae byrddau iechyd yn gweithredu. Mae'r cynlluniau peilot yn yr Alban wedi dangos bod etholiadau yn cynyddu lefel yr her i gadeiryddion a phrif weithredwyr byrddau iechyd ac yn cynyddu lefel yr her i'r Llywodraeth. Gall hynny ddim ond bod yn beth iach.

The benefits of the current system are that people understand the system, it is relatively cheap and it allows individuals to be selected based on specific skills. However, we must acknowledge that it is considered to be deficient in terms of local accountability and that it is responsible for producing health boards that are not truly representative in terms demography.

The pilot schemes in Scotland have demonstrated that there are possible alternatives that can get to grips with many of the deficiencies of the current system. These specifically include the adoption of a wider recruitment policy that makes it clear that there is a particular welcome for interest from those who have been under-represented on health boards traditionally. That is certainly something that should be welcomed.

Direct elections have benefits and disbenefits. Cost is an important consideration, although the research in Scotland would argue that the cost is relatively low in comparison with the budget of the health service in its entirety. However, elections do get to grips directly with issues of democracy and local accountability and therefore they have the potential to change the way that health boards operate. The pilot schemes in Scotland have demonstrated that elections increase the level of challenge to chairs and chief executives of health boards and increase the level of challenge to the Government. That can only be a healthy thing.

I am grateful for the opportunity to make a contribution to this debate. As Members have already referred during the debate, the issue of accountability in the NHS and community health councils is extremely relevant to my north Wales constituency. Betsi Cadwaladr University Local Health Board's recent consultation on hospital reconfiguration has been roundly criticised for its lack of transparency and openness with members of the public. There are discrepancies in the evidence used to justify its proposals, and officials from the health board have failed to declare an interest when discussing the transfer of neonatal services. The overwhelming public opposition to the proposals was effectively ignored, and the overall impression given in north Wales was that the health board was not being honest over its plans. It meant that patients and their families were not able to have their voices heard, and many people did not even know that the consultation was going on. There was no meaningful democratic accountability for these far-reaching changes.

Rwy'n ddiolchgar am y cyfle i gyfrannu at y ddatl hon. Fel y cyfeiriodd Aelodau ato eisoes yn ystod y ddatl, mae'r mater o atebolrwydd yn y GIG a chynghorau iechyd cymuned yn hynod berthnasol i fy etholaeth yn y gogledd. Cafodd ymgynghoriad diweddar Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Prifysgol Betsi Cadwaladr ar ad-drefnu ysbytai ei feirniadu'n hallt am beidio â bod yn ddigon tryloyw ac agored i aelodau o'r cyhoedd. Mae anghysondebau yn y dystiolaeth a ddefnyddiwyd i gyfiawnhau ei gynigion, ac mae swyddogion y bwrdd iechyd wedi methu â datgan buddiant wrth drafod y mater o drosglwyddo gwasanaethau newyddenedigol. Cafodd y gwrthwynebiad cyhoeddus ysgubol i'r cynigion ei anwybyddu i bob diben, a'r argraff gyffredinol yn y gogledd oedd nad oedd y bwrdd iechyd yn onest ynghylch ei gynlluniau. Roedd yn golygu nad oedd cleifion a'u teuluoedd wedi gallu rhoi eu barn, ac nid oedd llawer o bobl yn gwybod bod yr ymgynghoriad yn cael ei gynnal hyd yn oed. Nid oedd unrhyw atebolrwydd democrataidd ystyrlon ar gyfer y newidiadau pellgyrhaeddol hyn.

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There was particular concern about the way in which the community health council took its decision on whether or not to refer the plans to export level 3 neonatal services to England. That decision was taken by an executive committee and it did not go to council members. As an elected Member of this Assembly, I contacted the local community health council to ask for the contact details of all its members, which was refused. It was refused not only to me, but to many other Assembly Members. It is a basic right to be able to write to a community health council representative, and to know who those people are. If you are elected to a board like that, you ought to expect to receive correspondence from Assembly Members and other community representatives. That is a very clear example of the lack of accountability in north Wales.

Other questions have been asked about the objectivity of the former chair and other former employees of the health trust that were appointed to that council. Many people in north Wales—I have correspondence on this from constituents—do not believe that the community health council properly or appropriately reflected their views or properly considered the evidence that they were looking at.

The current proposals for changes to NHS services in north Wales and elsewhere have exposed how powerless ordinary members of the public feel when they seek to challenge the health board's decision. It is important that the calls made in the Assembly this week to broaden the remit of the committee—the quango—that was announced by the First Minister to look into governance are supported. I support the calls that it should look into more openness, transparency and accountability in health boards and community health councils in Wales. Without that democratic accountability, the health board is able to ride roughshod over the views of the people who use and value NHS services. There is a role for experts and clinicians, namely people with particular experience, to sit on the boards and on the health councils, but there needs to be far greater input from the local community.

The only other thing that I want to mention, in the 45 seconds left to me, is the importance of advocacy services, particularly for those with mental health issues. That role has not been included in the current Bill, and I hope that the Minister, who is sitting here listening to me now, will recognise that there is a real role that independent advocates can play in championing the interests of those who are vulnerable and unable, for various reasons, to state their case appropriately. Many thanks.

Roedd pryder arbennig ynghylch y modd y gwnaeth y cyngor iechyd cymuned ei benderfyniad ynghylch a ddylid cyfeirio'r cynlluniau i allforio gwasanaethau newyddenedigol lefel 3 i Loegr. Gwnaed y penderfyniad hwnnw gan bwyllgor gweithredol, ac ni chafodd ei ystyried gan aelodau'r cyngor. Fel Aelod etholedig o'r Cynulliad hwn, cysylltais â'r cyngor iechyd cymuned lleol i ofyn am fanylion cyswllt ei holl aelodau, ond gwrthodwyd fy nghais. Nid dim ond fy nghais i a gafodd ei wrthod, gwrthodwyd llawer o Aelodau eraill y Cynulliad. Mae'n hawl sylfaenol i allu ysgrifennu at gynrychiolydd cyngor iechyd cymuned, ac i wybod pwy yw'r bobl hynny. Os cechw eich ethol i fwrdd fel hwn, dylech ddisgwyl cael gohebiaeth gan Aelodau'r Cynulliad a chynrychiolwyr cymunedol eraill. Mae honno'n enghraifft glir iawn o'r diffyg atebolrwydd yn y gogledd.

Gofynnwyd cwestiynau eraill am wrthrychedd y cyn-gadeirydd a chyn-weithwyr eraill yr ymddiriedolaeth iechyd a benodwyd i'r cyngor hwnnw. Mae llawer o bobl yn y gogledd—mae gennyf ohebiaeth ar hyn gan etholwyr—o'r farn nad oedd y cyngor iechyd cymuned wedi adlewyrchu eu barn yn gywir ac yn briodol nac wedi ystyried y dystiolaeth roeddent yn edrych arni'n briodol.

Mae'r cynigion presennol ar gyfer newidiadau i wasanaethau'r GIG yn y gogledd ac mewn mannau eraill wedi tynnu sylw at ba mor ddi-rym y mae aelodau cyffredin o'r cyhoedd yn teimlo pan fyddant yn ceisio herio penderfyniad y bwrdd iechyd. Mae'n bwysig bod y galwadau a wnaed yn y Cynulliad yr wythnos hon i ehangu cylch gwaith y pwyllgor—y cwango—a gyhoeddwyd gan y Prif Weinidog i edrych ar lywodraethu yn cael eu cefnogi. Cefnogaf y galwadau y dylai edrych ar wneud byrddau iechyd a chynghorau iechyd cymuned yng Nghymru yn fwy agored, yn fwy tryloyw ac yn fwy atebol. Heb yr atebolrwydd democrataidd hwnnw, gall y bwrdd iechyd anwybyddu barn y bobl sy'n defnyddio ac yn gwerthfawrogi gwasanaethau'r GIG. Mae rôl i arbenigwyr a chlinigwyr, sef pobl â phrofiad penodol, i'w chwarae fel aelodau o'r byrddau a'r cynghorau iechyd, ond mae angen llawer mwy o fewnbwn gan y gymuned leol.

Yr unig beth arall yr wyf am sôn amdano, yn y 45 eiliad sydd ar ôl imi, yw pwysigrwydd gwasanaethau eirioli, yn enwedig ar gyfer y rheini â phroblemau iechyd meddwl. Nid yw'r rôl honno wedi'i chynnwys yn y Bil presennol, a gobeithiaf y bydd y Gweinidog, sy'n eistedd yma yn gwrandao arnaf nawr, yn cydnabod y gall eiriolwyr annibynnol chwarae rôl wirioneddol wrth hyrwyddo buddiannau'r rhai sy'n agored i niwed ac sy'n methu, am wahanol resymau, gyflwyno eu hachos yn briodol. Diolch yn fawr.

The NHS is keeping us busy as Assembly Members, and there seems to be no end of consultations to respond to. I am extremely grateful for the huge amount of input to and engagement with these consultations that we have seen from the public, especially in my area. Anyone who says that apathy rules clearly has not paid a visit to South Wales West, where concern for effective and well-delivered public services is almost overwhelming. I attended a public meeting, as I said last week in a debate, in Pontardawe, which was held as part of the consultation over the proposed closure of Gellinudd Hospital. Abertawe Bro Morgannwg LHB's top brass turned out in force, which was just as well, as the arts centre was packed to the rafters. The questions came thick and fast, but there was one from one member of the audience that cut to the chase. He asked, 'Why, when there are ambulances queued outside Morriston A&E on a regular basis, does the LHB want to close this hospital?' ABMU's representatives replied, 'We're not here to discuss Morriston; we're here to discuss Gellinudd only'. Herein lies the problem for patients, their families, community organisations, AMs and anyone else who wants to look at the wider picture.

At present, health services are subject to two reorganisations, namely Changing for the Better and the South Wales Programme. The former contains mostly pledges to review services and put forward individual proposals, like those related to Gellinudd and Cimla hospitals, thus circumventing any opposition to its direction of travel by making the overall process too vague to object to and then splintering it into pieces that will not allow it to be connected. With the latter reorganisation, not even the clinicians leading the programme have ratified their decisions, yet we are dealing with hospital closures. Whichever way you want to look at it, it is very difficult to object effectively to what is happening to NHS services in South Wales West and elsewhere in Wales. People are rightly cynical and angry. Every time people come to speak to me they ask, 'What is the point in our taking part in this consultation when a decision has already been made?' To be frank, this is further compounded by a technocratic management class that discusses the NHS in terms that are unintelligible to most service users. Indeed, who but us and that class would consider themselves service users and not patients? If LHBs are serious about engagement, and they profess endlessly that they are, they must communicate their proposals in plain English and Welsh, and to not do so further contributes to the exclusion of the patient from service decisions.

The control of information does the same thing. When I complained to ABMU that the withdrawal of one service had been sprung on me without prior notice, I got the reply, 'We'll try to keep you informed in the future'—they would 'try', not that they 'would' keep me informed in the future. This is not a ringing affirmation of that particular health board. If I am having difficulty getting any information out of the health board, what does that say about how people in my area will fare?

Mae'r GIG yn ein cadw'n brysur fel Aelodau'r Cynulliad, ac mae'n ymddangos nad oes diwedd ar yr ymgynghoriadau y mae angen ymateb iddynt. Rwy'n hynod o ddiolchgar am holl fewnbwn a diddordeb y cyhoedd mewn perthynas â'r ymgynghoriadau hyn, yn enwedig yn fy ardal i. Mae'n amlwg nad yw'r rhai sy'n dweud bod difaterwch yn drech wedi ymweld â gorllewin de Cymru, lle mae'r pryder am wasanaethau cyhoeddus effeithiol a gaiff eu cyflenwi'n dda bron yn anorchfygol. Bûm mewn cyfarfod cyhoeddus, fel y dywedais yr wythnos diwethaf mewn dadl, ym Mhontardawe, a gynhaliwyd fel rhan o'r ymgynghoriad ar y bwriad i gau Ysbyty Gellinudd. Roedd prif swyddogion BILL Abertawe Bro Morgannwg yno yn llw, a da oedd hynny, gan fod y ganolfan gelfyddydau yn llawn i'r ymylon. Gofynnwyd llawer o gwestiynau un ar ôl y llall, ond gofynnodd un aelod o'r gynulleidfa gwestiwn a aeth at wraidd y mater yn syth. Gofynnodd, 'Pam mae'r BILL am gau'r ysbyty hwn, pan fo ambiwlansys yn ciwio y tu allan i adran damweiniau ac achosion brys Treforys yn rheolaidd?' Ateb cynrychiolwyr Prifysgol Abertawe Bro Morgannwg oedd, 'Nid ydym ni yma i drafod Treforys; rydym ni yma i drafod Gellinudd yn unig'. Dyna wraidd y broblem i gleifion, eu teuluoedd, sefydliadau cymunedol, Aelodau'r Cynulliad ac unrhyw un arall sy'n dymuno edrych ar y darlun ehangach.

Ar hyn o bryd, mae gwasanaethau iechyd yn destun dau gynllun ad-drefnu, sef Newid er Gwell a Rhaglen De Cymru. Mae'r cyntaf yn cynnwys yn bennaf addewidion i adolygu gwasanaethau a chyflwyno cynigion unigol, fel y rhai sy'n gysylltiedig ag ysbytai Cimla a Gellinudd, gan osgoi unrhyw wrthwynebiad i'w gyfeiriad teithio drwy wneud y broses gyffredinol yn rhy amwys i'w gwrthwynebu ac yna ei rhannu'n ddarnau a fydd yn golygu na ellir ei chysylltu. Gyda'r ail gynllun ad-drefnu, nid yw hyd yn oed y dinigwyr sy'n arwain y rhaglen wedi cadarnhau eu penderfyniadau, ond eto i gyd rydym yn delio â chau ysbytai. Pa bynnag ffordd yr hoffech ystyried y peth, mae'n anodd iawn i wrthwynebu'n effeithiol yr hyn sy'n digwydd i wasanaethau'r GIG yng ngorllewin de Cymru ac mewn mannau eraill yng Nghymru. Mae pobl, yn gywir ddigon, yn sinigaidd ac yn ddi. Bob tro y bydd pobl yn dod i siarad â mi, maent yn gofyn, 'Beth yw'r pwynt cymryd rhan yn yr ymgynghoriad hwn pan fydd y penderfyniad eisoes wedi ei wneud?' I fod yn onest, caiff y sefyllfa hon ei gwaethygu ymhellach gan ddsbarth rheoli technocratig sy'n trafod y GIG mewn termau sy'n annealladwy i'r rhan fwyaf o ddefnyddwyr gwasanaethau. Yn wir, pwy ond y ni a'r dosbarth hwnnw fyddai'n ystyried eu hunain yn ddefnyddwyr gwasanaethau ac nid cleifion? Os yw'r BILLau o ddirif am ymgysylltu, ac maent yn datgan yn ddiddiwedd eu bod, rhaid iddynt gyfathrebu eu cynigion mewn Cymraeg a Saesneg clir, ac mae peidio â gwneud hynny'n arwain at eithrio'r claf ymhellach o benderfyniadau ar wasanaethau.

Mae rheoli gwybodaeth yn gwneud yr un peth. Pan gwynais wrth Brifysgol Abertawe Bro Morgannwg fod un gwasanaeth wedi cael ei dynnu'n ôl heb rybudd ymlaen llaw, yr ateb a gefais oedd, 'Byddwn yn ceisio rhoi gwybod ichi yn y dyfodol'—byddent yn 'ceisio', nid y 'byddent' yn rhoi gwybod imi yn y dyfodol. Nid yw hyn yn rhoi darlun cadarnhaol o'r bwrdd iechyd hwnnw. Os ydw i'n ei chael hi'n anodd cael gwybodaeth gan y bwrdd iechyd, beth mae hynny'n ei ddweud am brofiad pobl yn fy ardal?

If the Welsh Government will not listen to my colleague Elin Jones's proposals, as set out in this debate, can it please accept more political accountability for what is going on in the service? I would like to throw in my own idea, and I know that Plaid Cymru has put this in our manifesto as well as other ideas about the democratic process in Wales. There is such a thing as a public lottery, which Canada uses quite often to consult people, using the electoral roll to encourage people from different groups to take part in public consultations. I would urge the Minister to consider this particular idea—and also the ideas put forward by Elin Jones—which is very successful in Canada.

People in my region are anxious, because their health services are changing and because they wonder, in all seriousness, whether their views have any impact on the decisions that change them. No-one is saying that they cannot be changed, but the Welsh Government can take real steps here to make everyone feel involved and empowered in the decisions that are taken forward.

*Y Gweinidog Iechyd a Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol / The Minister for Health and Social Services*

I am pleased to respond to an interesting—if eclectic—motion, tabled by Plaid Cymru, this afternoon. I will dispose, at the outset, with the most puzzling element—its final leg. When I first read it, I tried to imagine the reaction of my former colleague Simon Thomas in the engine room of the One Wales Government had he been faced with a motion calling, for example, for Government aid to industry, transport funding, or money dispersed to support the rural economy to be made accountable not to the relevant Minister but directly to a committee of the National Assembly, no matter how well led or distinguished. The more that I thought of that reaction, the more surprised I became that this particular leg of the motion had somehow evaded the censor and made its way onto the agenda. You now need to have been associated with the National Assembly for quite a long time to be able to recall those far off days of the corporate body, when lines of accountability were as confused as they are in this part of the motion. The 2006 Act put paid to all of that, and there really is no going back. The separation between the parliament and the executive was supported across the National Assembly in that period, and for very good reason.

Of course, relevant committees of the Assembly can take an interest—

I am obviously aware of that argument, and I have been part of it myself. It is absolutely right that NHS and health board expenditure should be directly accountable to the National Assembly, but that is through the Minister. That is why we will vote to delete the final proposition of the motion this afternoon.

November's police and crime commissioner elections were a sobering experience for anyone who went out on the doorstep in an attempt to persuade our fellow citizens that this was an election in which they should take part—

Personally, I think that there are many ways in which participation in elections could be driven up, both ours and any others. I remain utterly frustrated—but I will not share that with all of you this afternoon—at the way in which we continue to conduct our own elections on a day and in a method devised to suit half-day closures among late Victorian shopkeepers. So, there are plenty of ways in which we could drive up participation, and it will now be for the commission to think of that. It will also be important to think carefully about the way in which any such elections might be devised. I do not think that it is fanciful to suggest that LHB and CHC elections might be vulnerable, unless carefully designed, to capture by relatively small, but well organised and resourced, groups of a very particular persuasion. We will all know of groups that believe, for example, that abortion services ought not be provided by the NHS. There have been groups opposed to the provision of services to treat HIV and AIDS among gay people, and there are even parties that stand for mainstream elections that believe that the NHS ought not to provide treatment to people whose skin is of a different colour to their own.

