

o3. Are there certain groups of people who are more likely to be affected by drugs and excessive drinking? If so, which groups might they be?

The young people I support come from a variety of backgrounds, they have different peer groups and not all of them are affected by drugs and excessive drinking. It depends on the individual but I mainly believe low self-esteem / confidence and mental health issues (largely drug induced) are significant in young people affected by drugs and excessive drinking.

o4. Does a particular stage of your clients' lives influence their likelihood of taking drugs or drinking excessively? If so, what stage might that be? (i.e. age, relationship breakdown, unemployment etc.)

All of the young people I support are experiencing some kind of relationship breakdown as they are living in a 'hostel environment', this is a very traumatic time in their lives and they find their own coping mechanisms. Their age and vulnerability makes them more susceptible to taking drugs and drinking excessively.

o5. What barriers exist for your client(s) when trying to access support and services?

Long waiting lists for some external agencies, GP's sometimes don't realise the full extent of the young person's issues.

o6. What barriers exist for services when trying to access support for client(s)?

Long waiting lists for some external agencies.

o7. What do you consider to be barriers for staff and frontline services in working with your client group(s), or substance misuse generally?

Substances are so readily available to young people and affordable. The young person's friends may also be a substance user and this could encourage them to use more.

o8. Where do you think efforts should be targeted to address the issue of alcohol and substance misuse in Wales?

More effort needs to be targeted in the root of the problem - why are these people misusing substances? Counselling young people in order for them to talk about their past and deal with issues they already have.

Encouraging young people to attend motivational classes in order to build their self-esteem and confidence.
