

Any life event can be a trigger for drug or alcohol use. Poor coping mechanisms learned in early childhood can be a predictive factor.


o5. What barriers exist for your client(s) when trying to access support and services?

Financial Barriers, especially for people living in rural north wales, where mainstream services are less apparent and there is a need to travel to access services. Quite often the criminal justice system will be the door that leads people to our services.

Currently we have to work within certain criteria. For our service it is class A drug use and Offending. We have to refer many people to other services, and this can take some time, if we were able to work across all substances we would save valuable time and could contribute some interventions within this time.