When we devise elections, if that is what we are to have, we will need to be sure that in any system in which we aim to have greater representativeness and accountability, we can guard against it being captured by those who have a very different purpose and whose aim is to subvert a process for themselves, rather than to open it up to wider participation. I recognise that the motion does not seek to flesh out those debates directly; it very sensibly proposes simply that the possibility be addressed by the commission. A number of amendments go well beyond that, in attempting to lard a series of prescriptive detail—

No, it is not an argument against democracy. You will know that, in the place to which we are elected, there is a threshold in part of our election that is designed to prevent part of our electoral system being taken over by groups that, being well-organised, well-resourced and able to target very particular electorates, have a different sort of advantage and are therefore able to subvert the result, unless those elections are carefully thought through. That is my only point. Exactly that sort of thinking affects the way we are elected to this Chamber. It is nothing particular or unusual simply to suggest that those are important things to be thought through within the overall ambit of the motion, which I am happy to accept.

Na, nid dadl yn erbyn democratiaeth mohoni. Gwyddoch, yn y lle y cawn ein hethol iddo, fod trothwy yn perthyn i ran o'n hetholiad a gynlluniwyd i atal rhan o'n system etholiadol rhag cael ei chipio gan grwpiau sydd, oherwydd eu bod yn drefnus, eu bod yn gallu targedu etholwyr penodol iawn a bod ganddynt ddigon o adnoddau, â math gwahanol o fantais ac felly'n gallu gwyrddo'r canlyniad, oni bai bod yr etholiadau hynny'n cael eu hystyried yn ofalus. 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We will support the final amendment in the name of William Graham, which usefully draws attention to the role of the third sector in ensuring that the voice of the user is heard in making the NHS accountable to the populations it serves. We will not be able to support amendments 1, 2, 4 and 5.

There is one further aspect of the original motion that remains to be addressed: consideration of the democratic oversight of joint working and pooled budget arrangements. This is perhaps a more immediate issue than some other aspects under discussion today. We expect greater joint working and greater use of pooled budgets in the future. The Social Services and Well-being (Wales) Bill takes powers to strengthen partnership across the interface between health and local authorities. This does have governance implications. It is not that we are without models for cross-boundary working, and none of the models that we have already escapes the democratic gaze, but the level of accountability varies between them. Making this part of the consideration of the commission is a useful way of providing attention to this increasingly prominent area of public policy.

I end by returning to the statement made here by the First Minister yesterday. He made it clear that, while the structure and boundaries of LHBs is not within the remit of the commission, the role of the NHS and its performance and interaction with other services is very much within scope, as now is the possibility of direct elections. That said, we cannot afford to let the commission get drawn into considering piecemeal reforms in isolation. Instead, the commission will need to consider issues of democracy and accountability in the round, and, if there is a case for more direct accountability for the NHS, to make that case in the context of the accountability of public services as a whole. As that now happens, this is the second debate today that will have served a useful purpose.

Croesawaf yn fawr y rhan fwyaf o'r cyfraniadau'r prynhawn yma—bron y cyfan, a dweud y gwir. Croesawaf y frawddeg olaf yng nghyfraniad Mark Drakeford, y Gweinidog. Mae'n drueni na ddechreuodd â'r frawddeg honno, oherwydd rwy'n credu iddo, yn ystod ei gyfraniad, osgoi'r cyfan o'r pwnc rydym yn ceisio ei godi yn y ddatl hon o ddemocrateiddio'r system iechyd, i'w gwneud yn ddealladwy ac yn dderbyniol i bobl sy'n defnyddio'r gwasanaeth. Dyna'r peth pwysig: os nad yw pobl yn deall y system, os nad ydynt yn credu ei bod yn dryloyw, os nad ydynt yn gwybod pwy sy'n gwneud y penderfyniadau nac yn teimlo bod y bobl hynny'n atebol iddynt, ni fydd ganddynt ffydd yn y gwasanaethau hynny.

I warmly welcome most of this afternoon's contributions—nearly all, to be honest. I welcome the last sentence in the contribution of Mark Drakeford, the Minister. It is a pity that he did not open his speech with that sentence, because I think that his contribution avoided the whole point that we are trying to make in this debate, of democratising the health system, making it more understandable and acceptable to service users. That is the important point: if people do not understand the system, if they do not believe it to be transparent, if they do not know who is making the decisions or feel that those people are accountable to them, they will not have faith in those systems.

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Rhaid dweud fy mod yn synnu, braidd, iddo ddweud nad oedd gan y cyhoedd yn gyffredinol yr un brwdfrydedd â gwleidyddion am y prosesau hyn. Yn ei chyfraniad hi, dangosodd Bethan Jenkins yn glir bod diddordeb enfawr yn ei hardal hi yn y drafodaeth ynglŷn â gwasanaethau yn y fan honno. Gallaf ategu hynny yng nghyd-destun fy ardal i a Bwrdd Iechyd Lleol Hywel Dda. Roedd diddordeb enfawr yn y penderfyniadau, ac roedd dicter gwirioneddol gan bobl nad oedd y system yn un dryloyw.

I must say that I was a bit surprised that he said that the general public do not have the same enthusiasm as politicians for these processes. In her contribution, Bethan Jenkins clearly demonstrated that there was huge interest in her area in the debate about services there. I can say that the same is true of my area and the Hywel Dda Local Health Board. There was huge interest in the decisions, and people felt real anger that the system was not transparent.

Wrth agor y ddatl, dangosodd Elin Jones yn glir iawn mai'r hyn rydym yn ceisio ei wneud yn y ddatl hon yw sicrhau bod gwasanaethau, yn y lle cyntaf, wedi eu hintegreiddio, a bod cleifion yn derbyn y gwasanaeth sy'n fwyaf priodol ar eu cyfer. Gofynnodd pwy yn union sy'n goruchwyllo'r ddarpariaeth hon o ran gwasanaethau iechyd a gwasanaethau cymdeithasol. Sut y mae'r oruchwyliaeth honno yn cael ei chyflawni? Y cwestiwn mawr yw: a yw pobl yn ymddiried yn y broses honno?

In opening the debate, Elin Jones showed very clearly that what we are trying to do in this debate is, first of all, ensure that services are integrated, and that patients receive the most appropriate service. She asked who exactly is responsible for oversight of that provision in terms of health services and social services. How is that oversight carried out? The big question is: do people have trust in that process?

Darren Millar welcomed our motion, and I am pleased to say—for the first time, I think—that I cannot fault his contribution. To be honest, I was a bit worried that he seemed to be agreeing with us on everything. He focused on scrutiny and accountability and on ensuring that people understand that that process is taking place.

Os yw hynny'n wir yn y gogledd—ac mae llawer ohonom yn teimlo bod hynny yn cael ei adlewyrchu mewn rhannau eraill o Gymru—nid oes modd inni gynnal gwasanaeth iechyd os nad yw pobl yn teimlo bod eu llais a'u barn yn cael gwrandawriad ac ystyriaeth lawn. Dyna'r darlun a grëwyd i ni gan Bethan Jenkins—o bobl frwdfrydig yn wirioneddol eisiau cael trafodaeth synhwyrol ac aeddfed am wasanaethau, ac yn teimlo bod eu barn yn cael ei hanwybyddu. Rwy'n mawr obeithio y bydd yr elfen hon o ddemocratiaeth o fewn y gwasanaeth iechyd ac atebolrwydd i bobl Cymru o fewn y gwasanaeth iechyd yn cael gwrandawriad teg ac y gallwn symud ymlaen i'r cyfeiriad hwn.

Peter Black focused on the lack of consistency in the response of community health councils to health board proposals, which illustrates the fundamental weakness in that process. Leanne Wood raised the issue of the relationship between the Government and the health boards that it appoints, asking who ultimately takes responsibility. I say to the Minister that I will accept his argument and that I will not oppose his amendment—I will not support it, but I will not oppose it—but what I would say is that our great hope when he accepted this post was that he, as Minister, would accept responsibility for what happens in the health service. We are still waiting for that to happen.

Keith Davies mentioned the commission that was announced yesterday by the First Minister. We are all looking forward to seeing what will happen with that commission. I think that we all accept that there is a need to take a detailed look at Wales's public services, and at how those services can most effectively be provided. Llyr Huws Gruffydd talked about the pilot scheme in Scotland—I am not sure whether or not the Minister was listening—which is demonstrating that people can be elected to community health councils and to health boards. That system has been implemented in Scotland with very encouraging results. We definitely need to give that some consideration.

Antoinette Sandbach focused on the situation that has developed in north Wales, on the Betsi Cadwaladr health board response, on how she thought people had been disappointed and disillusioned by that process and on the frustration that people felt that their voices were not being listened to. If that is true in north Wales—and many of us feel that that is mirrored in other parts of Wales—we cannot maintain a health service if people feel that their voices and their opinions are not given a fair hearing and consideration. My experience with Hywel Dda health board was that people did not feel that their views were given a fair hearing.

That is the picture drawn by Bethan Jenkins—of enthusiastic people who genuinely want to sensibly and maturely discuss services, but who felt that their views were ignored. I sincerely hope that this element of democracy within the NHS and the accountability to the people of Wales for the NHS does get a fair hearing and that we can move on in the right direction.

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This motion is about placing pupils at the heart of the school improvement programme. We have said before, while recognising the efforts of the Government, that for too long much of the debate has centred on the structures and processes within education, but to raise standards, we feel that we need to put pupils first.

We have all heard on many occasions that, in general, poorer pupils tend to underperform when measured against their more affluent peers. That matter was again discussed by the Children and Young People Committee this morning when considering our forward work programme. It was highlighted in the recent Estyn annual report, which says:

'Schools with high proportions of pupils entitled to free schools meals tend not to perform as well as those with pupils from more advantaged backgrounds, but there are schools that are exceptions.'

The gap in foundation phase indicator attainment figures between those who are on free school meals and those who are not currently stands at 18.3 percentage points and there is a gap of 16.5 percentage points in language, literacy and communication skills. The current system does not prevent all pupils from being properly supported, but neither does it stop some pupils falling through gaps in provision that may or may not or should have been in place.

In this year's Estyn annual report, the chief inspector states:

'In a significant minority of primary schools, more able pupils do not make enough progress.'

The banding system, in our opinion, categorises schools, not pupils. It perhaps focuses too much on overall results, rather than on the experiences, achievements and outcomes for individuals. Children are individuals. We might never achieve equality of outcomes, but we can certainly achieve equality of opportunity.

The crux of this motion is about putting in place a system that enables every pupil to reach their full potential. We need to ensure that a system is set up in each school to assess how well pupils are doing compared to where they should be, rather than, as I have unfortunately experienced, for there to be attempts in certain schools to push those who are on the margins of grades C and D above grade C to ensure that the statistics look good. Such programmes are in place in some schools. That was reported in the Ofsted report in England in February. We have also heard that certain provisions will be made as the Minister develops progress on the pupil deprivation grant to ensure that a similar situation arises in Wales.

For too long, the debate in Wales has been around five A\* to C and we have concentrated our efforts on seeing that as a measure of success, rather than ensuring that pupils of all abilities achieve as much as they can expect. We believe, and this is the reason why we have introduced this motion, that we need to change that approach so that we concentrate on pupils and change the system to best suit them.

Along with Simon Thomas and Julie Morgan, last week, I attended the Westminster policy forum in Cardiff, where one speaker asked,

'Do we measure what we value or value what we measure?'

At the moment, I believe there is a danger that we are following the latter course, and that is why we have decided to bring this motion to the Siambr today. It is certainly the case that there needs to be evaluation, but I think that we are in danger, in comparison with England, where more resources have been provided for pupils from deprived backgrounds compared to the figure that we are seeing in Wales. It is not only a case of resources; it is the way that those resources are used. We think that there is a need to put down a marker in the sand where we have had concerns over many years regarding the quantity of education spend in Wales compared to other countries.

We need to measure whether schools are matching the expectations that they properly set for the pupils, for the wellbeing of both the schools and the pupils. I am sure that, given the Minister's commitment to the school banding system, that it will be with us for some time, but I would like to think that there is scope for it to be adapted and improved, perhaps by using a more pupil-centred approach. I hope the Minister will not close his mind to such improvements for the future, even if he might not be willing to accept that today.

At the same policy forum last week, Dr Brett Pugh said that, in Wales, we 'need to increase our ambition.' I think we should increase pupils' ambitions. The issue that we have is whether our schools are being ambitious enough for all their pupils of all abilities and backgrounds. When enthusiastic and interested youngsters are being fully encouraged to reach their potential, the benefits can be enormous, and I urge Members to support this motion.

I move amendments 1, 3, 5, 8 and 9 in the name of William Graham.

Presiding Officer, I am glad that you were on the ball there, because I got quite confused. I will talk to all my amendments because I think that this is such an important debate that has been brought forward by the Liberal Democrats. There is nothing more important than our children and making sure that they reach the levels of aspiration that they seek for themselves and that we need for our country. However, I have to say that the motion is a curate's egg. There are bits of it that are good and bits that are less so. There are bits that I like and bits that I do not like; hence our amendments.

In amendment 1, we have been fairly pedantic, I suppose, but we felt that it was important to insert 'regardless of background or ability' after the word 'pupil' in the first part of the motion. We spend a lot of time focusing on the bar for students from poorer or less-able backgrounds. However, we have already seen that the statistics for those not in education, employment and training have remained stubbornly high. While we think that it is right to ensure that those pupils have every advantage, we also fear that the direction of travel and the mood music is constantly talking about one element of our education system. This was just a check and a balance and a reminder that we have an awful lot of pupils in Wales and we must concentrate on ensuring that every individual has the ability to reach the best that they can achieve, no matter how capable they are and no matter what kind of background they come from.

That brings me neatly on to amendment 3. We wish to delete point 3 of the motion. You know that we have a philosophical difference of opinion on the use of the pupil deprivation grant. However, again, I object here, in some ways, to the word 'affluent'. There are not that many affluent pupils in Wales and there are an awful lot of average pupils, sitting there in the middle, who need that encouragement and support. I think that there are a great many children who we do not pay enough attention to because they come from dysfunctional homes. They have emotional baggage, because they are not being supported by their parents in a home environment. Do you know what? It does not always mean that they come from a very poor home.

The phrase is 'more affluent'. It is a relative measure; it is not just 'affluent'.

This is about ensuring that we do not just say that all the focus is on the people who we can see in an obvious measure, such as, say, Communities First, for example. There are an awful lot of people from very poor backgrounds whose children are absolutely stellar and do very well. Therefore, it is about taking some of the pejoratives out of this.

We think that that ties in with the Welsh Government's individual learning plans. I know that they are not altogether developed yet, but I believe that the Government is developing them and I am content to support its direction of travel on that. We do not need yet another system of some sort. I would like to see a way of gauging progress, but it is important that we let what is in train to come to fruition, because it is terribly easy to keep chopping and changing and to have chaos throughout the land. We have to stop that.

Credwn fod hynny'n cyd-fynd â chynlluniau dysgu unigol Llywodraeth Cymru. Gwn nad yw wedi gorffen eu datblygu eto, ond credaf fod y Llywodraeth wrthi'n eu datblygu ac rwy'n fodlon ei chefnogi yn hynny o beth. Nid oes angen rhyw system arall eto arnom. I note the comment that you would like to target the efforts of those pupils who are not meeting their potential. It contradicts our amendment for us, because, again, we have this belief that if we are not careful, we might end up with a neglected middle starting to fail.

I would like to look at 4b), where you ask for a substantial increase in funding for the pupil deprivation grant. I will not go into too much detail about why I think that the pupil deprivation grant was a device to bring you on board for the budget. It is much more important to wait for the analysis that is coming and then, if it has worked, I will be prepared to say, 'We got it wrong, and we will help you with it'. However, we spend a lot of money trying to support things without finding out if we are spending our money in the right place.

I am beginning to run out of time. On amendment 9, on the school banding performance, we do not think that the current school banding system is right. I am prepared to accept though, Minister, that it has mixed responses, and some people are beginning to point to good outcomes. Therefore, I would like to see a proper debate about how we might take that banding system and use far more clever criteria to make it accurate, such as an individual pupil assessment, rather than using this whole-school model based on free schools meals, where it is so easy, by 1 percentage point, to change a school from band 2 to band 4. It is about being more intelligent with it, if we can prove that it is bringing benefit.

Mae amser yn mynd yn brin. O ran gwelliant 9, ynglŷn â pherfformiad bandio ysgolion, ni chredwn fod y system bandio ysgolion bresennol yn iawn. Fodd bynnag, rwy'n barod i dderbyn, Weinidog, mai cymysg fu'r ymateb, a bod rhai pobl yn dechrau tynnu sylw at ganlyniadau da. What I really want to say today is how important I think it is that, on this particular aspect, we work together as much as possible as political parties. If we do not get this right now, we will be failing a generation of children who are already entering our school system. It is time for us to roll up our sleeves and admit that education has been completely devolved in Wales. We have the resources and the legislative framework. It is time to get on with the job.

Although I completely support the Government's three main priorities in this regard, namely raising education standards, improving literacy and numeracy and narrowing the attainment gap between advantaged and disadvantaged children, it is time to stop the new initiatives, stop the constant revolution, stop the 30 reviews that we have had since we were told that we would have no further initiatives, and to work together to try to deliver this stuff now. The most important one that we need to work to deliver is the new literacy and numeracy framework, now that it will be on a statutory footing from next year. We need to ensure that that does not miss the opportunities that, sadly, previous skills frameworks have missed—whether that was because they were not statutory is neither here nor there. The fact is that they failed, they did not deliver and we did not see an improvement. We cannot let that happen again.

In that spirit, I want to try to work in the spirit of what has been set out in the Liberal Democrat motion, what the Government is saying and even, a little bit, what the Conservatives are saying. We will certainly support amendment 1; pedantic or not, it is a correct amendment. We need to be absolutely clear that the decisions we take over the next few months, which will affect this programme for the rest of the Assembly, are based on evidence. That is why I am slightly reluctant with regard to what the Liberal Democrats are saying in the motion about the pupil deprivation grant. I would not oppose it, nor do I oppose any more money being put into the education system, but we need evidence from Estyn and others about the real effectiveness of this before we commit to using it as one of our main tools to shrink the attainment gap in Wales. I have seen evidence, and I have been more persuaded by the evidence that I have seen from others, including Estyn, but also Save the Children's poverty and attainment report, which shows that you need a mix of interventions to really address this and it needs to be personalised.

