Freedom of Information Request

Thank you for your request for information received in 17th June 2014, regarding CAMHS. Please note that Cardiff and Vale University Health Board commission CAMHS from Cwm Taf University Health Board, we do not provide Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) ourselves. We have liaised with Cwm Taf University Health Board as our service provider to complete your request as fully as we can.

You asked:

Request 1

The Committee would be grateful if you could provide a breakdown of annual expenditure on CAMHS in cash terms and as a percentage of the overall spending on mental health for the most recent five years for which the data is available.

Request 2

The number of specialist CAMHS referrals 'not accepted' for the most recent five years for which the data is available (the Committee interprets this as being referrals received by specialist CAMHS in the LHB area which were assessed as not meet the criteria for a service at that time).

Request 3

Performance data against the CAMHS Annual Operating Framework Targets (AOF) targets for the past five years including breaches.

Request 4

Vacancy rates in specialist CAMHS for the past 5 years as a percentage of working time equivalents.

This information has only been collected since November 2013 and is shown in appendix 2.

Request 3

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Appendix 1a - Cardiff and Vale Commissioner Service Expenditure

Request 1

Until 2007 Cardiff and Vale UHB provided its own CAMHs service, with a small element commissioned from Cwm Taf. From 2007 onwards the main components of the CAMHs service has been commissioned from Cwm Taf Health Board, with community child psychology services continuing to be provided by Cardiff and Vale UHB.

The commissioning arrangements, and supporting financial flows, in respect of Cardiff and Vale residents are split between Cardiff and Vale UHB and WHSSC. The balance of the commissioning responsibilities (and the accompanying financial flows) have changed between Cardiff and Vale UHB and WHSSC in the years since 2007. The attached financial analysis summarises the income provided by both commissioners in 2013-14 to Cwm Taf in respect of Cardiff and Vale residents, as well as additional expenditure in respect of CAMHs services committed by Cardiff ad Vale UHB and Cardiff Local Authority.

Despite the changes in the split of commissioning responsibility the underlying value of resource provided has remained broadly the same during the last five financial years.