Er fy mod yn llwyr gefnogi tair prif flaenoriaeth y Llywodraeth yn hyn o beth, sef codi safonau addysg, gwella llythrennedd a rhifedd a lleihau'r bwch cyrhaeddiad rhwng plant breintiedig a difreintiedig, mae'n bryd rhoi'r gorau i gyflwyno mentrau newydd, atal y chwyldro di-baid, rhoi'r gorau i'r 30 o adolygiadau yr ydym wedi'u cynnal ers inni gael gwybod na fyddem yn gweld unrhyw fentrau pellach, a gweithio gyda'n gilydd i geisio cyflawni'r pethau hyn yn awr. Yr un pwysicaf y mae angen inni weithio i'w gyflawni'r yw'r fframwaith llythrennedd a rhifedd newydd, gan y bydd ar sail statudol o'r flwyddyn nesaf ymlaen. Yn yr ysbryd hwnnw, rwyf am geisio gweithio yn unol ag ysbryd yr hyn a nodwyd yng nghynnig y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol, yr hyn y mae'r Llywodraeth yn ei ddweud a hyd yn oed, yr hyn y mae'r Ceidwadwyr yn ei ddweud i ryw raddau. Byddwn yn sicr yn cefnogi gwelliant 1; pa un a yw'n bedantig ai peidio, mae'n welliant cywir. Mae angen inni fod yn gwbl glir bod y penderfyniadau a wnawn dros yr ychydig fisoedd nesaf, a fydd yn effeithio ar y rhaglen hon am weddill y Cynulliad, yn seiliedig ar dystiolaeth. Dyna pam rwyf braidd yn amharod o ran yr hyn a ddywed y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yn y cynnig am y grant amddifadedd disgyblion. Ni fyddwn yn ei wrthwynebu, ac nid wyf yn gwrthwynebu unrhyw ymgais i roi mwy o arian yn y system addysg, ond mae angen inni gael tystiolaeth gan Estyn ac eraill ynghylch effeithiolrwydd gwirioneddol hyn cyn inni ymrwymo i'w ddefnyddio fel un o'n prif ddulliau o leihau'r bwch o ran cyrhaeddiad yng Nghymru. Rwyf wedi gweld tystiolaeth, ac rwyf wedi cael fy narbwyllo'n fwy gan y dystiolaeth yr wyf wedi'i gweld gan eraill, gan gynnwys Estyn, ond hefyd adroddiad Achub y Plant ar dlodi a chyrhaeddiad, sy'n dangos bod angen cymysgedd o ymyriadau er mwyn mynd i'r afael â hyn mewn gwirionedd a bod angen personoli unrhyw ymyriadau.

In that regard, I completely accept what the Liberal Democrats have said in their motion today about the personalised element for each child, and I would point to what Ceredigion County Council does, which we also heard about in detail in the conference that Aled and I, and, I think, Angela, attended. Ceredigion council follows through individual pupils not just for reading and writing but for lots of areas of attainment, sees where they are slipping behind and where they could do much better, and then tailors the intervention to that pupil. The pupils who were doing really well within that were colour-coded blue and so were known as 'Smurfs'. Therefore, I hope that there will be many more Smurfs in Ceredigion following the introduction of that process.

It is a way of being able to inform how teachers deal with individual pupils, because they know, when they deal with that pupil, that pupil X is good at reading but a little bit behind mathematics and really good and advanced in some other aspects of wellbeing, and so then a package can be put together. I thought that was the way forward. Therefore, I certainly accept the spirit of what the Liberal Democrats are saying today. However, we need to see more evidence regarding intervention, such as working with parents and their skills, and interventions that deal directly with leadership in schools, which I think is still a missing piece of the jigsaw in Wales. We need more evidence of how we support children in moving from key stage 2 to key stage 3, particularly with regard to the loss that boys in particular tend to show in Wales over the summer period when they go from one stage to the other. That may require a review of the school year in Wales, in my opinion, and that is something that we can look at as we come to the Hill review, perhaps, and how we take that forward.

I was also very struck by evidence from Professor David Reynolds, as he has been saying this constantly, and the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development also made a contribution to the conference last week suggesting that it really is not about the size of resource that you put in. It is if you are talking about private education and having 10 pupils per class, but, really, we have the resource in Wales and so it is about how we use it, and we are not using it in a smart and effective way. The biggest change we can make going forward is to use it on the basis of evidence, and to use it to improve professionalism and skills in the classroom and to build leadership. If we do that, and if we get the evidence, then I will support what the Government is doing, I will support what the Liberal Democrats say and I will even support what the Conservatives say, because we need to work together on this issue.

Yn hynny o beth, rwyf yn llwyr dderbyn yr hyn a ddywedodd y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yn eu cynnig heddiw am yr elfen bersonol ar gyfer pob plentyn, a hoffwn gyfeirio at yr hyn y mae Cyngor Sir Ceredigion yn ei wneud, y cawsant fanylion amdano yn y gynhadledd a fynychwyd gan Aled a minnau, ac Angela, fe gredaf. Mae Cyngor Ceredigion yn dilyn hynt disgyblion unigol nid yn unig o ran darllen ac ysgrifennu, ond o ran sawl maes o gyrhaeddiad, yn gweld lle maent ar ei hôl hi a lle y gallent wneud llawer yn well, ac yna'n teilwra'r ymyriad i'r disgybl hwnnw. Cafodd y disgyblion a oedd yn gwneud yn dda iawn o fewn y system honno eu codio â'r lliw glas ar ffurf yn 'Smurfs'. Felly, gobeithiaf y bydd llawer mwy o Smurfs yng Ngheredigion yn sgil cyflwyno'r broses honno.

Mae'n ffordd o allu rhoi gwybod sut mae athrawon yn ymdrin â disgyblion unigol, oherwydd gwyddant, wrth ymdrin â'r disgybl hwnnw, fod disgybl X yn dda o ran darllen ond ychydig ar ei hôl hi o ran mathemateg ac yn cyflawni'n dda iawn mewn rhai agweddau eraill ar lesiant, ac felly, gellir llunfio pecyn. Roeddwn i'n meddwl mai dyna oedd y ffordd ymlaen. Felly, rwyf yn sicr yn derbyn ysbryd yr hyn y mae'r Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yn ei ddweud heddiw. Fodd bynnag, mae angen inni weld rhagor o dystiolaeth ynghylch ymyriadau, fel gweithio gyda rhieni a'u sgiliau, ac ymyriadau sy'n ymdrin yn uniongyrchol ag arweinyddiaeth mewn ysgolion, sef rhywbeth sydd ar goll yng Nghymru yn fy marn i. Mae angen inni gael mwy o dystiolaeth ynglŷn â sut rydym yn helpu plant wrth iddynt symud o gyfnod allweddol 2 i gyfnod allweddol 3, yn enwedig o ran y dirywiad yr ydym yn tueddu i'w weld ymhlith bechgyn yn arbennig yng Nghymru dros gyfnod yr haf pan fyddant yn mynd o un cyfnod i'r llall. Efallai y bydd hynny yn gofyn am adolygiad o'r fwyddyn ysgol yng Nghymru, yn fy marn i, ac mae hynny'n rhywbeth y gallwn edrych arno wrth inni ystyried adolygiad Hill, efallai, a sut rydym yn gweithredu ar hynny.

Roedd y dystiolaeth gan yr Athro David Reynolds hefyd wedi gwneud argraff fawr arnaf, gan ei fod wedi bod yn dweud hyn yn gyson, a gwnaeth y Sefydliad ar gyfer Cydweithrediad a Datblygiad Economaidd gyfraniad hefyd at y gynhadledd yr wythnos diwethaf gan awgrymu nad faint o adnoddau a ddarparwch sy'n bwysig. Mae hynny'n wir os ydych yn sôn am addysg breifat a chael 10 disgybl ymhob dosbarth, ond, mewn gwirionedd, mae gennym yr adnoddau yng Nghymru, ac felly mae'n ymwneud â'r ffordd yr ydym yn eu defnyddio, ac nid ydym yn eu defnyddio mewn ffordd ddeallus ac effeithiol. Y newid mwyaf y gallwn ei wneud yn y dyfodol yw eu defnyddio ar sail dystiolaeth, a'u defnyddio i wella proffesiynoldeb a sgiliau yn yr ystafell ddosbarth a meithrin sgiliau arweinyddiaeth. Os gwnawn hynny, ac os cawn y dystiolaeth, yna byddaf yn cefnogi'r hyn y mae'r Llywodraeth yn ei wneud, byddaf yn cefnogi'r hyn y mae'r Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yn ei ddweud a byddaf hyd yn oed yn cefnogi'r hyn y mae'r Ceidwadwyr yn ei ddweud, oherwydd mae angen inni gydweithio ar y mater hwn.

It might seem that it goes without saying that pupils are at the heart of the process, but I would have to argue that we hear far too much in places like this about processes and structures within education not enough about pupils developing as individuals. From that point of view, I welcome Simon Thomas's comments, because the purpose of monitoring regimes is to allow teachers to tailor the programme that they are delivering to the individual child, and to allow them to grow individually. The purpose of monitoring is not to put people in boxes, and in groups and categories. I therefore welcome Simon's comments, because this idea of a trajectory is crucial to the point that we are trying to make.

Turning to the amendments, we will support amendment 1 as it echoes the ethos of inclusivity and positivity in the motion. We will also support amendment 2 after the clarification from Simon Thomas that, in terms of educational bodies, we are talking about local education authorities, governing bodies, regional consortia and those school-related bodies that have the most direct input, because it is those local delivery bodies that have the most to say.

It will come as no surprise that we will not support amendment 3. It seems a little narrow-minded to not be supportive of a policy that you are helping to implement in England, perhaps simply because the motion welcomes the Welsh Government's commitment to analysing it. However, it is not as disappointing to me as the Welsh Government's amendment 4, which simply wipes away any positive ideas and does not replace them with anything substantive of its own. It would have been much more productive had the Government presented some ideas to enter into a debate on this subject.

I want to say more about the idea of monitoring pupil performance and our aims in this regard. Teachers in schools, who work directly with pupils, are the people best placed to understand and to implement a system that works in their organisations for the pupils that they get to know over a period of years. The last thing that we want to do is to create some kind of new bureaucracy for them to work within. What we are proposing centres on assessing individual performance throughout the school experience, identifying the potential and using targeted efforts to make sure that the end result for each individual pupil matches their long-term expectations. This is not about putting a group of schools into a number of bands and reviewing the bands on an annual basis; it is about recognising that schools have a mixture of pupil abilities, and that simply categorising a whole school can be not so helpful to allowing us to assess the outcomes for each individual pupil.

Efallai yr ymddengys nad oes angen dweud mai disgyblion sydd wrth wraidd y broses, ond rhaid dweud ein bod yn clywed llawer gormod mewn mannau fel hyn am brosesau a strwythurau yn y system addysg a dim digon am ddisgyblion yn datblygu fel unigolion. O'r safbwynt hwnnw, croesawaf sylwadau Simon Thomas, gan mai pwrpas cyfundrefnau monitro yw caniatáu i athrawon deilwra'r rhaglen y maent yn ei darparu i'r plentyn unigol, a chaniatáu iddynt dyfu'n unigol. Nid rhoi pobl mewn blychau, ac mewn grwpiau a chategorïau yw diben monitro. Felly, croesawaf sylwadau Simon, oherwydd mae'r syniad hwn o lwybr yn hollbwysig o ran y pwynt yr ydym yn ceisio ei wneud.

Gan droi at y gwelliannau, byddwn yn cefnogi gwelliant 1 gan ei fod yn adleisio ethos cynhwysol a chadarnhaol y cynnig. Byddwn hefyd yn cefnogi gwelliant 2 ar ôl eglurhad gan Simon Thomas, o ran cyrff addysgol, ein bod yn sôn am awdurdodau addysg lleol, cyrff llywodraethu, consortia rhanbarthol a'r cyrff hynny sy'n gysylltiedig ag ysgolion sy'n gwneud y cyfraniad mwyaf uniongyrchol gan mai'r cyrff cyflawni lleol hynny sydd â'r cyfraniad mwyaf i'w wneud.

Ni fydd yn syndod i neb na fyddwn yn cefnogi gwelliant 3. Ymddengys ychydig yn gul peidio â chefnogi polisi yr ydych yn helpu i'w weithredu yn Lloegr, efallai'n syml am fod y cynnig yn croesawu ymrwymiad Llywodraeth Cymru i'w ddadansoddi. Fodd bynnag, nid yw mor siomedig imi â gwelliant 4 Llywodraeth Cymru, sydd yn y bôn yn dileu unrhyw syniadau cadarnhaol ac nad yw'n cynnig unrhyw beth o sylwedd yn eu lle. Byddai wedi bod yn llawer mwy cynhyrchiol pe bai'r Llywodraeth wedi cyflwyno rhai syniadau er mwyn ymuno â dadl ar y pwnc hwn.

Hoffwn ddweud rhagor am y syniad o fonitro perfformiad disgyblion a'n hamcanion yn hyn o beth. Athrawon mewn ysgolion, sy'n gweithio'n uniongyrchol gyda disgyblion, yw'r bobl sydd yn y sefyllfa orau i ddeall a gweithredu system sy'n gweithio yn eu sefydliadau ar gyfer y disgyblion y maent yn dod i'w hadnabod dros gyfnod o flynyddoedd. Y peth olaf yr ydym am ei wneud yw creu rhyw fath o fiwrocratiaeth newydd iddynt weithio ynddi. Mae'r hyn yr ydym yn ei gynnig yn canolbwyntio ar asesu perfformiad unigolion drwy gydol yr ysgol, gan nodi'r potensial a defnyddio ymdrechion wedi'u targedu i sicrhau bod canlyniad terfynol pob disgybl unigol yn cyd-fynd â'i ddisgwyliadau hirdymor. Nid yw hyn yn golygu trefnu grŵp o ysgolion yn nifer o fandiau ac adolygu'r bandiau'n flynyddol; mae'n ymwneud â chydabod bod gan ysgolion gymysgedd o alluoedd ymhlith eu disgyblion, ac na all categorioedd ysgol gyfan fod yn fuddiol o ran rhoi cyfle inni asesu'r canlyniadau ar gyfer pob disgybl unigol.

I have no doubt that the Minister will repeat today his assertion that the school banding system has been a great success, and I am sure that he will have statistics that he thinks demonstrates that. However, to me, it will only show a snapshot, because the picture that we get from Estyn, which looks at the health of schools on a much broader basis than the banding system, is very different. Our Research Service tells us that there are currently 19 schools in special measures in Wales—that is 7,090 pupils in schools in special measures. Another flaw in the argument, which takes me back to the point that Aled made earlier about what we measure and how we measure success, is that not all youngsters are able to achieve the Minister's measure of banding success—the magic five A\* to C grades at GCSE, including English and mathematics. For some, achieving just one GCSE is an exceptional achievement, and for others getting 5 A\* is a disappointment. We fail both those pupils if our systems do not recognise that, or reward striving for excellence as it should be understood in the context of each individual pupil's capacity to learn.

How credible is a banding system in which Estyn's grade for a school can be 'excellent', yet, as in the case of the fantastic Treorchy Comprehensive School, it is placed in band 3, or one in which, in 2012, a third of schools are in a lower band than they were in 2011, and more than a third are in the same band as they were in 2011? How can we hope to encourage pupils, teachers and schools to thrive within a system that persists in grading schools within quintiles, but fails to recognise that the definition of success is unique to each child? If banding is designed to motivate schools to improve, let us design a system that encourages schools to develop each individual pupil to their own level of potential, rather than whole cohorts to an abstract generic level. As any parent knows, Minister, children have an amazing capacity to be abstract, but I have not yet met one who could be described as generic.

I have not yet met the pupil or parent that thinks that 5 A\* at GCSE is a disappointment. I think that the banding system is important in ensuring that all schools realise that all our pupils need to work to a certain level, because otherwise they will not have the skills that they need to go out and get work.

I think that the Lib Dem motion is a good one, except for the fourth point, where it falls apart. Contrary to what Angela Burns has said, I do not view the pupil deprivation grant as a device for obtaining support for a Labour budget; I think the pupil deprivation grant is a really important tool for narrowing the gap in attainment. That £450 per child in receipt of free school meals enables us to equitably target the pupils and the schools that require the most support, unlike the dog-eat-dog academies and free schools policy pursued by the English Minister for education.

Nid oes amheuaeth gennyf na fydd y Gweinidog yn ailadrodd heddiw ei honiad bod y system bandio ysgolion wedi bod yn llwyddiant mawr, ac rwy'n siŵr y bydd ganddo ystadegau sy'n dangos hynny yn ei farn ef. Fodd bynnag, i mi, dim ond dangos ciplun a wna, gan fod y darlun a gawn gan Estyn, sy'n edrych ar iechyd ysgolion ar sail lawer ehangach na'r system fandio, yn wahanol iawn. Dywed ein Gwasanaeth Ymchwil wrthym fod 19 o ysgolion yn destun mesurau arbennig yng Nghymru ar hyn o bryd—hynny yw, 7,090 o ddisgyblion mewn ysgolion sy'n destun mesurau arbennig. Diffyg arall yn y ddatl, sy'n mynd â mi yn ôl at y pwynt a wnaeth Aled yn gynharach am yr hyn yr ydym yn ei fesur a sut rydym yn mesur llwyddiant, yw nad yw pob person ifanc yn gallu cyflawni mesur y Gweinidog o llwyddiant bandio—y pum TGAU A\* i C hudol, gan gynnwys Saesneg a mathemateg. I rai, mae cyflawni un TGAU yn llwyddiant eithriadol, ac i eraill mae ennill 5 A\* yn siom. Rydym yn gwneud anghymwynas â'r disgyblion hynny os nad yw ein systemau yn cydnabod hynny, nac yn gwobrwo ymdrechion i gyflawni rhagoriaeth fel y dylid ei ddeall yng nghyd-destun gallu pob disgybl unigol i ddisygu.

Pa mor gredadwy yw system fandio lle y gall gradd Estyn ar gyfer ysgol fod yn 'rhagorol', ac eto, fel yn achos ysgol wych fel Ysgol Gyfun Treorci, mae'n cael ei rhoi ym mand 3, neu un lle, yn 2012, mae traean o ysgolion mewn band is nag yr oeddent yn 2011, ac mae dros draean yn yr un band ag yr oeddent yn 2011? Sut y gallwn obeithio annog disgyblion, athrawon ac ysgolion i ffynnu o fewn system sy'n parhau i raddio ysgolion mewn cwintelau, ond sy'n methu â chydabod bod y diffiniad o llwyddiant yn unigryw i bob plentyn? Os mai cymell ysgolion i wella yw nod bandio, gadewch inni gynllunio system sy'n annog ysgolion i ddatblygu pob disgybl unigol i'w botensial ei hun, yn hytrach na charfannau cyfan i lefel generig haniaethol. Fel y gŵyr unrhyw riant, Weinidog, mae gan blant allu anhygoel i fod yn haniaethol, ond nid wyf eto wedi cyfarfod ag un y gellid ei ddisgrifio yn generig.

Nid wyf eto wedi cyfarfod â'r disgybl na'r rhiant sy'n meddwl bod 5 TGAU A\* yn siom. Credaf fod y system fandio yn bwysig er mwyn sicrhau bod pob ysgol yn sylweddoli bod angen i'n holl ddisgyblion weithio i lefel benodol, oherwydd fel arall ni fydd ganddynt y sgiliau sydd eu hangen arnynt i gael gwaith.

Credaf fod cynnig y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yn un da, ac eithrio'r pedwerydd pwynt, lle mae'n darnio. Yn groes i'r hyn a ddywedodd Angela Burns, nid wyf yn ystyried y grant amddifadedd disgyblion fel dyfais i gael cefnogaeth i gyllideb Lafur; credaf fod y grant amddifadedd disgyblion yn ddull pwysig iawn o gau'r bwlch mewn cyrhaeddiad. Mae'r swm hwnnw o £450 am bob plentyn sy'n cael prydau ysgol am ddim yn ein galluogi i dargedu'n deg y disgyblion a'r ysgolion sydd angen y cymorth mwyaf, yn wahanol i'r academiâu gorgystadleuol a'r polisi ar ysgolion rhydd a ddilynir gan y Gweinidog Addysg yn Lloegr.

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I also commend the Communities First pupil deprivation match fund, because that is a very successful way of getting schools to collaborate. For example, in my constituency, within three weeks of the east Cardiff Communities First programme having been extended to Llanedeyrn and Pentwyn, they had submitted a bid to collectively employ family engagement officers who will work with families on issues that may get in the way of a child's learning, whether it is attendance or another issue that is troubling the child. They also hope to train their learning assistants in using what is called the family learning signature, a method of mapping the strengths and learning needs of families, which has been used successfully in Swansea schools. It is excellent to see people aspiring to extend this example of good practice to elsewhere. Therefore, I particularly commend the leadership role of the chair of governors of Llanedeyrn Primary School in bringing all these schools together so quickly and effectively, which demonstrates the importance of good governors as well as good teachers in raising school standards.

We also know that, where governors are aware of the progress being made by their pupils, both individually, in relation to their peers, and in relation to their family of schools, this is a guarantee that schools are analysing their data effectively, using them to inform their lesson plans and taking appropriate actions to support individuals who are falling behind. The data can also be used to pinpoint poor progress in a particular class or subject, which will, unfortunately, be indicative of poor teaching and learning, and that also needs to be addressed by the school and not tolerated, as has happened in the past. That is one of the other ways in which the banding system is very important.

I agree with the focus of the Institute of Welsh Affairs report, which the Lib Dems have highlighted, on the importance of the progress of each pupil, and of the value added by the school to their attainment, as much as the absolute standards attained. Therefore, much of this motion is quite sensible, but point 4, proposing that we substantially increase the pupil deprivation grant before we know whether the £32 million that we are already committed to spending is being used effectively is pretty nutty. We need to make sure that schools are using this money to narrow the gap in attainment, rather than simply to plug holes in their budgets. There is some indication that some schools are doing that. We need to do that before we increase the sums involved. Have these schools read Estyn's report, 'Effective practice in tackling poverty and disadvantage in schools', which was published in November? That will show them how to apply its 10 recommendations to their own school, adopting whole-school approaches, listening to disadvantaged pupils and tailoring the curriculum to meet their needs.

Cymeradwyaf hefyd gronfa arian gyfatebol amddifadedd disgyblion Cymunedau yn Gyntaf, gan fod hynny'n ffordd lwyddiannus iawn o gael ysgolion i gydweithio. Er enghraifft, yn fy etholaeth i, o fewn tair wythnos i raglen Cymunedau yn Gyntaf dwyrain Caerdydd gael ei hestyn i Lanedeyrn a Phen-twyn, roeddent wedi cyflwyno cais i gyflogi swyddogion ymgysylltu teuluoel ar y cyd a fydd yn gweithio gyda theuluoedd ar faterion a allai rwystro plentyn rhag dysgu, p'un a yw'n ymwneud â phresenoldeb neu broblem arall sy'n poeni'r plentyn. Maent hefyd yn gobeithio hyfforddi eu cynorthwyr dysgu i ddefnyddio'r hyn a elwir yn llofnod dysgu fel teulu, sef dull o fapio cryfderau ac anghenion dysgu teuluoedd, sydd wedi cael ei ddefnyddio'n llwyddiannus mewn ysgolion yn Abertawe. Mae'n wych gweld pobl yn anelu at ledaenu'r enghraifft hon o arfer da mewn mannau eraill. Felly, cymeradwyaf rôl arweinyddiaeth cadeirydd llywodraethwyr Ysgol Gynradd Llanedeyrn yn benodol am ddod â'r holl ysgolion hyn at ei gilydd mor gyflym ac mor effeithiol, sy'n dangos pwysigrwydd llywodraethwyr da yn ogystal ag athrawon da i godi safonau ysgolion.

Gwyddom hefyd, lle mae llywodraethwyr yn ymwybodol o'r cynnydd a wneir gan eu disgyblion, yn unigol, o'u cymharu â'u cyfoedion, ac mewn perthynas â'u teulu o ysgolion, fod hyn yn warant bod ysgolion yn dadansoddi eu data yn effeithiol, gan eu defnyddio i lywio eu cynlluniau gwersi a chymryd camau priodol i gefnogi unigolion sydd ar ei hôl hi. Gall y data hefyd gael eu defnyddio i amlygu cynnydd gwael mewn dosbarth neu bwnc penodol, a fydd, yn anffodus, yn arwydd o addysgu a dysgu gwael, a bod angen i'r ysgol fynd i'r afael â hynny ac nid ei oddef, fel sydd wedi digwydd yn y gorffennol. Dyna un o'r ffyrdd eraill y mae'r system fandiio yn bwysig iawn.

Cytunaf â ffocws adroddiad y Sefydliad Materion Cymreig, y mae'r Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol wedi tynnu sylw ato, ar bwysigrwydd cynnydd pob disgybl, ac ar y gwerth a ychwanegir gan yr ysgol at ei gyrhaeddiad, cymaint â'r safonau absoliwt a gyflawnir. Felly, mae llawer o'r cynnig hwn yn eithaf synhwyrol, ond mae pwynt 4, sy'n cynnig ein bod yn cynyddu'r grant amddifadedd disgyblion yn sylweddol cyn inni wybod a yw'r swm o £32 miliwn yr ydym eisoes wedi ymrwymo i'w wario yn cael ei ddefnyddio'n effeithiol yn eithaf hurt. Mae angen inni wneud yn siŵr bod ysgolion yn defnyddio'r arian hwn i gau'r bwllch mewn cyrhaeddiad, yn hytrach na dim ond llenwi tyllau yn eu cyllidebau. Mae rhai arwyddion bod rhai ysgolion yn gwneud hynny. Mae angen inni wneud hynny cyn inni gynyddu'r symiau dan sylw. A yw'r ysgolion hyn wedi darllen adroddiad Estyn, 'Arfer effeithiol wrth fynd i'r afael â thlodi ac anfantais mewn ysgolion', a gyhoeddwyd ym mis Tachwedd? Bydd hynny'n dangos iddynt sut y dylid cymhwyso ei 10 o argymhellion at eu hysgolion eu hunain, gan fabwysiadu dulliau ysgol gyfan, gwrandao ar ddisgyblion sydd o dan anfantais ac addasu'r cwricwlwm i ddiwallu eu hanghenion.

One of the schools that Estyn highlights as using this grant effectively is Cathays High School in Cardiff, and I am not surprised that it commends it highly. Estyn points out that this is a school that has effective inclusive policies, where over 30 languages are spoken, half the pupils have English as a second or even third language and Welsh is rarely the first language. Among the ways in which it engages effectively with its families is through the Bring a Parent to School Day in year 7, by having translators at family meetings to discuss pupils' progress, and through a DVD and a website designed by learners with Cardiff Metropolitan University to engage families from different ethnic backgrounds and with a different language to English. As a result, the performance of learners eligible for free school meals is higher than the average for its family of schools, so I look forward to hearing the Minister's evaluation of the outcomes of the pupil deprivation grant before we give any more money to it.

Un o'r ysgolion y mae Estyn yn cyfeirio ati fel un sy'n defnyddio'r grant hwn yn effeithiol yw Ysgol Uwchradd Cathays yng Nghaerdydd, ac ni synnaf ei fod yn ei chanmol yn fawr. Noda Estyn fod hon yn ysgol sydd â pholisïau cynhwysol effeithiol, lle mae dros 30 o ieithoedd yn cael eu siarad, lle mae hanner y disgyblion yn siarad Saesneg fel ail neu hyd yn oed drydedd iaith ac mai Cymraeg yn anaml iawn yw'r iaith gyntaf. Ymhlith y ffyrdd y mae'n ymgysylltu'n effeithiol â'i theuluoedd yw drwy Ddiwrnod Dewch â Rhiant i'r Ysgol ym mlwyddyn 7, drwy gael cyfieithwyr mewn cyfarfodydd teuluoel i drafod hynt disgyblion, a thrwy DVD a gwefan a ddyluniwyd gan ddysgwyr ar y cyd â Phrifysgol Fetropolitan Caerdydd i gynnwys teuluoedd o gefndiroedd ethnig gwahanol a chyda iaith wahanol i'r Saesneg. O ganlyniad, mae perfformiad dysgwyr sy'n gymwys i gael prydau ysgol am ddim yn uwch na'r cyfartaledd ar gyfer ei theulu o ysgolion, felly edrychaf ymlaen at glywed gwerthusiad y Gweinidog o ganlyniadau'r grant amddifadedd disgyblion cyn inni roi mwy o arian iddo.

As my colleagues have already pointed out, there is ample evidence to show that, in adapting classroom techniques, it is possible to raise standards. Again, the most recent Estyn report provides an example, as follows:

'All of the secondary schools placed in Estyn monitoring or local authority monitoring last year have addressed their inspection recommendations successfully by taking a systematic and well-planned approach to the identified weaknesses. Many of these schools have improved the standards achieved in key stage 4 through better use of performance data and careful tracking of pupils' progress throughout the key stage. Teachers have based targets for individual pupils on high expectations and they have arranged suitable mentoring and support for those likely to underachieve.'

If these improvements can be actioned successfully after a less than satisfactory inspection, you have to ask why they could not have been actioned in the first instance. However, I would echo the chief inspector's view that teachers and other professionals need to be clear about how the curriculum and its delivery need to change, and they need more support to make those changes.

Let us go back to the Estyn report again, where the chief inspector states:

Standards are good or better in just under three-quarters of schools. This year, in just over a quarter of the schools inspected, standards are only adequate. In many of these schools, pupils' rate of progress in different year groups varies too much. In just over a quarter of schools, staff do not have high enough expectations of what their pupils can achieve. As a result, pupils do not achieve as well as they could.'

The chief inspector also states that

Mae'r athrawon wedi seilio targedau'r disgyblion unigol ar ddisgwyliadau uchel, ac maen nhw wedi trefnu mentora a chymorth addas i'r rhai sy'n debygol o dangyflawni.'

Os gellir rhoi'r gwelliannau hyn ar waith yn llwyddiannus ar ôl arolygiad llai na boddhaol, rhaid ichi ofyn pam na allent fod wedi cael eu rhoi ar waith yn y lle cyntaf. Fodd bynnag, hoffwn ategu barn y prif arolygydd fod angen i athrawon a gweithwyr proffesiynol eraill fod yn glir ynghylch sut y mae angen i'r cwricwlwm a'r ffordd y caiff ei gyflwyno newid, ac mae angen mwy o gymorth arnynt i wneud y newidiadau hynny.

Gadewch inni fynd yn ôl at adroddiad Estyn eto, lle mae'r prif arolygydd yn nodi:

'Mae safonau ychydig dan dri chwarter o'r ysgolion yn dda neu'n well. Eleni, dim ond digonol yw safonau ychydig dros chwarter digonol yw safonau ychydig dros chwarter o'r ysgolion a gafodd eu harolygu. Yn llawer o'r ysgolion yma, mae cyfradd cynnydd disgyblion y gwahanol grwpiau blwyddyn yn amrywio gormod. Nid yw disgwyliadau'r staff o'r hyn y gall eu disgyblion ei gyflawni'n ddigon uchel yn ychydig dros chwarter o'r ysgolion. O ganlyniad, nid yw'r disgyblion yn cyflawni gystal ag y gallen nhw.'

Mae'r prif arolygydd hefyd yn datgan y

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'in over half the schools inspected, inspected, a minority of teachers do not have high enough expectations, particularly of more able pupils, or set challenging activities that are matched to pupils' needs and abilities.'

It is clear in the report that the schools that do best are those whose leaders set challenging expectations for teachers and pupils. The results are evidence that the approach works.

From discussions with education professionals, I know that there is a willingness to implement the appropriate changes, which would lead to improved pupil attainment. I remember that, when I was Chair of the education committee in the second Assembly, I think, the Minister then actually produced a report that illustrated how leadership was key in terms of improving the performance of schools. The importance of good leadership could not be stressed too much.

Additionally, as one of those involved in the negotiations that brought about the implementation of a pupil deprivation grant in Wales, I welcome the fact that disadvantaged children in Wales are now able to receive targeted support. I also welcome the fact that we can look forward to appropriate scrutiny by Estyn of how the grant is being spent, and we urge the Minister to consider increasing the grant to do even more to boost school standards. It is important that funds are directed efficiently and effectively with the accountability that our motion recommends.

Each December, schools in bands 4 and 5 receive £10,000 each to help them improve. I am sure that the schools are grateful for that funding, but I would have to query whether or not that payment represents value for money, particularly when the quintile system dictates that the Welsh Government is currently committing itself to approximately £0.5 million a year. While we call for transparency in the application of the pupil deprivation grant moneys, I am not aware of any means by which those schools in bands 4 and 5 publicly report how they are using the banding moneys that they are given, or of what evidence that they have to show that it is being effective. I think that we need to add that to the list of how we can effectively scrutinise the way that schools are funded.

Last year, 48 schools stayed in the bottom two bands and received £10,000 each after submission of a school improvement plan. This surely begs the question of how robust the 2011 plans were in the first place.

The NASUWT recently described the Government's flagship literacy framework, which is to be implemented in September, as an 'omnishambles', and has warned of industrial action. The child development assessment profile was hastily withdrawn in February last year after it had been in place unsuccessfully for less than six months. At the time, over a year ago, the Minister said,

O'r trafodaethau â gweithwyr addysg proffesiynol, gwn fod parodrwydd i weithredu'r newidiadau priodol, a fyddai'n arwain at wella cyrhaeddiad disgyblion. Cofiaf, pan oeddwn yn Gadeirydd y pwyllgor addysg yn yr ail Gynulliad, fe gredaf, i'r Gweinidog ar y pryd baratoi adroddiad a oedd dangos sut yr oedd arweinyddiaeth yn allweddol o ran gwella perfformiad ysgolion. Ni ellir gorbwysleisio pwysigrwydd arweinyddiaeth dda.

Yn ogystal, fel un o'r rhai a fu'n rhan o'r trafodaethau a arweiniodd at weithredu grant amddifadedd disgyblion yng Nghymru, croesawaf y ffaith bod plant difreintiedig yng Nghymru bellach yn gallu cael cymorth wedi'i dargedu. Croesawaf y ffaith hefyd y gallwn edrych ymlaen at graffu priodol gan Estyn ar y ffordd y mae'r grant yn cael ei wario, ac rydym yn annog y Gweinidog i ystyried cynyddu'r grant i wneud hyd yn oed yn fwy i godi safonau ysgolion. Mae'n bwysig bod arian yn cael ei gyfeirio'n effeithlon ac yn effeithiol gyda'r atebolrwydd y mae ein cynnig yn ei argymhell.

Bob mis Rhagfyr, mae ysgolion ym mandiau 4 a 5 yn cael £10,000 yr un i'w helpu i wella. Rwy'n siŵr bod yr ysgolion yn ddiolchgar am y cyllid hwnnw, ond rhaid imi holi a yw'r taliad hwnnw yn rhoi gwerth am arian, yn enwedig pan fo'r system cwintel yn golygu bod yn rhaid i Lywodraeth Cymru dalu oddeutu £0.5 miliwn y flwyddyn ar hyn o bryd. Er ein bod yn galw am dryloywder ynglŷn â sut y caiff arian y grant amddifadedd disgyblion ei ddefnyddio, nid wyf yn ymwybodol o unrhyw ffordd y mae'r ysgolion hynny ym mandiau 4 a 5 yn nodi yn gyhoeddus sut y maent yn defnyddio'r arian bandio a roddir iddynt, na pha dystiolaeth y mae'n rhaid iddynt ei dangos er mwyn nodi ei fod yn effeithiol. Credaf fod angen i ni ychwanegu hynny at y rhestr o sut y gallwn graffu'n effeithiol ar y ffordd yr ariennir ysgolion.

Y llynedd, arhosodd 48 o ysgolion yn y ddau fand isaf a chawsant £10,000 yr un ar ôl cyflwyno cynllun gwella ysgol. Mae hyn yn sicr yn codi'r cwestiwn ynghylch pa mor gadarn oedd cynlluniau 2011 yn y lle cyntaf.

Dyweddodd Cymdeithas Genedlaethol yr Ysgolfeistri ac Undeb yr Athrawesau yn ddiweddar fod prif fframwaith llythrennedd y Llywodraeth, a fydd yn cael ei roi ar waith ym mis Medi, yn draed moch llwyr, ac mae wedi rhybuddio am weithredu diwydiannol. Tynnwyd y proffil asesu datblygiad plentyn yn ôl ar frys ym mis Chwefror y llynedd ar ôl iddo fod ar waith yn aflwyddiannus am lai na chwe mis. Ar y pryd, dros flwyddyn yn ôl, dywedodd y Gweinidog,



'Work is already in hand to ensure that we move quickly to replace the CDAP with a tool that better supports children's early learning and development.'

What new initial individual assessment scheme has been implemented instead of the CDAP? You must agree, Minister, that current policies have not been as cogent as you had planned and that it is time to reassess how we assess and monitor pupil attainment in Wales. I would hope that what we have set out in this motion will provide a basis for taking that forward.

Thank you for the opportunity to take part in today's debate. I can understand why the Liberal Democrats are keen to have a debate in which the pupil deprivation grant features so prominently and why they are keen to winkle out evidence that the Faustian pact was worthwhile. After all, it was a risky trade-off, Jenny Rathbone, to sacrifice protection for Welsh NHS funding, with foreseeable consequences, for expenditure on deprived pupils, with uncertainty as to the efficacy of that expenditure. We all want to be confident that the money has been well spent.

The motion highlights Estyn's inability to report on the effectiveness of the grant to date. I agree with Simon Thomas that point 4(b) is perhaps the wrong way around; evaluation should be a precursor to more funding. Now, of course, I would expect those who believe unreservedly in the grant to call for money; they have great plans for it. I seem to recall that the Lib Dem Member for North Wales was keen to see the money invested in attendance and behaviour. It is an excellent idea, as long as he remembers that the money can be spent only once and can be shown to be spent effectively, as the motion acknowledges. So, I look forward to Estyn devising a way to measure how well schools spend their pupil deprivation grant, and I, too, look forward to seeing completely independent evidence on which the Lib Dems can make their case next year, perhaps, making it easier for us here to support a future for the grant.

Personally, I support the idea that each headteacher should spend the money to overcome deprivation in the way that they believe is best for their school. I accept that Estyn's evaluation tools will need to be pretty sophisticated to accommodate the many different ways that the grant is spent. Here, I think that we would agree that if banding—which does not appear to protect schools from closing, incidentally—has to remain as the measure of schools' progress, it must also be more sophisticated and it must be reformed.

Mae gwaith eisoes ar y gweill i sicrhau ein bod yn symud yn gyflym i gyflwyno dull sy'n cefnogi dysgu a datblygiad cynnar plant yn well na'r proffil asesu datblygiad plentyn.

Pa gynllun asesu unigol cychwynnol newydd sydd wedi cael ei roi ar waith yn hytrach na'r proffil asesu datblygiad plentyn? Rhaid ichi gytuno, Weinidog, nad yw'r polisiau presennol wedi bod mor rymus ag yr oeddech wedi bwriadu iddynt fod a'i bod yn bryd ailasesu sut rydym yn asesu ac yn monitro cyrhaeddiad disgyblion yng Nghymru. Gobeithiaf y bydd yr hyn yr ydym wedi'i nodi yn y cynnig hwn yn rhoi sail dros weithredu ar hynny.

Diolch ichi am y cyfle i gymryd rhan yn y ddadl heddiw. Gallaf ddeall pam mae'r Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yn awyddus i gynnal dadl lle mae lle mor amlwg i'r grant amddifadedd disgyblion a pham y maent yn awyddus i grafu am dystiolaeth bod y cytundeb Ffawstaidd wedi bod yn werth ei wneud. Wedi'r cyfan, roedd yn fargen beryglus, Jenny Rathbone, i aberthu diogelu cyllid y GIG yng Nghymru, gyda goblygiadau rhagweladwy, am wariant ar ddisgyblion difreintiedig, gydag ansicrwydd ynghylch effeithiolrwydd y gwariant hwnnw. Rydym i gyd yn awyddus i gael sicrwydd bod yr arian wedi cael ei wario'n dda.

Mae'r cynnig yn tynnu sylw at anallu Estyn i gyflwyno adroddiad ar effeithiolrwydd y grant hyd yn hyn. Cytunaf â Simon Thomas fod pwynt 4 (b) o chwith o bosibl; dylid gwerthuso cyn rhoi mwy o arian. Yn awr, wrth gwrs, byddwn yn disgwyl i'r rhai sy'n credu'n ddiadmod yn y grant i alw am arian; mae ganddynt gynlluniau mawr ar ei gyfer. Cofiaf fod yr Aelod sy'n Democrat Rhyddfrydol dros Ogledd Cymru yn awyddus i'r arian gael ei fuddsoddi mewn presenoldeb ac ymddygiad. Mae'n syniad ardderchog, ar yr amod ei fod yn cofio mai dim ond unwaith y gellir gwario'r arian ac y gellir dangos iddo gael ei wario'n effeithiol, fel y mae'r cynnig yn ei gydnabod. Felly, edrychaf ymlaen at weld Estyn yn dyfeisio ffordd o fesur pa mor dda y mae ysgolion yn gwario eu grant amddifadedd disgyblion, ac edrychaf innau hefyd ymlaen at weld tystiolaeth gwbl annibynnol y gall y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol ei defnyddio i gyflwyno eu hachos y flwyddyn nesaf, efallai, gan ei gwneud yn haws inni yma gefnogi dyfodol i'r grant.

Yn bersonol, cefnogaf y syniad y dylai pob pennaeth wario'r arian i oresgyn amddifadedd yn y ffordd orau i'w hysgol yn eu barn hwy. Derbyniaf y bydd angen i ddulliau gwerthuso Estyn fod yn eithaf soffistigedig i ddarparu ar gyfer y lluo o wahanol ffordd y mae'r grant yn cael ei wario. O ran hyn, credaf y byddem yn cytuno, os oes rhaid i fandio—yr ymddengys nad yw'n diogelu ysgolion rhag cau, gyda llaw—barhau fel mesur o gynnydd ysgolion, rhaid iddo hefyd fod yn fwy soffistigedig a rhaid iddo gael ei ddiwygio.

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The Liberal Democrats' new position paper is a valuable contribution to the ongoing debate on school standards, and it highlights areas of concern that are shared by us as Welsh Conservatives. We, too, have raised in this Chamber the issues of teachers' training, the curriculum, the need for support in the middle school years and Estyn's findings on the lack of support for our most able and talented, especially those from deprived backgrounds. That concerns remain for us both underlies a scepticism that the new School Standards and Organisation (Wales) Act 2013 has only gone so far.

It is entirely fair to raise the issue of value-added trajectory in relation to banding. Tracking records for individual pupils and progress that is measured separately against individual education plans—the new independent learner plans—have been very helpful for parents and school governors responsible for the performance management of a school's headteacher and, therefore, performance management of the whole school. In some schools, where a small year of non-academic children can see a school plummet through the quartiles, tracking that shows value-added from a cohort with a low baseline would help parents and governors to understand that a school may not have been as poor as it seemed at first glance.

So, we still believe that we need something more nuanced than the current banding system; some measure that may also be suitable for primary schools. However, the Lib Dem proposal does not address a problem that this Chamber debated in January last year, namely the concerns over the baseline assessment of children and the robustness of the child development assessment plans. Nor does the pupil deprivation grant prevent the potential for inflated value-added, which arises when the baseline assessment is wrongly conducted.

I have two final points. In responding to the debate, could I ask the Minister briefly to address the total confusion regarding individual learning pathway plans? The Children and Young People Committee took evidence that suggested that pupils pretty much do not know that they have such a document, let alone know what it is supposed to achieve. The learning pathway plan is supposed to help pupils to plot their learning journey, identify targets and research learning opportunities along the way. Where a school chooses to target pupils with a pupil deprivation grant, surely the learning pathway plan should reflect that, as well as being a much more powerful piece of evidence in evaluating an individual's progress.

I would just endorse what Aled Roberts and Angela Burns said about pupils fulfilling their potential regardless of background and ability. There were some exchanges in the Chamber on the subject of the number of Oxbridge students coming from Wales. While Oxbridge is not the be all and end all, of course, it did point to a consequence of our current provision for education. For an exceptional talent to be held back by a mediocre education is just as much a source of shame as is a socially deprived child being held back by a mediocre education. It is doubly shameful when a socially deprived child is the one who has an exceptional talent.

Rydym ninnau hefyd wedi codi yn y Siambr hon y materion sy'n ymwneud â hyfforddi athrawon, y cwricwlwm, yr angen am gefnogaeth yn y blynyddoedd ysgol canol a chanfyddiadau Estyn ynglŷn â'r diffyg cefnogaeth i'n disgyblion mwyaf galluog a dawnus, yn enwedig y rhai o gefndiroedd ddifreintiedig. Mae'r ffaith bod gan y ddwy blaid bryderon o hyd yn tanlinellu'r amheuan mai dim ond hyn a hyn y mae Deddf Safonau a Threfniadaeth Ysgolion (Cymru) 2013 wedi ei gyflawni.

Mae'n gwbl deg codi mater llwybr gwerth ychwanegol mewn perthynas â bandio. Mae olrhain cofnodion ar gyfer disgyblion unigol a chynnydd sy'n cael ei fesur ar wahân yn erbyn cynlluniau addysg unigol—y cynlluniau dysgwyr annibynnol newydd—wedi bod yn ddefnyddiol iawn i rieni a llywodraethwyr ysgol sy'n gyfrifol am reoli perfformiad pennaeth ysgolion ac, felly, am reoli perfformiad yr ysgol gyfan. Mewn rhai ysgolion, lle y gall blwyddyn fach o blant nad ydynt yn academiaidd beri i'r ysgol blymio drwy'r chwarteli, byddai olrhain sy'n dangos gwerth ychwanegol gan garfan â sylfaen isel yn helpu rhieni a llywodraethwyr i ddeall nad yw ysgol wedi bod mor wael ag yr ymddangosai ar yr olwg gyntaf.

Cymerodd y Pwyllgor Plant a Phobl Ifanc dystiolaeth a oedd yn awgrymu nad yw disgyblion fwy neu lai yn gwybod bod ganddynt ddogfen o'r fath, heb sôn am wybod beth y disgwylir iddi ei gyflawni. Disgwylir i'r cynllun llwybr dysgu helpu disgyblion i gynllunio eu taith ddisgu, nodi targedau ac ymchwilio i gyfleoedd dysgu ar hyd y ffordd. Pan fo ysgol yn dewis targedu disgyblion â grant amddifadedd disgyblion, oni ddylai'r cynllun llwybr dysgu adlewyrchu hynny, yn ogystal â bod yn ddarn llawer mwy grymus o dystiolaeth wrth werthuso cynnydd yr unigolyn.

Hoffwn ategu'r hyn a ddywedodd Aled Roberts ac Angela Burns am ddisgyblion yn cyflawni eu potensial waeth beth fo'u cefndir a'u gallu. Gwnaed rhai sylwadau yn y Siambr ynghylch nifer y myfyrwyr o Gymru sy'n mynd i Rydychen a Chaergrawnt. Er nad yw Rhydychen a Chaergrawnt yn ateb i bob dim, wrth gwrs, amlygodd un o ganlyniadau ein darpariaeth addysg bresennol. Mae gweld disgybl â dawn eithriadol yn cael ei lesteirio gan addysg gyffredin yr un mor gywilyddus â gweld plentyn sy'n ddifreintiedig yn gymdeithasol yn cael ei lesteirio gan addysg gyffredin. Mae'n gywilyddus ar ddau gyfrif os mai plentyn sy'n ddifreintiedig yn gymdeithasol yw'r un sydd â dawn eithriadol.

We must allow every pupil in Wales to reach their full potential via pupil-centred intervention and support that is focused on the individual needs of each learner. Since the early years of devolution, Welsh Government funding formulas have favoured the most disadvantaged areas of Wales, and yet they generally remain the most disadvantaged areas, and too often educational underachievement has been subsidised rather than tackled. Unless the underlying causes are addressed, the money thrown at the problem simply will not deliver. When the Welsh Government launched the RAISE grant in 2006, focused on schools with the highest levels of deprivation, funding was limited to schools with 20% or more of pupils eligible for free school meals. However, this also resulted in some above-average performing schools being funded, while some of the poorest-performing schools received nothing.

The pupil deprivation grant to schools in Wales, similarly aimed at reducing the link between deprivation and educational attainment, is also based on the number of children eligible for free school meals, and therefore it is essential that pupil outcomes are monitored in order that schools in receipt of the grant are held accountable for narrowing the attainment gap. We know that the most recent figures, from January 2011, show per pupil spending in Wales averaging £604 less than in England, up from a funding gap of just £58 at the time of devolution 12 years previously. This cannot simply be blamed on austerity measures resulting from economic bust and credit crunch. This Minister subsequently stated that figures for the funding gap would no longer be published, blaming education policy changes in England. However, the Association of Teachers and Lecturers said that it would be far better to publish the figures with a health warning about comparisons, and the National Union of Teachers called on the Welsh Government to publish figures for Wales even if comparisons with England could not be made. We do know that data compiled by the teaching union NASUWT last June showed that children in Wales had received 10% less money than their counterparts in England and were 12% less likely to achieve top GCSE grades.

Pan lansiodd Llywodraeth Cymru y grant Rhagori yn 2006, a ganolbwyntiodd ar ysgolion â'r lefelau uchaf o amddifadedd, roedd y cyllid yn cael ei gyfyngu i ysgolion lle roedd 20% neu fwy o'r disgyblion yn gymwys i gael prydau ysgol am ddim. Fodd bynnag, un canlyniad oedd bod rhai ysgolion a oedd yn perfformio'n uwch na'r cyfartaledd yn cael eu hariannu hefyd, tra bod rhai o'r ysgolion a oedd yn perfformio waethaf yn cael dim.

Mae'r grant amddifadedd disgyblion i ysgolion yng Nghymru, sydd hefyd yn anelu at leihau'r cysylltiad rhwng amddifadedd a chyrhaeddiad addysgol, hefyd yn seiliedig ar nifer y plant sy'n gymwys i gael prydau ysgol am ddim, ac felly mae'n hanfodol bod canlyniadau disgyblion yn cael eu monitro er mwyn sicrhau bod yr ysgolion sy'n cael y grant yn cael eu dwyn i gyfrif am gau'r bwlch o ran cyrhaeddiad. Gwyddom fod y ffigurau diweddaraf, o fis Ionawr 2011, yn dangos bod gwariant fesul disgybl yng Nghymru ar gyfartaledd £604 yn llai nag yn Lloegr, o gymharu â bwlch cyllido o £58 yn unig ar adeg datganoli 12 mlynedd ynghynt. Ni ellir beio'r mesurau caledi o ganlyniad i'r dirwasgiad economaidd a'r wasgfa greddyd am hyn. Dywedodd y Gweinidog hwn wedyn na fyddai'r ffigurau ar gyfer y bwlch cyllido yn cael eu cyhoeddi mwyach, gan feio newidiadau ym mhobol addysg yn Lloegr. Fodd bynnag, dywedodd Cymdeithas yr Athrawon a'r Darlithwyr y byddai'n llawer gwell pe bai'r ffigurau yn cael eu cyhoeddi gyda rhybudd iechyd am gymariaethau, a galwodd Undeb Cenedlaethol yr Athrawon ar Lywodraeth Cymru i gyhoeddi ffigurau Cymru, hyd yn oed os nad oedd modd gwneud cymariaethau â Lloegr. Gwyddom fod y data a gasglwyd gan yr undeb athrawon Cymdeithas Genedlaethol yr Ysgolfeistri ac Undeb yr Athrawesau fis Mehefin diwethaf wedi dangos bod plant yng Nghymru wedi cael 10% yn llai o arian na'u cyfoedion yn Lloegr a'u bod 12% yn llai tebygol o ennill y graddau TGAU uchaf.

We also know that the postcode lottery in per-pupil school funding within Wales remains huge, with a £955 gap last year between Denbighshire at the top and Caerphilly at the bottom, with Flintshire's £615 per pupil gap second from bottom. We must hope that the Programme for International Student Assessment report due out later this year shows an improvement on its last report, when Wales ranked below average in science, maths and reading—worse than previously in every category, and the worst in the UK. It is now a decade since the 'Lost Children of Wales' report found that young people and Welsh business were looking for a transformation in 14-19 education that would focus on the development of leadership, teamwork, communication and creativity. This research found that we must remove the wall between work and what is taught in school, and that the curriculum should be taught in a work-related context. It concluded that the 14-19 agenda was not being addressed by the then Welsh Government, but instead of acting on that report's evidence, that Government buried it, with dire consequences for the most vulnerable young people in Wales.

Previous 'Times Educational Supplement' research showed that at the school with the highest proportion of free school meals in England and Wales with 83%, 59% achieved five GCSEs at grades A to C, whereas at the Swansea school with the highest proportion of pupils in receipt of free school meals in Wales, with 62%, just 14% then achieved 5 GCSEs at grades A to C. It is complex.

Estyn has previously confirmed that successful schools in disadvantaged areas do well by doing the same things in general terms as all other successful schools. These schools tend to have high expectations in both standards and behaviour, and do not allow staff to use a relatively high proportion of pupils entitled to free school meals as an excuse for low performance. They also pay substantial attention to developing social and emotional skills and improving pupils' confidence and self-esteem. We must break the link between educational underachievement and poverty. We must have high aspirations for pupils wherever they live, and apply target measures to underachievement wherever we find it. We must champion the many headteachers who argue that the life chances of pupils should not be written off because of their geographical location.

Gwyddom hefyd fod y loteri cod post o ran arian fesul disgybl i ysgolion yng Nghymru yn parhau'n enfawr, gyda bwlch o £955 y llynedd rhwng sir Ddinbych ar y brig a Chaerffili ar y gwaelod, gyda bwlch fesul disgybl sir y Fflint, sef £615, yn ail o'r gwaelod. Rhaid inni obeithio y bydd adroddiad y Rhaglen Ryngwladol Asesu Myfyrwyr a fydd ar gael yn ddiweddarach eleni yn dangos gwelliant ers ei hadroddiad diwethaf, pan oedd Cymru yn is na'r cyfartaledd mewn gwyddoniaeth, mathemateg a darllen—yn waeth nag o'r blaen ym mhob categori, a'r waethaf yn y DU. Mae degawd wedi mynd heibio bellach ers i adroddiad 'Plant Coll Cymru' ganfod bod pobl ifanc a busnesau yng Nghymru yn chwilio am drawsnewidiad mewn addysg 14-19 a fyddai'n canolbwyntio ar ddatblygu arweinyddiaeth, gwaith tîm, cyfathrebu a chreadigrwydd. Canfu'r ymchwili hon fod yn rhaid inni chwalu'r mur rhwng gwaith a'r hyn a addysgir yn yr ysgol, ac y dylai'r cwricwlwm gael ei addysgu mewn cyd-destun sy'n gysylltiedig â gwaith. Daeth i'r casgliad nad oedd yr agenda 14-19 yn cael sylw gan Lywodraeth Cymru ar y pryd, ond yn hytrach na gweithredu ar dystiolaeth yr adroddiad hwnnw, cafodd ei gladdu gan y Llywodraeth, gyda chanlyniadau dybryd i'r bobl ifanc fwyaf agored i niwed yng Nghymru.

Dangosodd ymchwili gan y 'Times Educational Supplement' yn y gorffennol i'r ysgol a oedd â'r gyfran uchaf o brydau ysgol am ddim yng Nghymru a Lloegr, sef 83%, gyflawni 59% o bum TGAU gradd A i C, ond yn yr ysgol yn Abertawe â'r gyfran uchaf o ddisgyblion a oedd yn cael prydau ysgol am ddim yng Nghymru, sef 62%, dim ond 14% a gyflawnodd 5 TGAU gradd A i C. Mae'n gymhleth.

Mae Estyn wedi cadarnhau o'r blaen bod ysgolion llwyddiannus mewn ardaloedd dan anfantais yn gwneud yn dda drwy wneud yr un pethau yn gyffredinol â phob ysgol lwyddiannus arall. Mae'r ysgolion hyn yn tueddu i fod â disgwyliadau uchel o ran safonau ac ymddygiad, ac nid ydynt yn caniatáu i staff ddefnyddio'r gyfran gymharol uchel o ddisgyblion sydd â hawl i gael prydau ysgol am ddim fel esgus dros berfformiad isel. Maent hefyd yn rhoi cryn sylw i ddatblygu sgiliau cymdeithasol ac emosiynol a gwella hyder a hunan-barch y disgyblion. Rhaid inni dorri'r cysylltiad rhwng tangyflawni addysgol a thlodi. Rhaid inni fod â dyheadau uchel ar gyfer disgyblion lle bynnag y maent yn byw, a defnyddio mesurau targed ar gyfer tangyflawni lle bynnag rydym yn dod ar ei draws. Rhaid inni gefnogi'r llu o benaethiaid sy'n dadlau na ddylid dibrisio cyfleoedd bywyd disgyblion oherwydd eu lleoliad daearyddol.

I established an objective to break the link between poverty and poor attainment as one of our three priorities alongside literacy and numeracy. That is the focus of the department's work. The reality is that the best schools already track the performance of individual pupils, and they do not just track it; they have intervention plans in place that pick up and identify precisely what needs to be done by the young people and by their teachers to ensure that they get the grades that they are capable of achieving. Of course, it is important that we start with high expectations and aspirations for all pupils. Research by Estyn, as Peter Black said, and the Joseph Rowntree Foundation, has shown that, in some schools, staff expectations of pupils are simply not high enough. We are aware of that. That is why leadership is key and why we have placed such an emphasis on leadership within the system.

There has been a tendency in this debate, certainly from the Liberal Democrats, to underemphasise the issue of the percentages of young people gaining five good GCSEs—five A\* to C grade GCSEs, including English or Welsh and maths. Aled Roberts said that we focus too much on that objective. I am afraid that I think we have focused too little on that objective. The evidence is that, with the right systems in place, more of our schools can do better.

I am afraid that evidence of the Liberal Democrats' performance in Cardiff Council over recent years shows that they allowed schools to fail their pupils. If you look at some of those schools and at the performance of, for example, Willows High School, you will see that, until the recent headteacher came in and did a lot to lift standards, that school, I am afraid, was doing appallingly compared with what it should have been achieving for those young people.

I think that we have made progress. In Cardiff, there is a very committed new Labour administration with a cabinet member who has really got a grip on what needs to be done to turn education around. I will not give up on this as a target for our system. We should, throughout Wales, be raising the number and percentage of young people who are achieving five good GCSEs, including English or Welsh and maths. We can do that. Where leadership is going in the schools, that is being achieved.

I will certainly not give up on our banding system, which was a manifesto commitment. Sixty-one out of the 79 schools in bands 4 and 5 saw increases in the numbers of young people getting five good GCSEs from A\* to C, including English or Welsh and maths. There was an increase from 36% to 41% in band 5 and an increase from 41% to 46% in band 4. There were significant increases in performance there.

Pennais amcan y dylid torri'r cysylltiad rhwng tlodi a chyrhaeddiad gwael fel un o'n tair blaenoriaeth ochr yn ochr â llythrennedd a rhifedd. Dyna ffocws gwaith yr adran. Y gwir amdani yw bod yr ysgolion gorau eisoes yn olrhain perfformiad disgyblion unigol, ac nid dim ond ei olrhain a wnânt; mae ganddynt gynlluniau ymyrryd ar waith sy'n nodi'n union yr hyn sydd angen ei wneud gan y bobl ifanc a chan eu hathrawon er mwyn sicrhau eu bod yn cael y graddau y gallant eu hennill. Wrth gwrs, mae'n bwysig ein bod yn dechrau gyda disgywiliadau a dyheadau uchel ar gyfer pob disgybl. Mae ymchwil gan Estyn, fel y dywedodd Peter Black, a Sefydliad Joseph Rowntree, wedi dangos, mewn rhai ysgolion, nad yw disgywiliadau staff o ddisgyblion yn ddigon uchel. Rydym yn ymwybodol o hynny. Dyna pam mae arweinyddiaeth yn allweddol a pham rydym wedi rhoi cymaint o bwyslais ar arweinyddiaeth o fewn y system.

Bu tuedd yn y ddadl hon, yn sicr gan y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol, i danbriso mater canrannau'r bobl ifanc sy'n ennill pum TGAU da— pum TGAU A\* i C, gan gynnwys Saesneg neu Gymraeg a mathemateg. Dywedodd Aled Roberts ein bod yn canolbwyntio gormod ar yr amcan hwnnw. Ofnaf nad ydym wedi canolbwyntio ddigon ar yr amcan hwnnw. Mae'r dystiolaeth yn dangos y gall mwy o'n hysgolion, gyda'r systemau cywir ar waith, wneud yn well.

Mae arnaf ofn bod tystiolaeth o berfformiad y Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol yng Nghyngor Caerdydd dros y blynyddoedd diwethaf yn dangos iddynt ganiatáu i ysgolion wneud cam â'u disgyblion. Os edrychwch ar rai o'r ysgolion hynny ac ar berfformiad, er enghraifft, Ysgol Uwchradd Willows, fe welwch, nes i'r pennaeth yn ddiweddar gyrraedd a gwneud llawer i godi safonau, fod yr ysgol honno, mae arnaf ofn, yn gwneud yn ofnadwy o'i chymharu â'r hyn y dylai fod wedi bod yn ei gyflawni dros y bobl ifanc hynny.

Credaf ein bod wedi gwneud cynnydd. Yng Nghaerdydd, mae gweinyddiaeth Lafur newydd ymroddedig iawn gydag aelod cabinet sydd yn wir wedi mynd i'r afael â'r hyn sydd angen ei wneud i weddnewid addysg. Ni roddaf y gorau i'r hyn fel targed ar gyfer ein system. Dylem, ledled Cymru, fod yn codi nifer a chanran y bobl ifanc sy'n cyflawni pum TGAU da, gan gynnwys Saesneg neu Gymraeg a mathemateg. Gallwn wneud hynny. Lle ceir arweinyddiaeth yn yr ysgolion, mae hynny'n cael ei gyflawni.

Yn sicr, ni fwriadaf roi'r gorau i'n system fandio, a oedd yn ymrwymiad manifesto. Mewn 61 o'r 79 o ysgolion ym mandiau 4 a 5 gwelwyd cynnydd yn nifer y bobl ifanc a enillodd bum gradd TGAU dda o A\* i C, gan gynnwys Saesneg neu Gymraeg a mathemateg. Cafwyd cynnydd o 36% i 41% ym mand 5 a chynnydd o 41% i 46% ym mand 4. Cafwyd cynnydd sylweddol mewn perfformiad.

I agree with those, including the Plaid Cymru and Conservative spokespeople, who have said that we need further analysis of the way in which the pupil deprivation grant is being used. Following the example of my colleague the Member for the Vale of Clwyd, I have written to every school in my own constituency asking how they are using the pupil deprivation grant. I have had reports from them about how it is being used. It is being used to target and support young people with literacy and numeracy needs and to focus on issues such as attendance, which was raised by my colleague the Member for Cardiff Central in her contribution.

Schools are being very creative and imaginative in the way in which they use that funding. What we do not yet know, however, is how the use of that funding is then resulting in specific improvements in performance for the young people for whom it is meant to be targeted. I agreed with what Mark Isherwood said—unusually—in respect of previous examples. We had the RAISE grant in the past and we know that where it was used well it made a difference, but we know it was not consistently used well.

I also think that it is important for people to understand the difference between the banding system and an Estyn inspection. Estyn inspections take place every six years. They look across a range of issues to do with the performance of a school, not simply the academic performance. There will be, from time to time, differences in assessments and sometimes it will depend on when the inspection cycle falls. Estyn's inspection of Treorchy Comprehensive School in my own constituency was referred to. I suspect that I know that school rather better than the Member who raised the point. It is an excellent school; it is doing well. However, it is clear that there were certain challenges that it faced within the teaching of certain subjects. This is something that the headteacher himself would accept and which I and my officials have discussed with him.

We have set out for schools what has worked well over the last year or two in terms of the teaching of maths and English at secondary schools. We are putting in place support for schools in precisely the areas that we see as priorities. The literacy and numeracy framework, which rolls out from years 2 to 9, will reinforce that, and the reading tests commence over the next month. They will help teachers to diagnose performance and identify precisely what has to be done for each individual pupil and they will enable them to build up progress for those individuals during the course of their time in schools.

We have the policies in place. We also have the toolkits to provide support developed by organisations such as the Sutton Trust, which have given clear evidence of what really works in terms of turning around performance, and particularly improving the performance of individuals who face particular challenges. What we still have to do in Wales is ensure that best practice is spread between schools. That is where the consortia are now getting a grip. That is being rolled out by the system leaders that are being employed in particular consortia. There is evidence on the ground that that is starting to make a difference.

Cytunaf â'r rhai hynny, gan gynnwys y llefarwyr dros Blaid Cymru a'r Ceidwadwyr, a ddywedodd fod angen dadansoddi ymhellach y modd y mae'r grant amddifadedd disgyblion yn cael ei ddefnyddio. Yn dilyn esiampl fy nghyd-Aelod, yr Aelod dros Ddyffryn Clwyd, rwyf wedi ysgrifennu at bob ysgol yn fy etholaeth i ofyn sut y maent yn defnyddio'r grant amddifadedd disgyblion. Rwyf wedi cael adroddiadau ganddynt ar y ffordd y mae'n cael ei ddefnyddio. Mae'n cael ei ddefnyddio i dargedu a chefnogi pobl ifanc sydd ag anghenion llythrennedd a rhifedd ac i ganolbwyntio ar faterion megis presenoldeb, a godwyd gan fy nghyd-Aelod, yr Aelod dros Ganol Caerdydd yn ei chyfraniad hithau.

Mae ysgolion yn defnyddio'r arian hwnnw mewn ffordd greadigol a dychmygus iawn. Yr hyn na wyddom eto, fodd bynnag, yw sut y mae'r defnydd o'r arian hwnnw yn arwain at welliannau penodol mewn perfformiad ar gyfer y bobl ifanc y bwriedir iddo gael ei dargedu atynt. Cytunais â'r hyn a ddywedodd Mark Isherwood—sy'n beth anarferol— ynghylch enghreifftiau blaenorol. Cafwyd y grant Rhagori yn y gorffennol a gwyddom iddo wneud gwahaniaeth lle y cafodd ei ddefnyddio'n dda, ond gwyddom na chafodd ei ddefnyddio'n gyson.

Credaf hefyd ei bod yn bwysig i bobl ddeall y gwahaniaeth rhwng y system fandio ac arolygiad gan Estyn. Cynhelir arolygiadau Estyn bob chwe blynedd. Maent yn ystyried ystod o faterion sy'n ymwneud â pherfformiad ysgol, nid dim ond y perfformiad academaidd. O bryd i'w gilydd, bydd gwahaniaethau mewn asesiadau ac weithiau bydd yn dibynnu ar amseriad y cylch arolygu. Cyfeiriwyd at arolygiad Estyn o Ysgol Gyfun Treorci yn fy etholaeth i. Credaf fy mod yn adnabod yr ysgol honno yn well na'r Aelod a gododd y pwynt. Mae'n ysgol ragorol; mae'n gwneud yn dda. Fodd bynnag, mae'n amlwg ei bod yn wynebu heriau penodol o ran addysgu rhai pynciau. Mae hyn yn rhywbeth y byddai'r pennaeth ei hun yn ei dderbyn ac yr wyf finnau a'm swyddogion wedi ei drafod gydag ef.

Rydym wedi nodi ar gyfer ysgolion yr hyn sydd wedi gweithio'n dda dros y flwyddyn ddiwethaf neu ddwy o ran addysgu mathemateg a Saesneg mewn ysgolion uwchradd. Rydym yn rhoi cymorth i ysgolion yn yr union feysydd a ystyriwn yn flaenoriaethau. Bydd y fframwaith llythrennedd a rhifedd, sy'n cael ei gyflwyno o flynyddoedd 2 i 9, yn atgyfnerthu hynny, ac mae'r profion darllen yn dechrau yn ystod y mis nesaf. Byddant yn helpu athrawon i ddadansoddi perfformiad a nodi'n union yr hyn y mae'n rhaid ei wneud ar gyfer pob disgybl unigol a byddant yn eu galluogi i helpu'r unigolion hynny i wneud cynnydd yn ystod eu hamser yn yr ysgol.

Mae'r polisiau ar waith gennym. Rydym hefyd wedi paratoi'r pecynnau cymorth i roi cymorth a ddatblygwyd gan sefydliadau megis Ymddiriedolaeth Sutton, sydd wedi rhoi tystiolaeth glir o'r hyn sy'n gweithio o ran gweddnewid perfformiad, ac yn enwedig gwella perfformiad unigolion sy'n wynebu heriau penodol. Yr hyn y mae'n rhaid inni ei wneud o hyd yng Nghymru yw sicrhau bod arfer gorau yn cael ei ledaenu rhwng ysgolion. Dyna'r maes y mae'r consortia bellach yn mynd i'r afael ag ef. Mae hynny'n cael ei gyflwyno gan yr arweinwyr system sy'n cael eu cyflogi mewn consortia penodol. Mae tystiolaeth ar lawr gwlad bod hynny'n dechrau gwneud gwahaniaeth.

On today's amendments, we will be supporting amendments 1 and 2; we will not be supporting amendment 3; we will be supporting our own amendment 4; we will not be supporting amendment 5; we will be supporting amendments 6, 7 and 10; and we will not be supporting amendments 8 and 9.

We will not endorse the call today for further investment in the pupil deprivation grant. We are not going to allow every motion discussed on education or any other subject in this Chamber to be used as a device to pre-empt the proper route of budget discussions. That is the way that we will take forward any commitments on finance.

I have made clear our position. We believe that individual development plans are critical to individual pupils, but the best schools already have them.

O ran gwelliannau heddiw, byddwn yn cefnogi gwelliannau 1 a 2; ni fyddwn yn cefnogi gwelliant 3; byddwn yn cefnogi ein gwelliant 4 eu hunain; ni fyddwn yn cefnogi gwelliant 5; byddwn yn cefnogi gwelliannau 6, 7 a 10; ac ni fyddwn yn cefnogi gwelliannau 8 a 9.

Ni fyddwn yn cefnogi'r alwad heddiw am fuddsoddiad pellach yn y grant amddifadedd disgyblion. Ni fwiadwn ganiatáu i bob cynnig a drafodir ar addysg neu unrhyw bwnc arall yn y Siambr hon gael ei ddefnyddio fel dyfais i achub y blaen ar lwybr priodol trafodaethau ar y gyllideb. Dyna'r ffordd y byddwn yn gweithredu ar unrhyw ymrwymiadau ynglŷn â chyllid.

Rwyf wedi egluro ein safbwynt. Credwn fod cynlluniau datblygu unigol yn hanfodol i ddisgyblion unigol, ond mae'r ysgolion gorau yn eu paratoi eisoes.

Thank you, Presiding Officer. I thank everybody who has contributed to the debate for their contributions and the tone in which they were made. The Minister's closing statement sums it up for the Welsh Liberal Democrats: yes, the best schools have that individual tracking system, but we want all our schools to have that individual pupil tracking system. It has been proven that it works and drives up achievement.

Diolch ichi, Lywydd. Diolch i bawb sydd wedi cyfrannu at y ddadl am eu cyfraniadau ac am naws y cyfraniadau hynny. Mae'r datganiad i gloi gan y Gweinidog yn dweud y cyfan ym marn Democratiaid Rhyddfrydol Cymru: ie, mae'r ysgolion gorau wedi sefydlu system olrhain unigol, ond rydym am i'n holl ysgolion ddefnyddio'r system olrhain unigol honno i ddisgyblion. Profwyd ei bod yn llwyddo ac yn gwella cyflawniad.

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In opening the debate today, we were reminded by Aled Roberts once again of the ongoing blight that we have in Wales of the link between levels of family income on pupils' educational attainment. He said that perhaps we cannot, as it is impossible, to find a system of guaranteeing equality of outcome, but it should be possible to design a system that guarantees equality of opportunity.

Wrth agor y ddadl heddiw, fe'n hatgoffwyd gan Aled Roberts unwaith eto o'r problem o hyd sydd gennym yng Nghymru o ran y cysylltiad rhwng lefelau incwm teuluoedd ar gyrhaeddiad addysgol disgyblion. Dywedodd efallai nad oes modd, gan ei bod yn amhosibl dod o hyd i system o warantu canlyniadau cyfartal, ond dylai fod yn bosibl llunio system sy'n sicrhau cyfle cyfartal.

I thank Angela Burns for her contribution. As my colleague said, we will be accepting amendment 1 in this debate, but I regret that she and her Conservative colleagues cannot embrace the principle behind the pupil deprivation grant in the same way that her colleagues in England have. She is right; there are children from poorer backgrounds that are stellar, but, from my perspective, there simply are not enough of them. We need a system—and I believe that the pupil deprivation grant is that system—that will allow many more of our children from poorer backgrounds to be stellar.

Fel y dywedodd fy nghyd-Aelod, byddwn yn derbyn gwelliant 1 yn y ddadl hon, ond gresynaf na all hi na'i chyd-Aelodau Ceidwadol groesawu egwyddor y grant amddifadedd disgyblion yn yr un modd ag y gwnaeth ei chyd-Aelodau yn Lloegr. Mae'n llygad ei lle; mae plant o gefndiroedd tlotach sy'n serenennu, ond, o'm safbwynt i, yn syml, nid oes digon ohonynt. Mae angen system—a chredaf mai'r grant amddifadedd disgyblion yw'r system honno—a fydd yn rhoi cyfle i lawer mwy o'n plant o gefndiroedd tlotach serenennu.

She was right to have concern for the middle. That is why our emphasis today—and something that she echoed—is on the individual child, because every child has the right to have their potential identified, then progressed and looked at to make sure. Therefore, whether you are in the lower attainment categories, a high-flyer or whether you find yourself in the middle, you have a right to have your abilities assessed and to have that tracked throughout your education system. We believe that this system does just that. It protects those who are in danger of falling through the middle. Special educational needs can, of course, be accounted for in that individual-focused system.

I am grateful to you for your comments in acknowledging that the banding system is here, so let us make it the best banding system it can be by having it refined. Simon, I welcome your contribution this afternoon. While we cannot support all the Plaid amendments, we welcome very much the tone of the contribution. You are right to say that it is all our responsibility here; there is no dodging this particular challenge. We have the tools and the capabilities in Wales to get it right, and it is incumbent upon us to do just that. Simon drew on his experience of the system in Ceredigion. I have seen that at first hand in my local high school, where we have managed to attract a headteacher from a Ceredigion high school, whose first step in his new position was to introduce a pupil tracking system that was not there previously. That pupil tracking system and his commitment to looking at each individual child's achievements is the very reason that my daughter will go to that school, despite some of the negative publicity surrounding the school and other aspects—it is because of his commitment to look at what is right for the individual and to ensure that she fulfils her full potential.

Jenny Rathbone says that having five A\* grades is no disappointment. It would be a disappointment if the child was capable of getting 10, Jenny. That is the whole point of this debate. Five A\* grades is not a disappointment if that is the very best the child could do. It is a disappointment if the child is capable of getting 10. I was somewhat bemused—not for the first time—by Jenny's contribution to the Chamber, in that she spent a great deal of time talking about the positive effects and the very creative ways in which headteachers in her constituency are using the pupil deprivation grant and making a real difference to those children in the schools, and yet she cannot support any more money going into that scheme. That is not the first time that Labour has had a problem with clause 4.

We acknowledge Suzy Davies's concerns about assessment. Again, this is one of the reasons we are proposing what we are in this system. We need those assessments to be based on reality and to be open and transparent, and to not have teachers under pressure because of an inflationary system. We need to get those base assessments right.

Rydych yn llygad eich lle i ddweud mai ni yma sy'n gyfrifol am y cyfan; nid oes modd osgoi'r her arbennig hon. Mae gennym yr adnoddau a'r galluoedd yng Nghymru i gael pethau'n iawn, ac mae'n ddyletswydd arnom i wneud hynny. Cyfeiriodd Simon at ei brofiad o'r system yng Ngheredigion. Rwyf wedi gweld hynny drosof fy hun yn fy ysgol uwchradd leol, lle rydym wedi llwyddo i ddenu pennaeth o ysgol uwchradd yng Ngheredigion, a gyflwynodd, fel ei weithred gyntaf yn ei swydd newydd, system olrhain disgyblion nad oedd ar waith o'r blaen. Y system honno o olrhain disgyblion ynghyd â'i ymrwymiad i edrych ar gyflawniadau pob plentyn unigol yw'r union reswm pam y bydd fy merch yn mynd i'r ysgol honno, er gwaethaf ychydig o gyhoeddusrwydd negyddol am yr ysgol ac agweddau eraill—oherwydd ei ymrwymiad i edrych ar yr hyn sy'n iawn i'r unigolyn a sicrhau ei bod yn cyflawni ei llawn botensial.

Mae Jenny Rathbone yn dweud nad yw ennil pum gradd A\* yn siom. Byddai'n siom pe bai'r plentyn yn gallu ennil 10, Jenny. Dyna union ddiben y ddatl hon. Nid yw pum gradd A\* yn siom os mai dyna'r gorau y gallai'r plentyn ei wneud. Mae'n siom os yw'r plentyn yn gallu ennil 10. Synnais braidd—nid am y tro cyntaf—at gyfraniad Jenny yn y Siambr, yn yr ystyr iddi dreulio llawer iawn o amser yn sôn am yr effeithiau cadarnhaol a'r ffyrdd creadigol iawn y mae penaethiaid yn ei hetholaeth yn defnyddio'r grant amddifadedd disgyblion ac yn gwneud gwahaniaeth gwirioneddol i'r plant hynny yn yr ysgolion, ac eto ni all gefnogi'r cynnig i roi rhagor o arian yn y cynllun. Nid dyna'r tro cyntaf y mae Llafur wedi cael problem gyda chymal 4.

Rydym yn cydnabod pryderon Suzy Davies ynghylch asesu. Unwaith eto, dyma un o'r rhesymau pam rydym yn cynnig yr hyn a wnawn yn y system hon. Mae angen i'r asesiadau hynny fod yn seiliedig ar realiti a bod yn agored ac yn dryloyw, a pheidio â rhoi athrawon o dan bwysau oherwydd system chwyddiannol. Mae angen inni sicrhau bod yr asesiadau sylfaenol hynny'n iawn.



Mark, I could not agree with you more. What we need more than anything is high expectations: from us as Assembly Members of what Welsh education can deliver; from those people in our education authorities that are supposed to provide the strategic leadership at a local level; from our school leaders and senior management teams; from individual teachers who find themselves in front of classrooms; and from parents. It is sometimes depressing to see the ability in so many of our communities to say, 'Never mind, that is the way it has to be'. It does not have to be that way; we can have high expectations individually for our children and collectively in communities.

I will conclude by referring to the Minister's comments. It is not surprising that he felt the need to have a swipe at the Liberal Democrats. It was the Liberal Democrat administration that appointed that new headteacher in Willows High School that is doing such a good job for its pupils. However, I am concerned that, once again, he has settled himself on this mantra of five GCSEs being the be all and end all. Yes, of course they are important, but if you are that child who only ends up with those five GCSEs so that the school can tick the box, when you should have ended up with six, seven or eight, then this system has failed you. What about the pupil with the best will in the world and with the most inspiring teachers in the classroom who will only be able to aspire to two or three GCSEs? Are we saying that we will write them off and not care about their education and not give them the individual attention that they deserve because they will not be able to reach the Government's own stated goal of what success in a Welsh school looks like? That is why we will remain committed to a principle that looks at developing systems that treat all our children as individuals and mark success not as attaining five A grades at GCSE, but on whether they have reached the full potential that was identified in them when they were assessed when they went into primary school and when they were assessed again when they entered secondary school. If we can get all of our pupils achieving what they are capable of, that is what a successful Welsh education system will look like.

## Dadl Fer: Adeiladu Rhwydwaith Ffyrdd Gwledig ar gyfer yr Unfed Ganrif ar Hugain: Yr Achos dros Wneud Gwaith Deuoli ar yr A40 yn Sir Benfro

I am pleased to use my short debate this afternoon to once again highlight the case for dualling the A40 in Pembrokeshire. I hope that the Deputy Minister for Skills and Technology, in light of my comments this afternoon, will commit to seriously considering the case.

I am bound to say that I am extremely disappointed that the Minister who has direct responsibility for transport around the Cabinet table has failed to be here this afternoon, and will not be responding to this debate. I hope that the Deputy Minister will take back my dissatisfaction to the Minister.

It is five and a half years since I originally raised this issue on the floor of the Chamber. Unfortunately, we are no further forward. Given that the situation has not really progressed, it is time to revisit this matter.

The case for dualling the A40 is an important issue for the people of Pembrokeshire, and has been talked about since the 1950s. This matter is not party political; indeed, representatives from all political parties have acknowledged the importance of dualling the A40. My predecessor, Tamsin Dunwoody, then the Labour Assembly Member for Preseli Pembrokeshire and the Deputy Minister for transport for a period, also supported dualling the A40. As she said on 8 December 2004:

'I have been putting tremendous pressure on the Minister. The long-term aim is for the dualling of the A40 between St Clears and Haverfordwest.'

This proves that politicians of all political persuasions are calling for this road to be upgraded, and realise the huge benefits that dualling the A40 would bring to Pembrokeshire.

Pembrokeshire County Council has undertaken a considerable amount of work to analyse the benefits of dualling the A40. Only last week, the deputy leader and cabinet member for highways and planning at Pembrokeshire County Council, Rob Lewis, said in a letter to the local newspaper that the authority will continue to lobby for such improvements to the A40.

The aim of this debate is not to put unrealistic demands on the Welsh Government to dual the A40 immediately, but for the Welsh Government to seriously consider the need for this improvement and to acknowledge the economic and safety benefits of dualling the road.

Mae'r achos dros wneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 yn fater pwysig i bobl sir Benfro ac mae wedi bod yn destun siarad ers y 1950au. Nid oes a wnelo'r mater hwn â phlaidd wleidyddol yn benodol; yn wir, mae cynrychiolwyr o bob plaid wleidyddol wedi cydnabod pwysigrwydd gwneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40. Roedd fy rhagflaenydd, Tamsin Dunwoody, a oedd bryd hynny'n Aelod Cynulliad Llafur dros Breseli Sir Benfro ac yn Ddirprwy Weinidog dros drafnidiaeth am gyfnod, hefyd o blaid gwneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40. Fel y dywedodd ar 8 Rhagfyr 2004:

'Rwyf wedi bod yn rhoi pwysau aruthrol ar y Gweinidog. Y nod hirdymor yw gwneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 rhwng San Clêr a Hwlfordd.'

Mae hyn yn profi bod gwleidyddion o bob argyhoeddiad gwleidyddol yn galw am i'r ffordd hon gael ei huwchraddio a gwireddu'r manteision enfawr a fyddai'n deillio o wneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 i sir Benfro.

Mae Cyngor Sir Penfro wedi gwneud cryn dipyn o waith dadansoddi ar fanteision gwneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40. Dim ond yr wythnos diwethaf, dywedodd y dirprwy arweinydd ac aelod cabinet ar briffyrdd a chynllunio yng Nghyngor Sir Penfro, Rob Lewis, mewn llythyr i'r papur newydd lleol y bydd yr awdurdod yn parhau i bwysu am welliannau o'r fath i'r A40.

Nid nod y ddadl hon yw gosod gofynion afrealistig ar Lywodraeth Cymru i wneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 ar unwaith, ond i Lywodraeth Cymru ystyried yr angen am y gwelliant hwn o ddirifrif a chydabod manteision economaidd a diogelwch gwneud gwaith deuoli ar y ffordd.

First, I would like to consider the need for the A40 to be dualled based on daily traffic flow figures. Traffic flow figures from the Department for Transport show that, at each count point along the A40 in Pembrokeshire, there has been an increase in annualised average daily traffic from 2001 to 2011. In fact, annualised average daily traffic from one count site along a 7.2 mile stretch of road into Haverfordwest has risen from 11,352 motor vehicles in 2001 to 13,888 in 2011. That is a 22% jump in 10 years. Similarly, annualised average daily traffic from another count site along a 3.72 mile stretch of road a bit further north towards Fishguard has risen from 5,569 motor vehicles in 2001 to 6,184 motor vehicles in 2011. That is an 11% jump in 10 years, at a point on the A40 leading to a major ferry port. Indeed, the results from the Department for Transport's national transport model tell us that there is likely to be a general increase in traffic vehicle miles across the country of roughly 44% between 2010 and 2035. It is clear, therefore, that dualling the A40 needs to be seriously on the agenda.

Secondly, I would like to reiterate the economic benefits that dualling the A40 would bring to Pembrokeshire and, indeed, the rest of Wales. Pembrokeshire is the home of two liquefied natural gas terminals and it has two oil refineries in its locality. As the Deputy Minister is well aware, about 30% of the UK's energy supplies now come in via Pembrokeshire, contributing over £2 billion a year to the Treasury. It is rapidly increasing its reputation as the new energy capital of the UK. We have a fantastic opportunity to build on that by investing in a strong transport infrastructure to support the energy industry and the local economy as a whole. We are all aware that the Welsh Government has designated the Milford Haven Waterway an enterprise zone. This recognises the importance of the area to the UK's energy sector, so we must ensure that momentum is not lost and that this agenda is being progressed efficiently.

Therefore, it seems logical that, because of Pembrokeshire's recognised strategic importance, we begin to look seriously at the area's infrastructure and, in particular, its transport network. Indeed, Milford Haven Port Authority stressed this point in its written and oral evidence to the Assembly's Enterprise and Business Committee inquiry into ports and airports. During that inquiry, in written evidence, the port referred to

'eventual investment in the dualling of road links which would improve commutability and have a substantial impact on the tourism economy.'

Its representatives were not the only witnesses during that inquiry to call for investment in the dualling of the A40. Stena Line also called for upgrades to the A40, writing that

'an improvement to the A40 could be a catalyst to the Fishguard Port development plan which was submitted for outline planning last year along with a proposed Marina development adjacent to the Port.'

Yn gyntaf, hoffwn ystyried yr angen i wneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 yn seiliedig ar ffigurau llif traffig dyddiol. Yn ôl ffigurau llif traffig yr Adran Drafnidiaeth, bu cynnydd mewn traffig dyddiol cyfartalog blyneddol ar bob pwynt cyfrif ar hyd yr A40 yn sir Benfro rhwng 2001 a 2011. Yn wir, mae'r traffig dyddiol cyfartalog blyneddol ar gyfer un safle cyfrif ar hyd darn 7.2 milltir o ffordd i mewn i Hwlfordd wedi cynyddu o 11,352 o gerbydau modur yn 2001 i 13,888 yn 2011. Mae hynny'n naid o 22% mewn 10 mlynedd. Yn yr un modd, mae'r traffig dyddiol cyfartalog blyneddol ar gyfer safle cyfrif arall ar hyd darn 3.72 milltir o ffordd ychydig ymhellach i'r gogledd tuag at Abergwaun wedi cynyddu o 5,569 o gerbydau modur yn 2001 i 6,184 o gerbydau modur yn 2011. Mae hynny'n naid o 11% mewn 10 mlynedd, mewn man ar yr A40 sy'n arwain at borthladd fferi mawr. Yn wir, mae canlyniadau model trafnidiaeth cenedlaethol yr Adran Drafnidiaeth yn dweud wrthym fod milltiroedd cerbydau traffig ledled y wlad yn debygol o gynyddu tua 44% yn gyffredinol rhwng 2010 a 2035. Mae'n amlwg, felly, fod angen rhoi'r gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 ar frig yr agenda.

Yn ail, hoffwn ailadrodd manteision economaidd gwneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 i sir Benfro ac, yn wir, weddill Cymru. Mae sir Benfro yn gartref i ddwy derfynfa nwy naturiol hylifedig ac mae dwy burfa olew yn y cyffiniau. Fel y gŵyr y Dirprwy Weinidog, daw tua 30% o gyflenwadau ynni'r DU i mewn drwy sir Benfro bellach, gan gyfrannu dros £2 biliwn y flwyddyn i'r Trysorlys. Mae ei henw da fel canolfan ynni newydd y DU yn prysur ddatblygu. Mae'n gyfle gwych inni adeiladu ar hynny drwy fuddsoddi mewn seilwaith trafnidiaeth cryf i gefnogi'r diwydiant ynni a'r economi leol yn gyffredinol. Rydym oll yn ymwybodol bod Llywodraeth Cymru wedi dynodi Dyfrffordd y Ddau Gledau yn ardal fenter. Mae hyn yn cydnabod pwysigrwydd yr ardal i sector ynni'r DU, felly rhaid inni sicrhau na chaiff momentwm ei golli a bod yr agenda hon yn cael ei datblygu'n effeithlon.

Felly, mae'n ymddangos yn rhesymegol, oherwydd pwysigrwydd strategol cydnabyddedig sir Benfro, ein bod yn dechrau edrych o ddifrif ar seilwaith yr ardal ac, yn arbennig, ei rhwydwaith trafnidiaeth. Yn wir, pwysleisiodd Awdurdod Porthladd Aberdaugleddau y pwynt hwn yn ei dystiolaeth ysgrifenedig a llafar i ymchwiliad Pwyllogor Menter a Busnes y Cynulliad i borthladdoedd a meysydd awyr. Yn ystod yr ymchwiliad hwnnw, mewn tystiolaeth ysgrifenedig, cyfeiriodd y porthladd at

'fuddsoddi yn y broses o wneud gwaith deuoli ar gysylltiadau ffyrdd yn y pen draw a fyddai'n gwella cymudedd ac yn cael effaith sylweddol ar yr economi dwristiaeth.'

Nid ei gynrychiolwyr ef oedd yr unig dystion yn ystod yr ymchwiliad hwnnw i alw am fuddsoddi yn y broses o ddeuoli'r A40. Galwodd Stena Line am uwchraddio'r A40 hefyd, gan nodi

'gallai gwella'r A40 sbarduno cynllun datblygu Porthladd Abergwaun, a gyflwynwyd ar gyfer cynllunio amlinellol y llynedd, ynghyd â datblygiad Marina arfaethedig ger y Porthladd.'

Given that small businesses are the backbone of the Pembrokeshire economy, it is vital for their success that we have strong transport links with the rest of the UK, especially when we have some prominent businesses, such as the hauliers Mansel Davies & Son Ltd, based in my constituency. Dualling the A40 would also be a welcome call to businesses based further afield, sending the message that Pembrokeshire is open for business. It could attract other vital businesses to the area. Sadly, there has been a steep downturn in inward investment over the past decade, following a period of success in the 1990s, and Wales has now fallen to the bottom of the inward investment league table. UK Trade and Investment figures show that, in 2011-12, Wales attracted 28 projects. That accounts for fewer than 2% of all UK projects, one higher than bottom-ranking Northern Ireland's 27. In comparison, Scotland has had 96 foreign direct investment projects.

Potential inward investors make their decisions on the basis of their perceptions, even though the perception might be worse than the reality. Businesses will relocate to areas like Pembrokeshire only if they think that there are good transport links in place. Good transport links will be beneficial to the local economy, which will, in turn, provide good job opportunities in the local area, especially for our young people. Unless we have a vastly improved road infrastructure, Pembrokeshire will continue to lose the younger generation to other parts of the country. Therefore, the Welsh Government should support rural Wales and encourage inward investment by ensuring that a twenty-first century transport system is in place in west Wales.

Andrew Davies, when he was the Minister for transport, said in 2004 that dualling the A465 Heads of the Valleys road would make it the road to prosperity for hard-up Valleys communities. The people of Pembrokeshire may ask why their hard-up communities will not get the benefits of a dual carriageway road to prosperity. I am not suggesting that we are in competition with other parts of Wales, but one could argue that there are different sets of rules being applied to different sets of people.

Welsh Government documentation acknowledges that the A40 is the European gateway into Ireland through the port of Fishguard, which, of course, is the reality. In fact, the documentation states that the A40 trunk road, together with the A48, A477 and the M4 motorway, forms part of the trans-European network in south Wales. It is a strategically important link between the national motorway network and the port of Fishguard. That same document states,

'The A40 in West Wales currently forms the lowest standard section of the Trans European Network-Transport (TEN-T) in the United Kingdom.'

If that is the case, surely it is time to do something about it. Wales should not be the poor relation in Europe. However, I am afraid that it is the poor relation because I am given to understand that one can drive from the Polish border to St Clears without leaving a dual carriageway. However, from St Clears, single carriage roads take traffic to the ferry ports of Fishguard and Pembroke Dock.

O gofio mai busnesau bach yw asgwrn cefn economi sir Benfro, mae eu llwyddiant yn dibynnu ar gysylltiadau trafndiaeth cryf â gweddill y DU, yn enwedig pan fo gennym rai busnesau amlwg, fel y cwmni cludo Mansel Davies a'i Fab Cyf, yn fy etholaeth. Byddai gwneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 hefyd yn estyn gwahoddiad i fusnesau sydd wedi'u lleoli ymhellach i ffwrdd, gan gyfleu'r neges bod sir Benfro ar agor am fusnes. Gallai ddenu busnesau hanfodol eraill i'r ardal. Yn anffodus, bu dirywiad sylweddol mewn lefelau mewnfuddsoddi dros y degawd diwethaf, yn dilyn cyfnod llwyddiannus yn y 1990au, ac mae Cymru bellach wedi disgyn i waelod y tabl cynghrair mewnfuddsoddi. Dengys ffigurau Masnach a Buddsoddi'r DU fod Cymru wedi denu 28 o brosiectau yn 2011-12. Mae hynny'n cyfrif am lai na 2% o'r holl brosiectau yn y DU, un yn uwch na Gogledd Iwerddon oedd â 27 ac ar waelod y tabl. Mewn cymhariaeth, mae'r Alban wedi sicrhau 96 o brosiectau buddsoddi uniongyrchol o dramor.

Mae darpar fewnfuddsoddwyr yn gwneud eu penderfyniadau ar sail eu canfyddiadau, er bod y canfyddiad yn gallu bod yn waeth na realiti. Dim ond os credant fod cysylltiadau trafndiaeth da ar gael y bydd busnesau yn adleoli i ardaloedd fel sir Benfro. Bydd cysylltiadau trafndiaeth da o fudd i'r economi leol, a fydd, yn ei thro, yn cynnig cyfleoedd gwaith da yn yr ardal leol, yn enwedig i'n pobl ifanc. Oni bai fod gennym seilwaith ffyrdd gwell o lawer, bydd sir Benfro yn parhau i goll'i'r gnehdaeth iau i rannau eraill o'r wlad. Felly, dylai Llywodraeth Cymru gefnogi Cymru wledig ac annog mewnfuddsoddiad drwy sicrhau bod system drafndiaeth o'r 21ain ganrif ar waith yng ngorllewin Cymru.

Fel y Gweinidog dros drafndiaeth, dywedodd Andrew Davies, yn 2004, y byddai gwneud gwaith deuoli ar ffordd A465 Blaenau'r Cymoedd yn ei gwneud yn ffordd i ffyniant i gymunedau'r Cymoedd a wynebai galedi. Efallai y bydd pobl sir Benfro yn gofyn pam na chaiff eu cymunedau hwythau sy'n wynebu caledi brofi manteision ffordd ddeuol i ffyniant. Nid wyf yn awgrymu ein bod mewn cystadleuaeth â rhannau eraill o Gymru, ond gellid dadlau bod gwahanol reolau ar waith i wahanol bobl.

Mae dogfennaeth Llywodraeth Cymru yn cydnabod mai'r A40 yw'r porth Ewropeaidd i Iwerddon drwy borthladd Abergwaun, sydd, wrth gwrs, yn gwbl gywir. Yn wir, mae'r ddogfennaeth yn nodi bod cefnffordd yr A40, ynghyd â'r A48, yr A477 a thraffordd yr M4, yn ffurfio rhan o'r rhwydwaith traws-Ewropeaidd yn ne Cymru. Mae'n gyswllt strategol bwysig rhwng y rhwydwaith traffyrdd cenedlaethol a phorthladd Abergwaun. Mae'r un ddogfen yn datgan,

'Ar hyn o bryd, yr A40 yng ngorllewin Cymru yw'r rhan isaf ei safon o'r Rhwydwaith Trafndiaeth Traws Ewropeaidd (TEN-T) yn y Deyrnas Unedig.'

Os yw hynny'n wir, onid yw'n amser inni weithredu. Ni ddylai Cymru fod yn berthynas dlawd yn Ewrop. Fodd bynnag, mae arnaf ofn mai hi yw'r perthynas dlawd oherwydd rwyf ar ddeall y gellir gyrru o ffin Gwlad Pwyl i San Clêr heb adael ffordd ddeuol. Fodd bynnag, o San Clêr, ffyrdd unffrdw sy'n tywys traffig i borthladdoedd fferi Abergwaun a Doc Penfro.

The Deputy Minister may be aware of the work that is being undertaken in Brussels at the moment in relation to the stretch of road between Carmarthen and Fishguard. The A40 between Carmarthen and Fishguard harbour is part of the core network in the regulation on European Union guidelines for the development of the trans-European transport network, currently making its way through the legislative procedure in Brussels. The new approach to TEN-T divides the network into core and comprehensive sections. The core network must be completed to the requisite standard by 2030. I accept that the regulations are still going through the legislative process and could be subject to change; however, the clear intention of this regulation is that the core road network is developed to a high standard, and that is the main point. As these discussions continue at a European level, it is only right that the Welsh Government also considers the case for upgrading the A40.

Pembrokeshire is also a thriving tourist hotspot that attracts thousands of visitors every year. However, to fully capitalise on what Pembrokeshire has to offer, there needs to be a strong transport network in place. The Welsh Government's 'Tourism 2020' document acknowledges this by stating,

'If tourism is to grow in Wales we need to ensure that visitors are able to travel to and within the country without unnecessary restriction.'

Dualling the A40 would result in shorter journey times for visitors and local residents alike travelling across Pembrokeshire. Not dualling would undermine the Welsh Government's accessibility aim.

Thirdly, I would like to look at the safety benefits of dualling the A40. Dual carriageways are much safer than single carriageways, particularly when the dual carriageway is designed to modern standards. The mix of traffic on the A40, from farm machinery to heavy road vehicles and holidaymakers, means that there is pressure on the single carriageway. Dual carriageways offer motorists the option of overtaking slower-moving vehicles, thus not only speeding up journey times, but ensuring a safer overtaking option than is available on a single carriageway. It would be far safer to dual the A40 to enable motorists to overtake other vehicles that are travelling in the same direction.

I also remind the Deputy Minister of the heavy industry vehicles that come from Ireland via the ferry port at Fishguard. These vehicles enter Wales and travel on single carriageways until they reach St Clears. This poses a safety risk not only to those vehicles, but also to other vehicles on the road at that time. A dual carriageway would go some way to help to prevent road accidents in Pembrokeshire by providing a safe barrier between both sets of traffic.

Efallai y bydd y Dirprwy Weinidog yn ymwybodol o'r gwaith sy'n cael ei wneud ym Mrwsel ar hyn o bryd mewn perthynas â'r darn o ffordd rhwng Caerfyrddin ac Abergwaun. Mae'r A40 rhwng Caerfyrddin a harbwr Abergwaun yn rhan o'r rhwydwaith craidd yn y rheoliad ar ganllawiau'r Undeb Ewropeaidd ar gyfer datblygu'r rhwydwaith trafndiaeth traws-Ewropeaidd, sydd ar ei hynt drwy'r weithdrefn ddeddfwriaethol ym Mrwsel ar hyn o bryd. Mae'r dull newydd o ymdrin â TEN-T yn rhannu'r rhwydwaith yn adrannau craidd a chynhwysfawr. Mae'n rhaid i'r rhwydwaith craidd gael ei gwblhau i'r safon ofynnol erbyn 2030. Derbyniad fod y rheoliadau yn dal i fynd ar eu hynt drwy'r broses ddeddfwriaethol ac y gallent newid; fodd bynnag, bwriad clir y rheoliad hwn yw bod y rhwydwaith ffyrdd craidd yn cael ei ddatblygu i safon uchel, a dyna'r prif bwynt. Wrth i'r trafodaethau hyn fynd rhagddynt ar lefel Ewropeaidd, mae ond yn iawn i Lywodraeth Cymru hefyd ystyried yr achos dros uwchraddio'r A40.

Mae sir Benfro hefyd yn gyrchfan pwysig i dwristiaid sy'n denu miloedd o ymwelwyr bob blwyddyn. Fodd bynnag, er mwyn manteisio'n llawn ar yr hyn sydd gan sir Benfro i'w gynnig, mae angen sicrhau bod rhwydwaith trafndiaeth cadarn ar waith. Mae dogfen 'Twristiaeth 2020' Llywodraeth Cymru yn cydnabod hyn drwy ddweud,

'Os ydym am i dwristiaeth yng Nghymru dyfu, rhaid sicrhau bod ymwelwyr yn cael teithio i'r wlad ac o'i chwmpas heb drafferth diangen.'

Drwy wneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 byddai'n lleihau amseroedd teithio i ymwelwyr a thriogolion lleol fel ei gilydd sy'n teithio ledled sir Benfro. Byddai peidio â gwneud hynny'n tanseilio nod hygyrchedd Llywodraeth Cymru.

Yn drydydd, hoffwn edrych ar fanteision diogelwch gwneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40. Mae ffyrdd deuol yn llawer mwy diogel na ffyrdd unffrwd, yn enwedig pan fydd y ffordd ddeuol wedi'i chynllunio i safonau modern. Mae'r cymysgedd o draffig ar yr A40, o beiriannau fferm i gerbydau ffordd trwm a thwristiaid, yn golygu bod pwysau ar y ffordd unffrwd. Mae ffyrdd deuol yn galluogi modurwyr i fynd heibio i gerbydau sy'n symud yn arafach, ac felly nid yn unig gyflymu amseroedd teithio, ond hefyd sicrhau ei bod yn fwy diogel gwneud hynny nag ar ffordd unffrwd. Byddai'n llawer mwy diogel gwneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 er mwyn galluogi modurwyr i fynd heibio i gerbydau eraill sy'n teithio i'r un cyfeiriad.

Hoffwn hefyd atgoffa'r Dirprwy Weinidog am y cerbydau diwydiant trymion sy'n dod o lwerddon drwy borthladd fferi Abergwaun. Mae'r cerbydau hyn yn dod i mewn i Gymru ac yn teithio ar hyd ffyrdd unffrwd nes iddynt gyrraedd San Clêr. Mae hyn yn beryglus nid yn unig i'r cerbydau hynny ond hefyd i gerbydau eraill ar y ffordd ar yr un pryd. Byddai ffordd ddeuol yn helpu i atal damweiniau ffyrdd yn sir Benfro drwy ddarparu rhwystr diogel rhwng y ddwy set o draffig.

I very much accept that dualling the A40 in Pembrokeshire would come at a substantial cost, which, of course, is difficult in the current financial climate. I am not expecting a project of this nature to take place overnight and I am not expecting the Welsh Government to find all the money now to fund this essential improvement. However, I am asking the Deputy Minister to seriously consider the evidence and make a commitment to dual the A40 in the future. The Welsh Government should be taking steps now by undertaking a serious cost analysis and setting out the timetable for this project.

To sum up, I am calling on the Government to seriously consider dualling the A40. There is a clear argument that the amount of road traffic in this area is increasing. There are a number of economic benefits to dualling the A40 for businesses in the area. It would certainly provide job opportunities, and it would go some way towards attracting inward investment to the area. It would help to make travelling to Pembrokeshire much easier for residents and for the thousands of visitors who come to the area each year. Last but not least, it would go some way towards providing a safer driving network for motorists who use the A40.

Devolution has seen responsibilities transferred to the Welsh Government, and transport is an area where the Welsh Government has the tools to do the job. I hope that today's debate will commit the Government to look at this issue once again. It is nothing more than what Pembrokeshire deserves.

I grynhoi, galwaf ar y Llywodraeth i ystyried gwneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 o ddirif. Mae dadl glir bod traffig ar y ffordd yn yr ardal hon yn cynyddu. Mae nifer o fanteision economaidd ynghlwm wrth wneud gwaith deuoli ar yr A40 i fusnesau yn yr ardal. Byddai'n sicr yn creu cyfleoedd gwaith ac yn helpu i ddenu mewnfuddsoddiad i'r ardal. Byddai'n helpu i hwyluso teithio i sir Benfro i drigolion a'r miloedd o ymwelwyr sy'n dod i'r ardal bob blwyddyn. Gobeithio y bydd y ddaol hon heddiw yn peri i'r Llywodraeth gytuno i edrych ar y mater hwn unwaith eto. Mae sir Benfro yn sicr yn ei haeddu.

*Y Dirprwy Weinidog Sgiliau a Thechnoleg / The Deputy Minister for Skills and Technology*

I begin by thanking Paul Davies for raising this issue today. I realise that this is a concern for him that extends back a number of years. It is also, as he alluded to, an aspiration long held by a number of parties in the region.

We recognise the importance of the role that the trunk roads in south-west Wales, such as the A40 and the A477, play in sustaining the economy of the region. These routes provide access to the ports of Milford Haven, Pembroke Dock and Fishguard, as well as major tourist destinations such as Tenby and St David's. The A40 and the A477 form part, as has been mentioned, of the trans-European road network, linking Ireland to the UK and the rest of Europe, and they provide access to the Haven waterway enterprise zone.

Hoffwn ddechrau drwy ddiolch i Paul Davies am godi'r mater hwn heddiw. Sylweddolaf fod y mater hwn wedi bod yn ei bryderu ers sawl blwyddyn. Mae hefyd, fel y nododd, yn ddyhead gan nifer o bartïon yn y rhanbarth ers tro.

Cydnabyddwn bwysigrwydd y rôl y mae'r cefnffyrdd yn orllewin Cymru, fel yr A40 a'r A477, yn ei chwarae wrth gynnal economi'r rhanbarth. Mae'r llwybrau hyn yn darparu mynediad i borthladdoedd Aberdaugleddau, Doc Penfro ac Abergwaun, yn ogystal â chyrchfannau pwysig i dwristiaid fel Dinbych y Pysgod a Thyddewi. Fel y nodwyd, mae'r A40 a'r A477 yn rhan o'r rhwydwaith ffyrdd traws-Ewropeaidd, sy'n cysylltu Iwerddon â'r DU a gweddi'll Ewrop, ac maent yn darparu mynediad i ardal fenter dyfrffordd y Ddaugleddau.

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I am aware of the historic problems that exist on the roads in this area for a number of communities along those routes. This is why the Welsh Government has made a significant investment in improving these two trunk roads in recent years. This includes investment of some £110 million in the A40 and £100 million in the A477, the most recent of which was in the improvement to the A477 between Llandowror and Red Roses that is currently being built. The work is due to be completed in the spring of 2014, at an anticipated final cost of £78 million. The improvement of the A40 between Penblewin and Slebech Park, at Robston Wathen, was completed in 2011 at a cost of £42 million. We also plan to deliver the Llanddewi Velfrey to Penblewin route as the second phase of the improvement to the A40 west of St Clears, which is in the national transport plan, with construction beginning in 2016 at an estimated cost of £45 million.

The improvements to the A40 bypass local villages, improve junctions and use a 2+1 road layout, which is a single carriageway improvement with dedicated lanes providing safe overtaking opportunities in both directions. The Penblewin to Slebech Park length has been open since March 2011, and the 2+1 layout is performing well. Traffic is flowing better and quality of life in the villages has been improved. Data show that, since opening, there has been a reduction in the number of collisions on the A40.

I am grateful to you for giving way, Deputy Minister. As someone who has sat on the infamous Standing Order 25 committee that looked at this road in the last Assembly, I hear what you say about the Robston Wathen bypass and the 2+1 standard. That is good, and it is better than what we had before, but it is not as good as a dual carriageway option, is it?

Mae hyn yn cynnwys buddsoddiad o tua £110 miliwn yn yr A40 a £100 miliwn yn yr A477. Y mwyaf diweddar oedd gwella'r A477 rhwng Llandowror a Rhos-goch sy'n cael ei wneud ar hyn o bryd. Disgwylir i'r gwaith gael ei gwblhau yn ystod gwanwyn 2014, ar gost derfynol a ragwelir o £78 miliwn. Cafodd y gwaith o wella'r A40 rhwng Penblewin a Pharc Slebech, yn Robston Wathen, ei gwblhau yn 2011 ar gost o £42 miliwn. Rydym hefyd yn bwriadu cyflwyno llwybr Llanddewi Felfrey i Benblewin fel yr ail gam ar wella'r A40 i'r gorllewin o San Clêr, sydd yn y cynllun trafudiath cenedlaethol, gyda'r gwaith adeiladu yn dechrau yn 2016 ar gost amcangyfrifedig o £45 miliwn.

Mae'r gwelliannau i'r A40 yn osgoi pentrefi lleol, yn gwella cyffwrdd ac yn defnyddio cynllun ffordd 2+1, sy'n welliant ffordd unffrwd â lonydd dynodedig yn ei gwneud yn bosibl i fynd heibio i gerbydau eraill yn ddiogel i'r ddau gyfeiriad. Bu'r llwybr rhwng Penblewin a Parc Slebech ar agor ers mis Mawrth 2011, ac mae'r cynllun 2+1 yn gweithio'n dda. Mae traffig yn llifo'n well ac mae ansawdd bywyd yn y pentrefi wedi gwella. I shall be going on to say that all the studies indicate that an investment of that level is not justified, and that what is proposed is justified. However, you know, your points will be noted. You also may want to wait to hear my final remarks.

The type of road layout used for any improvement scheme is determined largely by the volume of traffic and prevailing conditions predicted for the future. It is not considered best value to provide for capacity and conditions in excess of need. The options for improving the A40 between St Clears and Haverfordwest were considered in a study completed in 2004, which concluded that a dual carriageway could not be justified in the short or medium term. The 2004 study also identified that the cost of dualling this length of the A40 was estimated at £165 million compared with £35 million to undertake two shorter length, single-carriageway schemes. The benefit-to-cost ratios of the two options were similar, at just over 1.0.

Nid ystyrir ei bod yn werth gorau i ddarparu ar gyfer capasiti a'r amodau yn fwy na'r angen. Cafodd yr opsiynau ar gyfer gwella'r A40 rhwng San Clêr a Hwlfordd eu hystyried mewn astudiaeth a gwblhawyd yn 2004, a ddaeth i'r casgliad na allai ffordd ddeuol gael ei chyfiawnhau yn y tymor byr na'r tymor canolig. Hefyd nododd astudiaeth 2004 y byddai'n costio tua £165 miliwn i wneud gwaith ar ddeuoli'r darn hwn o'r A40 o gymharu â £35 miliwn i gyflawni dau gynllun ffordd unffrwd byrrach. Mae cymarebau cost a budd y ddau opsiwn yn debyg, sef ychydig dros 1.0.

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This work was updated in 2008 as part of the special Assembly procedures into the A40 Penblewin to Slebech Park project, involving an all-party committee of AMs. Updated traffic analysis indicated that the improved A40, in line with the current proposals, would have capacity until 2039, and that a dual carriageway would not be needed until then. The SAP found that dualling the A40 could not be justified on capacity grounds for over 30 years. It also noted that the future plans for economic growth in the area were not dependent on the A40 being improved to a dual carriageway. We also note that traffic on the A40 has reduced since 2008, and that traffic levels today are very similar to the 2006 levels. We are content that the current improvement proposals for the A40 are sufficient to support the future growth of the area. The success of the Haven waterway enterprise zone does not rely on building a dual carriageway in the short or medium term. The enterprise zone is served by two trunk roads, both of which have been significantly improved over recent years, and with further improvements planned. However, I recognise that there may be a time when a dualled A40 may be warranted. Both A40 improvement schemes are designed so as not to inhibit the provision of a dual carriageway in the future.
